The committee is recommended to make a presentation at the Lions meeting to get approval to proceed. After receiving approval, it is recommended to set up an execution committee to execute the project.

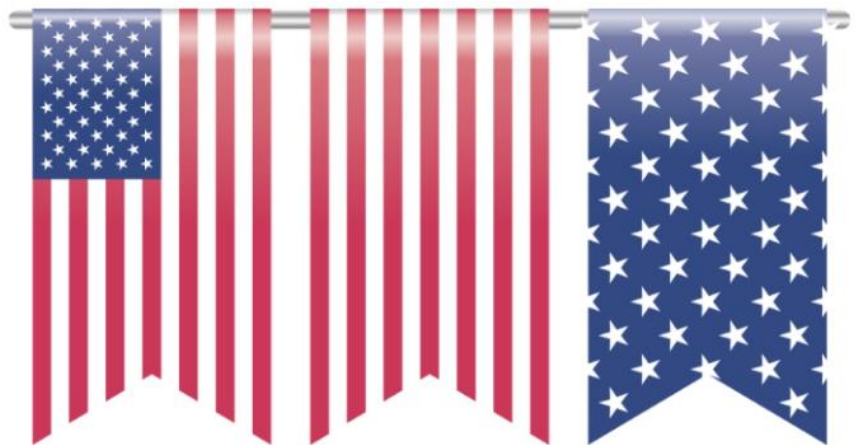

WE NEED YOUR HELP – PLEASE READ!

We have finally reached a time when we are able to safely gather (and hopefully weather and personal schedules will allow) outside to mobilize my District Governor service project.

During my term as DG (2019-2020) I secured a grant through the McKeesport Hospital Foundation to procure items that would help senior citizens who have mobility and/or vision impairments to perform basic daily tasks. We will be putting together a total of 330 care packages each filled with these items. Each package will consist of: a specially designed spoon and plate; button hook aid, sock aid, 27” reacher, low vision playing cards and a large print puzzle book for fun! The care packages will be in a reusable shopping tote provided by UPMC.

Each club that sends a member to help assemble totes will be given a minimum of 10 to take back to their community. I encourage clubs to reach out to local churches or food programs to find individuals who can best benefit from these packages. Ideally, they should be distributed to individuals who reside in their own homes or apartments rather than in care facilities where these items are most likely readily available.
