New Centennial Silver Dollar Coin design unveiled at 99th annual convention in Fukuoka, Japan!



Pricing for the Lions Club International Centennial Silver Dollar will include a \$10 surcharge for each coin, which the public law authorizes to be paid to the Lions Clubs International Foundation to further its programs for the blind and visually impaired in the United States and abroad; invest in adaptive technologies for the disabled; and invest in youth and those affected by a major disaster. The United States Mint will announce the release date and additional pricing information prior to the coin's release in 2017.
