Hello, fellow Lions:

May, 2024 is now officially "in the can," so to speak; now, we are moving ever closer to July 1, and the start of a new Lions year. I am working to secure the final members of our cabinet, and preparing for my upcoming trip to the International Convention. Candidly speaking, I am looking forward to seeing Melbourne. I am not, though, looking forward to the long flight required.

The topic I'd like to address this month is membership recruitment. By now, some of you might feel that we District Governors have beat the subject to death. But, have you ever stopped to consider **why** we keep talking about it? Well, it all comes down to numbers.

Lionism is, in the purest sense, a collection of small businesses (the Clubs) engaged in the work of service to our communities (District 14-G), our state (MD-14), and the world (LCI). We are classified as a non-profit social welfare organization; this means funds collected are used toward the common good, not the enrichment of the organization.

Like any business, we need people to do the work of serving our communities. We experience losses due to deaths, resignations, etc. just like any other organization. These are classified as "dropped members," and the figure will surprise you. On average, 14-G dropped 199 members per year from 2019-2024. Putting it another way, we need to recruit 199 new members per year, if our membership is to remain constant. A constant membership allows your District Officers to plan and work with confidence, and prevents the need for club mergers, dues increases, etc. As of this writing, 14-G has 1499 members, with a net of -4 for the year to date. This will change, I suspect, as the Club Secretaries process membership changes at the end of the year.

As we go through the upcoming year, I believe we can, together, reverse this trend. I am asking all of you to commit to inviting one new member to your club's meeting or a project. Be polite, be cordial, but don't push. Have fun and enjoy their company. If we do this, they'll likely be happy to fill out a membership application. After induction, mentor them—explain how Lionism works—and about all the good we do. Finally, encourage them to invite their friends and family. And remember, 1VDGE Leona, 2 VDGE Alfredo, myself, and the other officers stand ready to help. Just ask. One last thought. According to our State Council Chair, the pin must stay under wraps until July 1. So, I'll reveal it next time. *Until then...*

Lion Carol Byers, DA for 14-L took the time to outline the steps for Lion presidents, secretaries, or district administrators to list all clubs newly elected officers. In addition, Lion Carol also provided the steps to list new Lions in Lions Clubs International using the Lion Portal.

ARTICLE VI Officers and District Cabinet

Section 2. DISTRICT CABINET. "The district shall have a district cabinet composed of the district governor, the immediate past district governor, the first and second vice district governors, the region chairperson (if position is utilized during the district governor's term), the zone chairpersons, a cabinet secretary-treasurer or a cabinet secretary and a cabinet treasurer, and such other club members as may be included in this section as amended in accordance with the amendment procedures contained herein. In addition, the global membership team district coordinator, global leadership team district coordinator, global membership team district coordinator, and LCIF district coordinator. Each member must be in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district."

Whereas this resolution was passed by a majority of the delegates present at this convention,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Standard District Constitution and Bylaws of Lions District 14G,

Article VI, Section 1 Officers be amended to include the position of Assistant District Treasurer.

This amendment per Article X, Section 4.

EFFECTIVE DATE. Each amendment shall take effect at the close of the convention at which adopted unless otherwise specified in the amendment.



Is it that complicated? Breaking data down into useful information you collect and report supports our organizations strategies to develop partnerships to enhance our service to others.

Listening recently to ID Larry Edwards (Guest Speaker to Milesburg Lions Club 75th Anniversary) the service hours and activities could have been much higher if clubs would be reporting. When NO SERVICE is reported, clubs are considered inactive until a report is completed and entered into the system.

LCI states why it is important to report your club's service

"High levels of service reporting are a sign of healthy clubs, zones, and districts. Knowledge of your club's service history provides invaluable insight to current and future club officers. In addition, district, zone, and Global Action Team leaders can best support your club when they understand how clubs in their area serve their communities."

"Service data gives us the ability to communicate how *WE SERVE* around the world. For example, in 2021, Lions and Leos served more than 350 million people! We can take pride in that achievement thanks to the leaders who reported over 1 million service activities. Through service reporting, your club joins in that pride and is eligible for service awards."


