

Breakfast:

Hillbilly Breakfast Casserole:

Ingredients

- 1 package of frozen tater tots or hash browns
- 1½ lbs. cooked ground sausage (turkey or beef work too!)
- 12 eggs
- ½c milk
- 8oz shredded mozzarella cheese
- Salt and pepper

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees
- 2. Spread the hash browns in the bottom of a 9x13 baking pan
- 3. Spread the cooked ground sausage on top of the hash browns
- 4. *Add diced peppers and onions now if desired
- 5. Fluff the eggs and milk in a blender or mixing bowl for about 30 seconds
- 6. Pour the egg and milk mixture evenly over the hash browns and meat
- 7. Spread the shredded mozzarella evenly over the whole pan
- 8. Bake for approximately 40-45 minutes or until the top is slightly brown

Notes

Here are a few extra tips and tricks to help you make a perfect tater tot breakfast casserole.

- Spray your casserole dish or baking pan with a little pan spray or melted butter. This will help the casserole tater tot breakfast pop right out of the pan. In addition, it will help make clean up easier by reducing hard to remove, stuck on food.
- Make your casserole extra rich by using heavy cream instead of milk. Or, use your favorite non-dairy milk (and non dairy shredded cheese!) to help slim down this breakfast.
- Always make an extra dish of casserole tater tot breakfast mix, cook it and freeze it. This
 way, you always have a delicious and easy breakfast already made and ready to enjoy!

Lunch:

Veggie Soup

What You'll Need

- 6 cups beef broth
- 1 (20-ounce) can cannellini beans, undrained
- 1 (28-ounce) can crushed tomatoes, undrained
- 1 (10-ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed
- 1 (16-ounce) package frozen mixed vegetables
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 cup uncooked ditalini pasta (or other small shape)

What to Do

- 1. In a large soup pot, combine all ingredients except pasta. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat then stir in pasta.
- 2. Reduce heat to low and simmer 15 minutes, or until pasta is tender, stirring occasionally.

Dinner:

Slow Cooker Bar-B-Q Legs

Ingredients

- □3-4 pounds chicken legs
- □1 cup BBQ Sauce of choice
- □2-3 Tablespoons Rotisserie seasoning or BBQ seasoning of choice
- □1/2 cup water

Instructions

- 1. Arrange the chicken legs evenly in your crockpot.
- 2. Sprinkle the rotisserie seasoning over the chicken. You may use tongs or your hands to rotate each piece to coat it completely.
- 3. In the slow cooker, pour the BBQ sauce evenly on top of the chicken legs. Again, use your hands or tongs to completely coat each one
- 4. Pour 1/2 cup of water in the crockpot
- 5. Cook the chicken in the crockpot on low for 5-6 hours or high for 2-3 hours.

Notes

- To make sure every piece is evenly coated, season the chicken legs with the BBQ seasoning before adding each one to the crockpot.
- Prep ahead and marinate your chicken with rotisserie seasoning a day before you
 cook this dish to enjoy a richer flavor with each bite.

Soup:

Ingredients

- 1 lb. chopped broccoli florets and stems, about 6 cups
- 3 cups vegetable broth
- 2 cups chopped carrots
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 6 ounces sharp cheddar cheese, grated, 3 cups
- 2 ounces cream cheese, cut in small pieces

Instructions

- 1. Place chopped broccoli, vegetable broth, carrots, onion and garlic in <u>slow cooker</u>.
- 2. Top with cheddar cheese and cream cheese (**do not stir in**).
- 3. Cook on low 7-8 hours or on high 3-4 hours.
- 4. Using an immersion blender, puree soup until smooth.
- 5. Garnish with additional shredded cheddar cheese and blanched broccoli florettes, if desired.

Dessert:

Ingredients

Cake:


- 1 cup salted butter
- 1 cup water
- 3 tablespoons cocoa powder
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 cups white sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup buttermilk
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Frosting:

- ½ cup unsalted butter
- 6 tablespoons milk
- 3 tablespoons cocoa powder
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups confectioners' sugar

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour a 10x15-inch cake pan.
- 2. Prepare the cake: Combine butter, water, and cocoa powder in a saucepan over medium heat. Cook until butter has melted and mixture comes to a boil. Remove from the heat and cool slightly.
- 3. Meanwhile, mix flour, sugar, and salt together in a large bowl. Beat buttermilk, eggs, baking soda, and vanilla extract together in a separate bowl.
- 4. Add melted butter mixture to flour mixture, then add buttermilk-egg mixture and beat until thoroughly combined. Pour into the prepared cake pan.
- 5. Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 20 minutes. Remove cake from the oven and cool on a wire rack for 5 minutes.
- 6. While the cake bakes, make the frosting: Combine butter, milk, cocoa powder, and vanilla extract in a saucepan over medium heat. Stir until butter melts, then stir in powdered sugar.
- 7. Spread frosting over the warm cake.
