District 14-B Governor's Visitation Protocol

The District Governor is the highest-ranking authority within the district. The Lion who holds this office, the District Governor was chosen because of his/her dedication to Lionism. Accordingly, proper recognition and respect for the District Governor requires the careful adherence of the clubs within the District.

No one means to be inconsiderate and certainly not rude, but sometimes, under certain circumstances, we lack information to guarantee a smooth meeting. The following list of suggestions should be helpful.

- Do not have any other programs during the District Governor's visit. The
 Governor is the program!
- Have a member, preferably a Past President, meet the Governor and keep him/her entertained until dinner (or the start of the meeting). It is a good practice to introduce him/her to each Lion present.
- Be sure the Governor is seated at the head of the table next to the President and to his/her right. Many times, a Vice District Governor or Zone Chairman will accompany the Governor. The President should introduce the VDG or Zone Chairman, who will then introduce the District Governor.
- The District Governor is the ranking officer in the district and deserves the
 respect of his/her office. When he/she is introduced, members should
 immediately rise and applaud and should do so again at the conclusion of
 his/her address. The Governor should not be introduced at any time other
 than when he/she is to speak.
- Even though the District Governor will most certainly be a good sport, it is not considered good taste to have the Tail Twister bother him/her to excess.
- Do not hesitate to discuss Club problems with your District Governor. It is his/her job to help solve problems and give new ideas to Clubs (and maybe your Club will have ideas that the Governor can take to other Clubs). Make this meeting with your District Governor a real down-to-earth get-together.



HISTORY OF PA COUNSELLORS DISTRICT 14-B

The birth of Lionism in Pennsylvania began on November 17, 1920 with the chartering of the Lions Club of Pittsburgh. This was not only the birth of Lionism in Pennsylvania but the beginning of Lionism east of Ohio. The Pittsburgh Club was initially in District 13 (Ohio and Pennsylvania).

In March 1923, our first District Governor, H.L. Beach, called a meeting of the Lions of Pennsylvania in Johnstown for the expressed purpose of uniting the Lions of Pennsylvania. After much discussion and disagreement, a state-wide district was formed with Irving L. Camp being elected District Governor of the Lions Clubs of Pennsylvania.

Since that time, there have been many changes and there are now 17 districts in what is now known as Multiple District 14.

It should be noted here that prior to 1965-1966, Past District Governors were granted the title of *International Counsellor* at the conclusion of their year in office by the International Association if they met the requirements. This designation was proposed by Lion Dr. Arthur S. Haines of the Wilkinsburg Lions Club during his term as International Director in 1942-1944.

Lion Haines spelled *Counsellors* the way he did because he said the Past District Governors "sell" Lionism. With the global changes taking place in Lionism, the designation *International Counsellor* was discontinued in 1965-1966 because Past International Directors in some foreign countries complained they were outranked by the *International Counsellors*. The Past District Governors of Pennsylvania, at that time, decided they would remain Counsellors, which they have done up to this point in time.

ALWAYS TO BEAR in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state, and my community, as to give them my unswerving loyalty in word, act, and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.

TO AID others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

TO BE CAREFUL with my criticism and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.

TO ENCOURAGE service-minded people to serve their community without financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.
