District N 1 GST Report July 1, 2019 – May 8, 2020

Despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, the clubs and the Lions of District N 1 have accumulated impressive figures for the service activities in 2019-2020.

Of the 78 Clubs in the District, 45 clubs have reported activities in MyLCI, as of May 2020.

The activities summarized in the following grid represent "Service Activities" only – this does not include reported activities that are classed as "fund-raiser" or "meetings".

The reported categories are those designated by Lions Clubs International (LCI).

Canadian Lions Clubs, and Canadian members, have made many significant contributions to Lions Clubs International through the years. One of the enduring contributions was that the International Motto, "We Serve", was submitted to Lions Clubs International by a Lion from Fonthill, Ontario, in 1954.

Countless untold deeds of Service, large and small, have been completed in Canada and elsewhere by Canadian Lions.....bringing us to this milestone of celebrating 100 Years of Service.

In keeping with our heritage and our commitment to the environment and to the generations that follow, the 100th Anniversary Committee has chosen the following goals as a fitting way to celebrate our 100th Anniversary:

- 1. To plant 100,000 trees across Canada
- 2. To create a Canadian Lions Centennial project in each community where Lions are present.
 - The 100th Anniversary Celebration begins July 1, 2019 and ends June 30, 2021
 - All Clubs are asked to report their projects to their District Governor on the form provided. The District Governors will forward Club Project Reports to Canada 100 co-chairs.
 - All Clubs who successfully complete and report their Centennial Project will receive a banner patch acknowledging this accomplishment
 - District Governors whose Districts raise \$6500 CDN towards the 100th Anniversary will be eligible to complete a grant application for matching funds, to be used for a District Project.


Convention Corner...






