

- ⇒ Club Global Membership Chair: Encourages and plans open house for potential Lion members, invite friends and family to help with a service project, invite others to come to a meeting, suggest potential members to be a member for only six months recognizing exactly what Lions do to serve as a volunteer
- ⇒ Club Global Service Chair: Lions Motto is "We Serve," Lions are a service club-not a fundraising club, record all members volunteer activities every month -club meetings do NOT count as a service project, but should be recorded
- ⇒ Club Leadership (Club President) Chair:

Driving force ensuring district is strong, focusing on developing quality leadership. Identifies potential and new leaders to participate in service, membership, and leadership development opportunities.

PID Pat Vannett will be leading our state in an invitation for guiding Global Action Teams from the club level to the state level on October 7, 2023, at the Ramada Inn, State College.

District Global Action Teams, District Governors, Vice District Governors were included in the training. Currently, the state has over 70 Lions attending! Only a few are not able to attend due to prior commitments.

This **GAT Summit** will be an annual event to establish all clubs to be successful in recruiting and serving others.

Global Action Team Summit

Upon the completion of the GAT Summit from special invitations to all districts of selected Global Membership Team Coordinators, Global Service Team Coordinators; District Governors; and Vice District Governors, the Governors will schedule a meeting with the Zone Chairs providing materials and guidance on their roles and responsibilities to provide to their clubs in their zones.

With this done in a timely manner (within a month), Zone Chairs will be meeting with the officers—including Club Presidents, Membership Chairs, and Service Chairs from each of their clubs in the zone. Providing up-to-date steps for clubs to be successful with service and membership. Operation of these steps have been tested and proven to be very successful.

Club members should be walking the talk and not just do what some have always done—attend meetings to socialize, sometimes eat a meal together, and debate about how something should be done with ideas all over the place. New members want to see and to be involved in actionable works, as their time is valuable with family and other commitments. "LCI is combining MyLion, MyLCI and Insights, along with some additional tools and functionality, into a unified experience called the Lion Portal. The new portal will offer the same features and functionality currently available, but with a more consistent and efficient experience."



ike Seasons

Seasons change, and we change. If we make the change gradually, the Lion Portal will be much easier than you have

thought. Questions need to be asked early to help with the transition.

What's Changing? Combination of MyLion, MyLCI and Insights = Lion Portal
When Launching? Targeting January 2024; details in coming months
Use my current Lion Account? Currently, passwords are encrypted, need to update username and password for Lion Portal

How new Lion Portal differs? Log-in directly to Lion Portal on main page

What's the new platform? Salesforce, commercially available by over 150,000 organizations, and 40 nonprofits

"Learn" tool still available? Accessible through Lion Portal; use new credentials and click on *Learn*

What else able to do in Lion Portal? Reporting service; manage club rosters; accessing reports and all others through MyLion, MyLCI and Insights being a centralized location What functions will I be able to access in the Lion Portal? Same as you do now based on any Lions positions you hold

Able to access the old MYLion, MyLCI, Insights? No, they will not be available once Lion Portal is live

Will Lion Portal be mobile-friendly? Yes!

Club Members and Club Secretary:

"Make sure your Lion Account information is correct and up to date in MyLCI! NEW Lion Portal will require a unique, unshared email, and phone numbers will no longer be supported as a log in credential."

If you're a club president, secretary or administrator, updating member information is simple:

- Log in to the current member portal with your Lion Account credentials
 - Navigate to MyLCI

- Select "Members"
- Click on the member whose information you need to update
- Select "Edit Member" to enter in their revised email address and other updated information

Lion Portal

- Check you Lion Account information. Make sure your information is correct and up to date in MyLCI or your regional reporting system. This includes your name, contact information and communication preferences
- Confirm you have a unique email address. A unique email address (not shared with anyone else) is required for the new Lion Portal.



Why Report Service?

Sharing our impact, Lions and Leos inform, inspire, and grow in global legacy of service.

Service activities: Hands-on service activities, such s tree planting, vision screening, rebuilding homes after disaster strikes or serving meal to those in need.

Advocacy: Raising awareness of causes important to Lions, educating our communities on issues that impact them and working to bring positive change.

Donations: Making charitable donations to individuals or organizations, including LCIF, which are tracked by the foundation and need not to be reported as a service activity.

Fundraising: Raising funds to enable service.

Service Support Activities:

Holding meetings to strengthen your club, educate and train members, or plan other service activities.

Fulfilling administrative tasks, such as running errands, maintaining club records, or reporting.

Attending Lions events such as conventions and forums.

Engaging in fellowship and fun, together with other Lions.

These activities contribute to Lions' positive impact in various ways, including attracting new members to clubs, helping clubs retain members by providing a positive experience, preparing Lions to serve, or directly benefitting the people we serve.

"Many Lions and Leos serve their communities individually, outside of the activities planned by their clubs, districts or multiple districts. Some examples include bringing a meal to a neighbor, driving a parent to a medical appointment, or volunteering at their place of worship. This type of work is important and commendable; however, it should not be reported as a Lions' service activity." How to Measure Service Impact

Number of Activities: Each activity reported counts as one activity.

Number of People Served: Direct beneficiaries of Lions service. Sometimes needs to be estimated.

Number of Volunteers: Number of people who participate in the planning, implementation, or participate in a service project. Lions and non-Lions can be counted.

Number of Volunteer Hours: Number of hours spent planning and implementing a service project.

Funds Raised: Amount of charitable funds given to an individual or organization. Funds donated to LCIF are tracked; however, if an event was held to raise those funds, that event can be reported as a fundraising activity.





Lions International provides guidelines to ensure that service reporting is accurate and consistent. However, Lions and Leos are the true experts in their service, and as such should rely on their own experience when measuring service impact

and encouraged to work with local experts whenever possible. If you need guidance with reporting service, contact our GST 1VDG Steve Myers or GLT

and District Administrator PDG Cheryl Wilbur.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

WHENEVER a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position of action towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

TO HOLD friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.
