

Greetings fellow Lions, Lionesses and Leos,

As Lions we all have many stories to share about our experiences, the projects we have worked on, places we have traveled for gatherings, other Lions we have met and people we have served, but there are two special stories that we hold close to our hearts. The first story we all have to share is easily recalled ~ the one that recounts why and how we became a Lion; the second story comes to us all in due time ~ the "A-ha" moment. This recollection is the telling of when and how we felt the moment we realized what it truly means to be a Lion. For some this experience comes early in their life as a Lion. For others it may take years before that defining moment presents itself. I'm certain many of you Lions can recall several little A-ha moments, each of which left an indelible mark upon your hearts.



With permission from PID Robert S. Littlefield, author of *Stories from the Heart: Lions Serving the World One Person at a Time*, I'd like to share a very special story of one Lion's recollection of why they became a Lion.

"I saw the joy on the child's face."

I was stationed in Korea during the war. It was near Osan that I had an experience that would affect my life forever. I saw children heading south. They didn't have much for clothing. They were dirty and forced to look after themselves. I saw them digging in the mud to carve out a spot where they could draw heat from the earth and sleep. Outside of our quarters we had garbage cans and after they thought all of the soldiers were gone, the children would creep in and find whatever they could from what we had thrown away. It was terribly sad. It wasn't long after I returned from Korea about a year before the war was over that I went to visit a gas station owner that I had worked for while attending college. I worked two nights a week pumping gas while I was in college to help make ends meet. The owner of the station was glad to see me, and he said wouldn't take no for an answer. He was taking me to dinner. It turns out, the dinner was a Lions Club meeting and the District Governor was the program speaker. He had prepared thirty-five mm color slides on corneal transplants and how Lions helped transport the corneal tissue across the state to world-renowned Wills Eye Hospital in Philadelphia where cornea transplant surgeries were performed. I saw what Lions were doing for people; and one of the slides showed a child who had received the surgery and when the bandages were removed, I saw the joy on his face. That slide had an effect on me; it reminded me of the children I had seen in Korea. That image of joy struck everyone at the meeting the same way. I was so impressed about what Lions were doing; and when I was asked to join, I immediately accepted.

Twelve individuals experiencing homelessness, died in 2019 on the streets of Pittsburgh and Allegheny County. The Memorial is held at the Fort Pitt Boulevard at Grant Street, Downtown Pittsburgh. There, beneath a busy highway overpass, a memorial wall of bronze plaques commemorates the 178* individuals who are known to have died while homeless in Allegheny County since 1989.

Well, this month as we continue to navigate through the Lions Club International (LCI), we will hover on "Explore Our Impact" which is the tab that is second from the left of the LCI website. 

Lions Diabetes Board celebrates 'Christmas Around the World'

The Lions Diabetes Board of Allegheny and Westmoreland Counties celebrated the holiday season Friday.

"Christmas Around the World" was held at the Palades in McKeesport and featured dinner and dancing along with gift raffles.

The menu that inspired the event's name was made up of international dishes, including Polish stuffed cabbage and Italian chicken marsala. A slew of desserts, made by lions from various clubs in Westmoreland and Allegheny counties, represented cultures from around the world. Guests got to enjoy flavors such as Greek baklava, Italian ladylocks and fried Spanish cookies coated in powdered sugar.

The crowd of nearly 200 was entertained by the Joe Campus Tribute Big Band. Christmas Around the World Chairwoman Michele Matuch, who is also vice president of the Lions Diabetes Board, said proceeds from the event "go toward benefiting the wonderful work Dr. Sann Yu Mon does at the Li-

ons Diabetes Center."

In 1993, the Lions of Allegheny County District 14-B and Westmoreland County District 14-E established the first-ever Lions Diabetes Center at UPMC McKeesport, which at the time was known as McKeesport Hospital.

Through continued partnership with the hospital, the Lions and McKeesport Hospital Foundation, the Lions center has provided education on the chronic disease.

MHF, a nonprofit based at UPMC McKeesport, works closely with the Lions of 14-B and 14-E to raise funds for the Emergency Medication Relief Fund, which provides medication and treatment for those in need who complete an application and return it to the McKeesport diabetes center.

The center serves hundreds of people and provides more than \$20,000 worth of diabetes medication annually to those it serves. In total, the center has provided more than \$400,000 worth of medication to diabetes patients who couldn't otherwise afford it.

He said he encourages Mon Valley residents who live in Allegheny or Westmoreland counties to join their local Lions clubs.

McKeesport Lions Just Adopted a Leader Dog Puppy!


