When we talk about new Lion membership it is important that we also address MEMBERSHIP RETAINMENT. Our 14B district is getting new members, but we are also losing members and not just through deaths. I believe that in some cases we lose members from not properly recognizing them and not motivating them to keep them interested in staying as a Lion. In this month's message, I would like to talk about various methods that I feel will keep our current members motivated.

I kind of put together a RECOGNITION CHECKLIST to make sure the recognition you provide is solid and effective to keep our club membership tally stable.

- A. Make sure the recognition you provide is TIMELY. Don't wait. Give recognition as soon as possible after a good performance takes place. Praise tends to lose its effectiveness with time.
- B. Be specific. Tell the Lion exactly what they did was good. A mere "nice job" really doesn't say that much.
- C. Be sincere. Insincere praise is usually worse than none at all. Be honest and open. Tell the Lion what the performance means.
- D. Focus on individuals rather than groups. The fact is not all team members contribute equally.
- E. Be personal. But keep in mind not all folks like public praise; some prefer private discussion. Different strokes for different folks.
- F. Be proportional. Match the amount and intensity of recognition to the achievement. Going overboard for small stuff will make people question your motives.

The CHECKLIST items above are a BASIC methods that can be used; however, I'm sure that there are many other methods that are used to motivate and retain membership.

# Western Pennsylvania Lions Hearing Research Foundation

## There will be major changes coming to the Western Pa Lions Hearing Foundation hearing aid program

The Western Pa Lions Hearing Foundation, whose primary mission is to provide hearing aids to the financially disadvantaged, has decided to expand its program to better serve those in areas where there are no UPMC audiologists available. Our goal is to serve those who might have a difficult time traveling to a UPMC location for a multitude of reasons. We will also be offering two hearing aids to those whose hearing loss justifies two hearing aids.

To help serve those that do not have reasonable access to a UPMC audiology facility we will be offering a tele-audiology option. UPMC developed a tele-audiology prototype during the pandemic. Under this option, once a representative from the WPLHF determines that a patient meets the eligibility requirements, he/she sends the usual paperwork to the patient notifying them of the decision to accept their application. At the same time UPMC is notified with the patient's contact information. A representative from UPMC then reaches out to the patient to determine the next course of action be it tele-audiology or an in-person visitation to a UPMC facility. Most facilities are in Allegheny County and our service area covers more than one-half of Pennsylvania.

At the present time, the WPLHF only provides one hearing aid. One hearing can significantly improve one's quality of life but is obviously not as good as two. We now can provide two hearing aids if medically indicated.

We are currently planning to keep the eligibility requirement at 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines and the application fee at \$100. If a person does not qualify for any reason the \$100 will be refunded. Currently there is no date for these changes to take effect.

# GLASS RECYCLING SCHEDULE

Even though some municipalities include glass in their mixed-recycling curbside pickup, there are still good reasons to recycle glass separately. On Jan. 30<sup>th</sup>, the PRC announced their traveling bin scheduled for 2024

Individuals can drop off glass bottles, jars, and jugs of all colors from 7 a.m. to sunset. No color sorting is required. Containers should be empty and rinsed, with lids and labels still on. Bags and boxes used to deliver glass must be discarded off-site.

# The Pennsylvania Lions Laser was Officially Dedicated 40 Years ago at The Eye and Ear Hospital



As 14B District Governor (83-84) it was my honor to host the dedication of the Lions Laser Center

Back in the early 1980s, the six districts that make up the Western Region embarked on a major fundraising campaign to raise \$125,000 to purchase lasers for Eye and Ear Hospital in Pittsburgh. These funds were to be matched by the Lions Clubs International Foundation. The clubs were able to raise \$125,000 and it was matched by LCIF for a total of \$250,000. The dedication was held at the Duquesne Club in Pittsburgh. LIONS from all over the state of Pennsylvania attended including International President Joseph L. Wroblewski and all six District Governors from the Western Region. Also attending were representatives from Eye and Ear Hospital including David Goff CEO, and Lion Dan Kraft Vice President of Development.

The plaque you see on the left represents the Honorary Members. My name appears on this plaque thanks to a donation from the Dravosburg Lions Club which was made in my name.
