The Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) recognizes donations of \$1,000. It is the backbone of LCIF, providing 75 percent of the foundation's revenue. The MJF is an honor presented to those who donate \$1,000 to LCIF or to people for whom a donation was made by others.

Contributions can be made by individuals (including non-Lions), clubs or districts. Donations may be in one sum, or in installments of a minimum of \$100 over a five-year period. Melvin Jones Fellows receive an attractive lapel pin, a plaque and a congratulatory letter.
