A.P. Singh, of Kolkata, India, was elected to serve as international president of Lions Clubs International at the association's 107th international convention, held in Orlando, Florida from July 13 through July 17, 2025.

International President Singh is a practicing chartered accountant and has family business interests in automobile dealerships.

A Lion since 1984 and a member of the Calcutta Vikas Lions Club, International President Singh has held many positions within the association, including district governor and council chairperson. He has served as GMT international coordinator for four years and as a member on a number of ad hoc board committees. He was chairperson for the 2017 DGE seminar in Chicago, USA, and has served as faculty at more than 50 ALLIs/RLLIs, RLLIs, FDIs and LCIP certification programs. He has also served as multi-national coordinator for Campaign SightFirst II, CA leader for Campaign 100, member of the LCIF Steering Committee and as chairperson of the National SightFirst Committee of India.

International President Singh has participated in and presented seminars at area forums in all constitutional areas. He was the co-chairperson of the Organizing Committee for the ISAAME Forum in Kolkata, India.

In recognition of his service to the association, International President Singh has received numerous awards, including multiple International President's Awards, as well as the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association grants its members. He is a major gift donor for Campaign SightFirst II and Campaign 100, and a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lion activities, International President Singh is accredited with the initiation of various service programs in collaboration with other trusts, foundations and corporate houses. He has worked on establishing a web-based Lion leadership development platform, a micro-finance program, and has organized multiple large-scale online events to keep Lions engaged.

So sad to see the Northern Allegheny Lions Club "closing up shop" after 75 years of dedicated community service...

NORTHERN ALLEGHENY LIONS CLUB was organized on March 21, 1950 and was originally chartered as the McCandless Township Lions Club on April 25, 1950. The Club was sponsored by the Perry Highway Lions Club and received its charter from District Governor Robert H. Chambers. The first President of the Club was Edwin Myers and the first Secretary was H. Harper Huston. They met at Flamgletti's Restaurant on Tuesday at 6:30 PM. The major project of the Club for a number of years was the North Hills Passavant Hospital. In 1950, the Club had 71 members. Lion John W. Soars served on several Cabinets. The Club changed its name from the McCandless Township Lions Club to the Town of McCandless Lions Club and recently to the Northern Allegheny Lions Club. They now meet at the Wildwood Country Club in Allison Park. Lion Matthew Spedding served on the Cabinet in 1974-75 as Chairman of International Understanding. Lions William Yates, Gerald Hnat, and Lee Panneton served as Zone Chairmen. Lion Harry Martin served as Zone Chairman 1983-84 and Deputy District Governor from 1984 through 1991. Lion Dr. David J. Csonka served several years as the Coordinator of Blind Activities from 1988 through 1991.
