

Meny Lions Clubs continue to accumulate used eyeglasses but don't know what to do with them. Walmart is not currently taking eyeglasses to send to Lions Eyeglass Centers.

The U of Pitt Lions club is currently trying to reorganize so that they can again collect, clean, sort and get your used eyeglasses to the right people, but this may take a while.

An alternative solution is to send your used eyeglasses to Lion Don Ziegler of the Oakmont Lions Club. Lion Don has been instrumental in getting eyeglasses to and providing eyeglass screenings in Africa. He has an organization setup that does the work and provides eyeglasses. Lion Don takes care of collecting the eyeglasses and getting them shipped. He works with two nurses who do the screenings and distribute the eyeglasses.

Lion Don will take any eyeglasses in good condition, even readers and cheap sunglasses; they can all be used.

Lion Don is also an interesting speaker who can tell your club about and answer your questions about how the eyeglasses are used. Consider asking him to speak to your club.







District LCIF Coordinator's Report on Grants

With all of the disasters that occur throughout our country and the world, please consider making a donation to LCIF, particularly to Campaign 100. Your individual donation doesn't need to be huge: \$5, \$10, or \$25 from every Lion. Club contributions can be made in any amount, a few hundred dollars up to thousands of dollars while honoring a member with a Melvin Jones Fellowship. There are so many ways to donate: individually, from the club treasury, by hosting a special fundraising event, monthly recurring gifts, text-to-give, matching gifts from community foundations and groups, the Lions Legacy Program. None of any contribution is used for administrative costs — those costs are borne through investment proceeds. While we are proud to say that every contribution given to our Foundation goes to help individuals only 6% of our global membership actually supports this cause.

Here is a chart of the grants awarded in the United States over the past 2 years broken down by the eight causes that LCIF supports.

Pleasant Hills Lion Makes the Evening News...

On September 23rd a member of the Pleasant Hills Lions Club was featured on the WPXI evening new for all the right reasons. He was the subject of a human interest piece. Lion Bruce is scheduled to compete in the Great Race scheduled for Sunday September 26th. What is so unique about him competing in this event is the physical issues he has had to overcome to be able to compete.

In early 2019 Bruce was admitted to Allegheny General Hospital with multiple including health issues, nonalcoholic cirrhosis of the liver and obesity. As a result, he immediately started losing weight and underwent a liver transplant operation. A contributing factor major determination of his health was that his wife, Andrea, had suffered a stroke and Bruce was spending his time taking good care of her while ignoring his own health.


As result of their health problems, they moved from Johnstown to Pittsburgh to be closer to family. In Johnstown Lion Bruce and Lion Andrea were members of the Johnstown West End Lions Club. Bruce currently resides at the Atria Senior Living Facility in the South Hills. Coincidently, prior to the Covid19 shut down the Pleasant Hills Lions Club was holding their meeting at Atria's so it was only natural that Bruce transfer to our club. The Pleasant Hills Lions also does a Christmas program at Atria's which includes giving presents to each of the residents. However, last year due to the Pandemic, we were not allowed to enter the building so Lion Bruce helped the staff distribute the gifts.





By running in the Great Race, Bruce will be raising funds for "Hats off to Ron", a nonprofit named in honor of a liver transplant recipient who has since passed. A Go Fund Me account has been set up that can be accessed by googling gofundme.com/f/hats-off-to-ron. Bruce also hopes to encourage people to become organ donors and to inspire people to prioritize their health. We all wish Bruce good luck running in the Great Race.



Monthly Membership Reporting: Why it is so important

Why is it so important for Clubs to report their monthly membership?

Lions Clubs International asks each of the Clubs to report how many members they have in their clubs on a monthly basis. This is a very important part of what a Club Secretary does on a monthly basis.

- Lions Clubs International uses the information for future plans to help determine what Clubs might need.
- ➤ The District Governor uses the information on a frequent basis to gather information for visitations and consider service projects for the District.
- ➤ The Leadership Team in the District receives monthly reports to see how the trends are doing for the district goals set at the beginning of the year.
- ➤ The Membership Team in the District receives monthly reports. The team can contact Clubs that are showing trends of membership losses or trends of membership growth to congratulate them.

Why report service

How do clubs and districts individually benefit from reporting service?

- Reporting service helps transfer knowledge and best practices to your club's future leaders. Club officers can review past service activity reports, learn from the successes of the club's previous activities and better plan for their future activities.
- Reporting service is a matter of local pride. Reporting puts your club on the map as leaders in your local community, and it's an important way to share success with other clubs in your district and around the world.
- A high percentage of clubs reporting service is a sign of a healthy district.
- » Reporting service allows you to become eligible for service awards.

How do clubs and districts collectively benefit from reporting service?

- Reporting shines a light on how and where local clubs are making a difference. This elevates the profile of Lions Clubs International as a global service club organization.
- Service reports provide tangible evidence of our global engagement and impact to prospective partners of Lions Clubs International. These relationships strengthen the organization and yield benefits at the local
- People want to participate in real, visible change. Service reporting allows clubs to continually engage communities, tell stories more effectively and ultimately grow their member base.

How does reporting service benefit the people we serve?

- » Service data helps everyone understand the needs of communities around the world and how our Lions and Leos are serving those needs.
- » Because service activities are scalable, one small service project can become the next global initiative of the organization. But Lions Clubs International is not aware of such projects unless they are reported.
- » Service data enables Lions Clubs International to identify best practices that can be shared globally.
- » Measurement leads to insight. Setting higher goals each year mobilizes the organization toward growth.
- Service reports show how Lions and Leos around the world are using funds from Lions Clubs International Foundation grants to serve their communities. This visibility encourages Lions and Leos to think creatively about their own projects and apply for LCIF grants themselves.

Additional benefits

- Reporting is the final step in completing a service project. If it's not reported, it's not done!
- Reporting service is a lot like voting. You may think your report doesn't make a big difference, but the only way we'll be successful is if everyone does their small part.
- Reporting is considered service in itself. The time clubs and districts spend reporting their service are considered volunteer hours, and can be reported in MyLion.

YOU ASKED ABOUT USED EYEGLASSES? HERE'S YOUR ANSWER!

Over 12,000 patients have been helped with Eyeglasses collected by Lions Clubs in Western PA. These glasses are cleaned and the prescription is measured using a Lens Meter. Most of our patients live in very remote villages and have never had anyone help them with their vision. So, when they receive the glasses, they are so pleased and grateful to receive the "gift of improved vision".

Here are photos showing patients we have helped, along with some members of our volunteer team.

Mission Vision, a non-profit based in Cranberry PA provides the training and equipment that we use for our mission work. A dedicated lady, Sandy Kalmar, has cleaned the glasses and measured the prescriptions for Mission Vision as a full-time volunteer for a decade. She is retiring and we are in need for Lions and others to help process the donated eyeglasses that they collect.

Mission Vision will provide the equipment, supplies and storage needed for the processing. They will also provide the necessary training. Mission Vision has also offered to fund a position for a handicapped person to perform this processing, as leadership of Mission Vision also has a passion to help those that are challenged finding employment.
