


Taking a Break and Being Thankful

Preventing the 'oopsies!'

Good conscientious presidents, secretaries, club administrators, and membership chairpersons must work as a well-oiled machine. It is a team effort with reporting MMR's and service activities.

Everyone of these Lion in these positions in a club can be a leader; but if nobody leads it, your club will get a bill for those Lions being dropped. There is no way out of your club being charged when a Lion's name still appears on the roster for whatever reason: resigned in good standing; non-payment of dues; non-attendance; non-attendance and non-payment of dues; transferred in good standing; moved; deceased; other; or reached minimum age for club type.

Be thankful for the Lions in officer positions you've elected to represent your club. Being an officer is a vital responsibility: providing a detailed description of the roles and responsibilities prior to yearly elections for an understanding of expectations from each position.

This will prevent the "oopsies," and demonstrate the dedication to the positions. Hearing, "I'm just a volunteer," does not constitute a way out, it is what was accepted when taking the elected position.

Be mindful of the commitment, and lead with positivity. Our organization, Lions Clubs International, depends on your efforts to be the best you can be. Working together as a TEAM is the only way to move forward. LCI provides the tools and guidance for members of our great organization. Keep focused on being a better Lion!

"Tell others what you do, **NOT** what you sell." Surely you have heard this expression.

One of our weakest links in recruitment is the opening statement when communicating with a potential Lion member. Begin by 'telling them what you are going to tell them, tell them, then tell them what you told them.' It is simple, direct and memorable, this Aristotelian "triptych" is a handy method." (by John Baldoni)

"Step 1: Explain why you are talking about Lions. For example, "I am interested in your expertise to help discover ways to help others in the community."

Step 2: Now is the time to tell what Lions are about. For example, "Lions are volunteers that help others less fortunate in areas of health, supporting youth, and caring about the environment." Emphasis the benefits for your points, while resonating with the heart. Put people in the position to feel why what you're saying is important and how things will be better when they follow through with your ideas.

Step 3: Tell them what you just told them. Reiterate your salient points. This is the opportunity to give people a reason to believe in your idea and in you."
