He has served the club as a member of the Board of Directors, acted as Recording Secretary, was elected Secretary for 2023-2024, and has served as a member of the Golf Outing Committee.

DG/PDG Raynak served on the District Cabinet in the following positions: District White Cane Chair 1992 - 1993; PA Lions Convention Chair 2017 - 2018; Region 3 Zone B Chair 2018 – 2019; and Vice District Governor 2019 – 2020. He served as District Governor the year of the pandemic, 2020 - 2021. DG/PDG Raynak was elected as a board member and Treasurer of the LDBAW in 2021 where he successfully submitted and obtained approval for the Board to be designated a 501(c)3 charitable organization. DG/PDG Chris is proud to be a Melvin Jones Fellow and was honored with the prestigious International Presidents Award in 2023 by IP Brian Sheehan.

District Governor/Past District Governor Chris has also been involved in various church activities. He was a member of the Pastoral Council for Saint Eugene Church in Liberty Borough. He has served as a Lector for many years at his church and as a member of the offertory counting team. DG/PDG Chris also volunteered as the banking chair for the parish festival and fundraising committee. DG/Past District Governor Raynak was a committee member and Assistant Scoutmaster of Liberty Borough Boy Scout Troop 53.

DG/PDG Raynak is retired from the Internal Revenue Service. He previously had a lengthy career in the food sales business, both on the retail end as well as the food service side. District Governor/Past District Governor Chris Raynak currently lives in Monroeville PA, has been married to his lovely wife Lion Mary for 48 years, is a proud father of two outstanding sons, two wonderful daughters-in-law, and a highly active grandson.

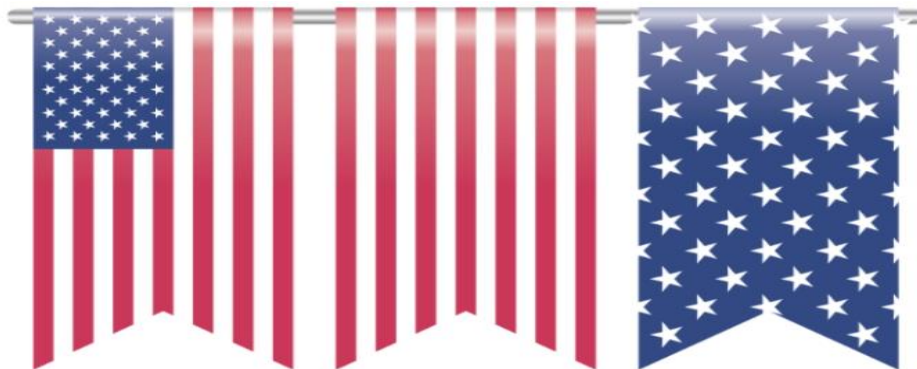

PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp was founded in 1948 under the leadership of Carl Shoemaker, a blind Lions Club member from Lewistown, PA. His vision was to provide a place that the blind residents of Pennsylvania could use as a retreat and experience educational, recreational, and personal growth. His mission was accomplished so successfully that the Camp grew into a facility suited to meet the needs of others living with developmental and cognitive disabilities. The program expanded to include children and adults with a wide array of special needs in the 1980s, which is still in full swing. This success has depended on funding from the Lions of Pennsylvania as a PA Lions State Project.

In 1998, the Pennsylvania House of Representatives issued a Citation in honor of the 50th anniversary of the founding of Beacon Lodge, and the Pennsylvania Senate issued a letter of congratulations for that momentous occasion.

In 2023, we are celebrating the 75th anniversary of the founding of PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp. The festivities will occur for our Campers and supporters throughout the summer, culminating in a celebratory dinner at the Ramada Conference Center in State College on September 16. "The PA State Council of Lions Clubs is registered in Pennsylvania as an Institution of Purely Public Charity under The Institutions of Purely Public Charity Act, 10 P.S. § 371. et seq. As such, it, and its subsidiary clubs, qualify for an exemption from PA Sales tax. This means clubs are exempt from paying sales tax when they purchase goods or services. It does NOT mean they are exempt from remitting sales and use tax to Pennsylvania during fundraisers."

Membership Key Awards acknowledge the importance of effective recruitment in membership growth by recognizing the number of new members a Lion has sponsored.

Each of the 17 Membership Keys is designed to reflect the number of new members sponsored. Keys are automatically issued after the new members have remained Lions for a year and a day.

Eligibility

1. A new member must remain a Lion for a year and a day before the name may be used as credit toward a key, to be issued the 13th month; except where the sponsored member dies, transfers or moves from the community before the expiration of a year and a day.
2. The name of the new member, with the sponsor's name, member number, and club number, must be reported on the club's Monthly Membership Report or MyLCL. (For existing clubs only.)
3. Charter, transfer, and reinstated members cannot be used as credit for a key.
4. Only one sponsor per new member can receive credit for a key.
5. No sponsor shall receive more than one key of the same type.
6. Requests for sponsor changes must be received by the Membership and New Club Operations Department within 90 days of the new members' join date.

Each key is a lapel pin with a clutch backing. For the Senior Master (recognizing 25 members) and above, the lapel pins are complemented by a distinctive medallion and presentation ribbon.

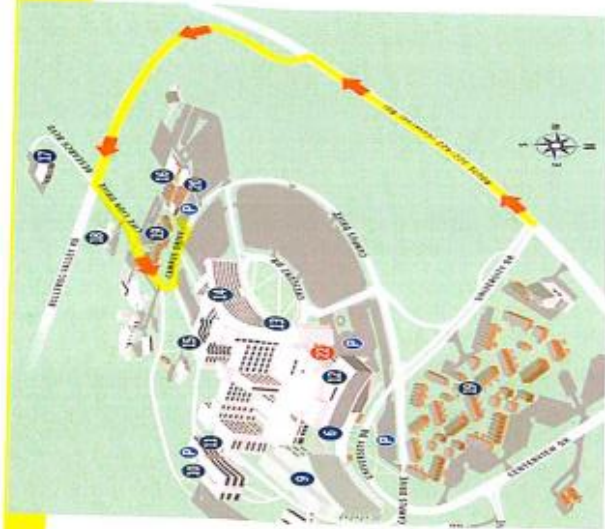
