So, afterwards, I asked him where in PA he was from, and found out he was a member of the Clairton Club! We got to talking and that's the rest of the story. It's great getting the Cauldron every month too.

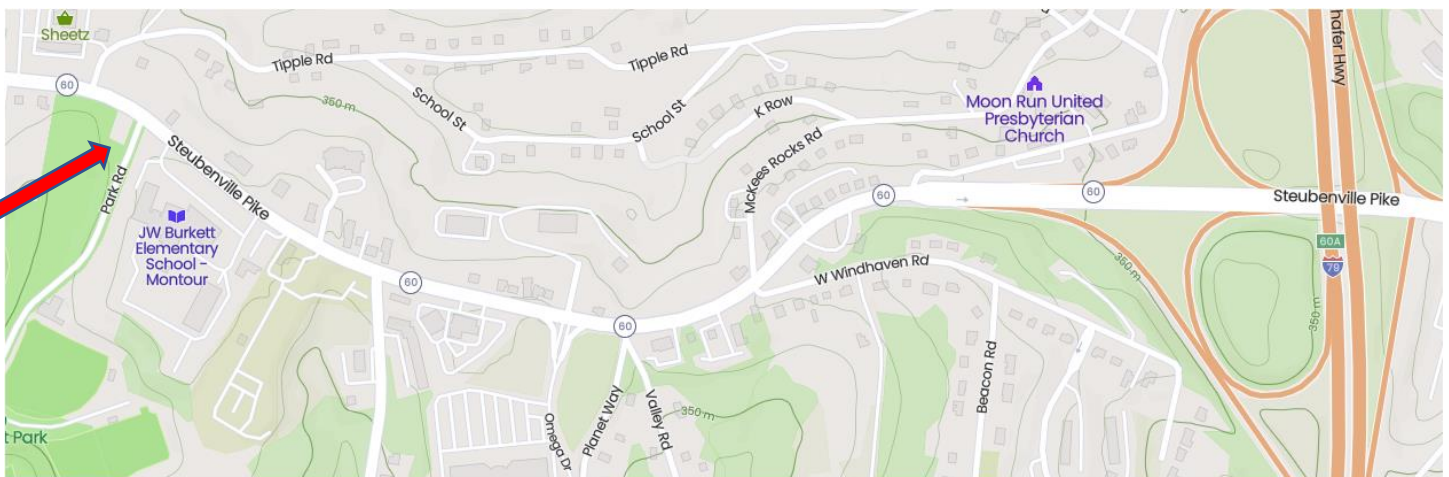

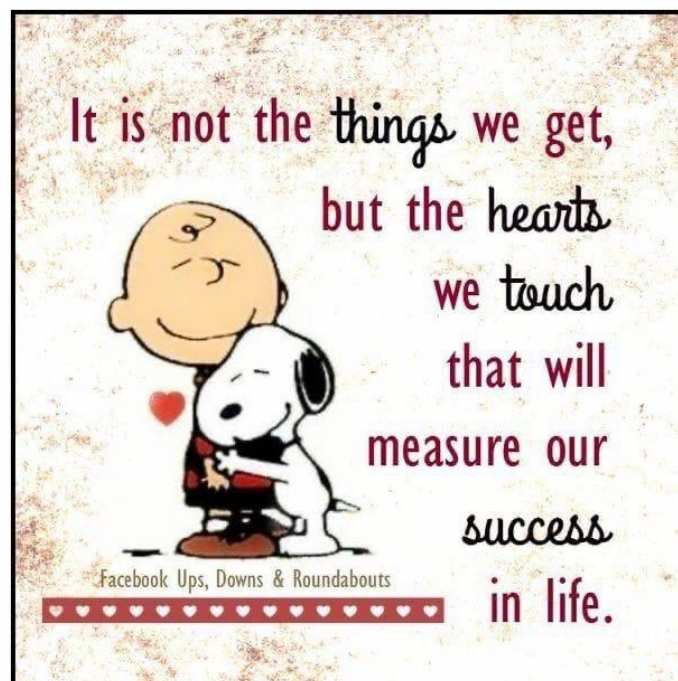

The Duck Race was fun to watch. District Governor Deb Lillegard won the Duck Race. Thanks to the volunteers that helped the ducks cross the finish line!



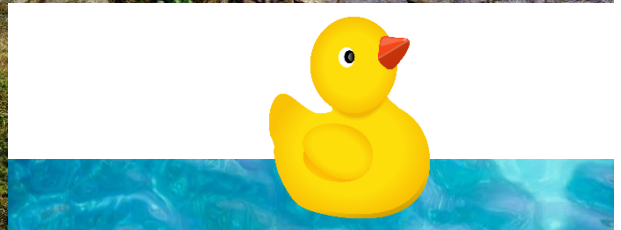

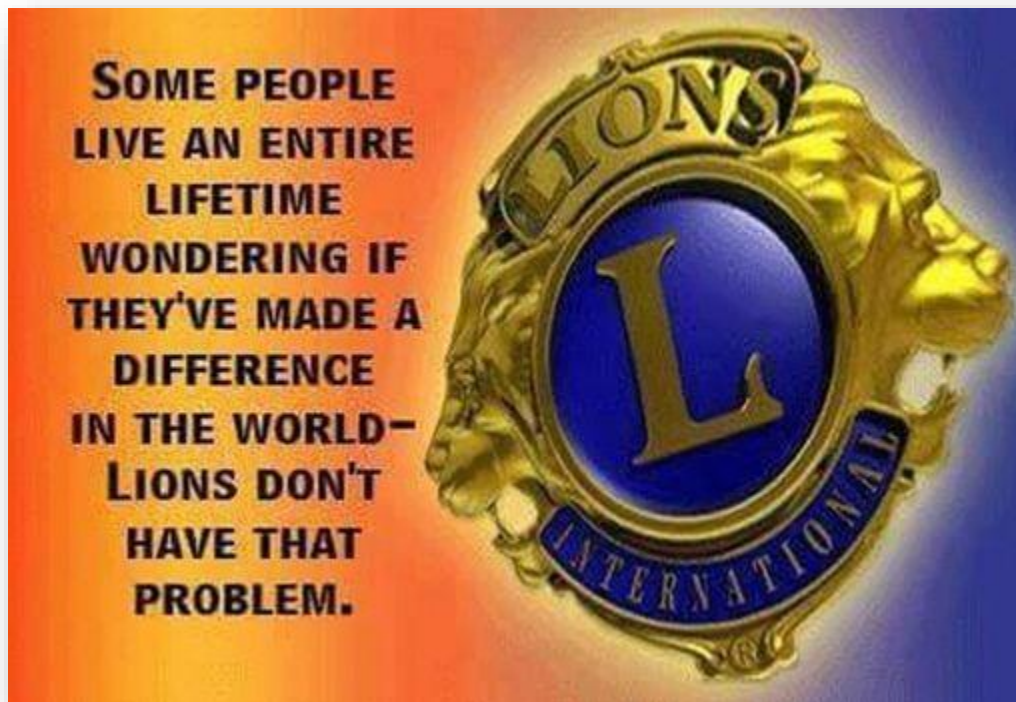
