



From the desk of District Governor MaryAnn Belles



He mentioned that the Day Care was in Loudon Pennsylvania, and then caught himself saying he meant to say TN. So, afterwards, I asked him where in PA he was from, and found out he was a member of the Clairton Club! We got to talking and that's the rest of the story. It's great getting the Cauldron every month too.




First Cabinet Meeting scheduled for August 22nd






