Dear Lions of District 14-G:

Unbelievable, how our weather is changing and altering in ways that are unusual. For example, flooding in the summer???? WHAT??? Years prior one only heard of flooding in the spring after the snow melted. However, there was an exception in the floods of 1972 1975, and 2011, which are the most current to our generation.

Do you often wonder "who do I contact for local flooding?" My answer to that question is contact your club President who will then contact the Zone Chair. Zone Chairs are your link of communication through the district. Zone Chairs can be located in the 2021-2022 District Directory, which is given to the Club President, Club Secretary, and Club Treasurer. (If other members would like a directory, it can be purchased from the District Governor at the club visit or contact the DG and the directory can be sent electronically.) The Club President will contact the Zone Chairs and the Zone Chairs will contact the District Disaster Chairperson. (See page 8 in the District Directory). District Disaster Chairperson PDG Charles Poust will be contacted to get the committee together to respond.

The district will be looking for items that will not freeze, so no liquid cleaning supplies. These items will be stored in a non-heated area. Some items to consider to be placed in buckets with lids: rags, sponges, paper towels, rubber gloves or disposable gloves, Clorox wipes, masks, goggles, trash bags, or any item that would be useful. We are also looking for some mops and brooms to be placed in the Disaster Trailer. If these are ready when I meet with your club, I will take them.

On another note, our 1st Cabinet meeting was successful and the Governor was very pleased with those in attendance. The Zone Chairs that did attend went away with their minds buzzing of what was learned. For the Zone Chairs that were not in attendance, please try to schedule your time for the 2nd Cabinet Meeting on Saturday, November 13, 2021, at the Milesburg Community Center.

The Blossburg Sesquicentennial Celebration has a long history, beginning back to 1871. From the article written by Gayle Morrow, Mountain Home (Pennsylvania





& the New York Finger Lakes), August 2021, "a group of immigrants, characterized as "principally redemptioners," were making a road from Lycoming County, Pennsylvania, to Painted Post, New York, under the direction, at least partially, of brothers Robert and Benjamin

Patterson. The road is said to have followed trails established by Native Americans, in this case members of the Seneca Nation. Redemptioners, by the way, were those Europeans who gained passage to the American colonies or states by selling themselves into indentured (or involuntary) servitude to pay back shipping companies which had advanced the cost of their trip. They came from areas that we know today as Germany, and also from the British Isles. It sometimes took years for them to repay their debt."

This community is well-known as a close-knit small town that works well together and with the newly formed Lions Club, Lions International will be very proud of the services this group will provide. Best wishes to another newly formed club in the Northern Tier! Welcome aboard, Blossburg Area Lions Club!


