Greetings Fellow Lions, Lionesses, Leos, and visitors,

Well, here we are 2 months into our new Lions year. What service has your Club done this year so far? I know it's exceedingly difficult during this COVID pandemic to do service. We have such a great opportunity for our Lions, Lionesses and Leos to still do quality service, we just have to be more creative and think about what your communities need the most.

I've come up with a few service projects that you can do from home and/or do with another close family member that would satisfy your need to serve.

- Shop for senior community members or pick up prescriptions
- Send letters and cards to senior community members or children to lift up their spirits.
- Donate to a local food bank either by donating items or by a monetary donation.
- Findagrave.com is looking for help with identifying graves at the local cemeteries in the Pittsburgh area. All you do is visit a cemetery, take a picture of the grave marker, and then upload the picture onto the find a grave website. If you can take a picture, you can do this project. For example, Jefferson Memorial Park is only 24% identified, Allegheny Cemetery is only 28% identified. What that means is that the percentage of memorials are photographed/identified on the Find a grave website. This project helps family members looking for deceased relatives.
- Send a care package to a soldier through Soldiers' Angels.
- Donate your vision to those with impaired vision. **Be My Eyes** is a free app that allows people who are blind or have vision impairments to connect with others who can help them see. As a volunteer, you'll provide visual assistance through the app's live video call feature. Some examples of ways you may help others include assisting with reading instructions or expiration labels, choosing grocery items, or getting around an unfamiliar place.

When you do these service projects, it's important that you tell your Club Secretary so she/he can log the service into MyLion.

On Saturday, August 8, 2020 at 10 am, I am hosting a Club Secretary Training Zoom Meeting. I will also be training on the MyLion application. All who are interested, please register. If you need the link please don't hesitate to contact me.


Please take time to look for your club's information for correctness for the officers and meeting places and times.







Mt. Oliver Lions Club - The Forgotten Lions Club



Slaters Funeral Homes have been a familiar name in the South Hills for many years. Fred Slater, retired funeral director of the Brentwood location has the accompanying photo of **the Mount Oliver Lions Club as members prepare to board a Pennsylvania Central Airlines DC-3** plane

to take them to the Lions International Convention. Originally Fred believed the year is 1937,1938, 1939 or 1940.

The '37 convention was in Chicago, the '38 meeting was in Oakland, California, the '39 one in Pittsburgh (so obviously not this year) and the '40 event in Havana, Cuba. After knowing where the meetings were held, Fred feels that the year was 1937 and the Lions were headed to Chicago. Fred was born in 1930 and was just a kid when he remembered the taking of the photo. Lion members in the Lion costumes are Herb Slater (Fred's father) and Chuck Rowland who was manager of Sears' Mount Oliver store. These two Lions rode on the front fenders of the car that took them from Mount Oliver to the Allegheny County Airport! They waved to everyone along the way, including the police! John Slater, holding the movie camera, was Herb's brother, Fred's uncle. Among the others are Dale Cleland, a lawyer and Jack Houston who owned a print shop. Notice the Lions banner in the entrance to the plane.

The Mount Oliver Lions Club was founded in the Slater Funeral Home office which was originally a stable and then converted into the funeral home in 1902.

The above article and picture was submitted by PCC/PDG Dr. Jay Wells, III. And I'm at a loss. I have no record of such club and since this picture was taken back in 1937-1940, those who wrote the district's history back then, PDG Pryce Jenkins and PDG Malcolm Lovejoy, evidently didn't know anything about it. Anyone who might have any ideas about the club, please email me. The only thing I can come up with is that maybe the club eventually changed its name, and to what, I have no idea! HELP if you can! Award criteria

Did the project:

Benefit one of our five global causes (diabetes, the environment, vision, childhood cancer or hunger)

Demonstrate innovation

Achieve impact of scale and long-term sustainability

Develop local partnerships

Use local Lions/Leo or Lions Clubs International resources

How to be nominated

Nominations begin at the club level with Club Service Chairpersons nominating their club for service projects that fulfill the above stated criteria. Clubs are encouraged to reach out to their District GST Coordinator and Multiple District GST Coordinator to inform them about the details of the project which they would like to be considered for the award.

For clubs to be considered for the award, please adhere to the following timeline.

July 1: Nominations are open

August 15: Deadline for club service chairpersons and Leo club presidents to electronically send one nomination to the District GST coordinator

September 15: Deadline for District GST coordinator to electronically send one nomination to the Multiple District GST coordinator

October 31: Deadline for Multiple District GST coordinator to electronically send one nomination to Lions Clubs International

January: Winners are selected by the LCI Board of Directors Service Activities Committee

January 15: Winning clubs notified

March 1: Winning clubs to receive their award from Lions Clubs International

For me, as a long-time Lion and past president, I have personally had the privilege of being involved in initiating a unique club that would not only serve one community, but four communities. Support from charter members like Lion Dee Connor who received the International award for sponsoring 25 members helped our club to grow by leaps and bounds. I, too, have been honored to receive this award. Establishing new clubs and increasing club memberships are even more apparent today, so get your thinking caps working!

The MRF Lions just celebrated nine years of service throughout these four communities. Excellent leadership is the reason why MRF Lions have thrived in some trying times. The Club has had outstanding leadership with Lion Jim Spindler from UPMC McKeesport, as its first president; followed by Lions Carl Kovski, administrator of Riverside Care Center; me; Kathy Yurik from UPMC McKeesport; and Eliana Latterman from the McKeesport Hospital Foundation.



Students ages 11, 12 or 13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate in the International Peace Poster Contest. Entries not meeting the following deadlines will be disqualified.

- January 15: Kits go on sale from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters.
- October 1: Deadline to purchase kits from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters.
- November 15: Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning poster (per contest sponsored) to the district governor.
- December 1: Postmark deadline for a district governor to send one winning district poster to multiple district council chairperson.
- December 1: Postmark deadline for a district governor not belonging to a multiple district to send one winning
 poster to the Public Relations Department at International Headquarters.
- December 1: Postmark deadline for a club not belonging to a district to send one winning entry to the Public Relations Department at International Headquarters.
- December 15: Postmark deadline for the multiple district council chairperson to send one winning poster to the Public Relations Department at International Headquarters.
- February 1: International winners notified on or before this date.






