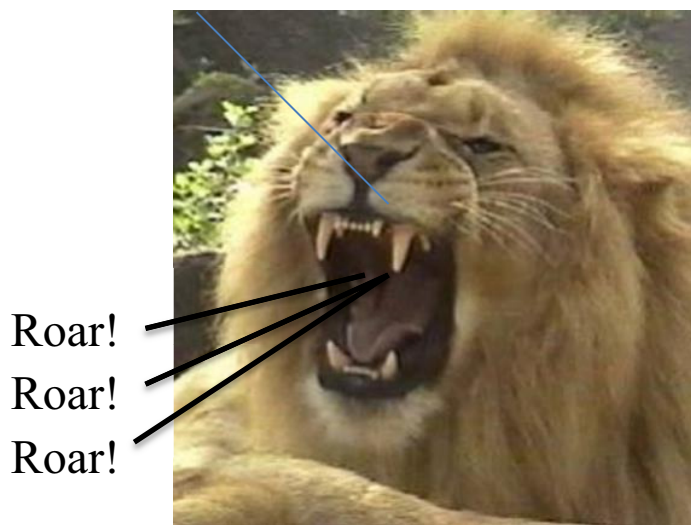


state wide as well as out of state. There was a lot of excitement from the people coming through the line when they saw our Lions vests!

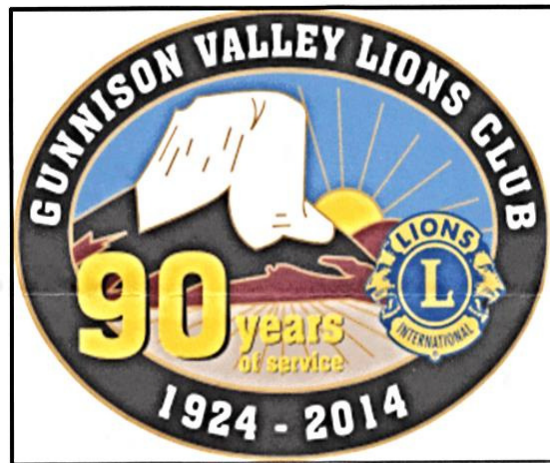

Gunnison Valley Lions Club Commemorates 90 years



The Gunnison Valley Lions Club celebrated 90 years of service at a commemorative banquet on Thursday February 27th at 7 pm at the Gunnison City Hall.

In 1924, sitting at the junction of two state highways and an active railroad connection to Salt Lake City, Gunnison was the agricultural and commercial center of Central Utah with the Gunnison Sugar Factory, the farmers and turkey grower co-ops (which became IFA and Norbest), 3 prosperous banks and a bustling agricultural business community. 30 of the most prominent members of this valley formed the Gunnison Valley Development League which then became the Gunnison Valley Lions Club on February 26, 1924. The original motto, 'No man is too big nor too busy to serve.'

The Lions Club honored their long-standing tradition and dedication to service by presenting the annual Humanitarian Award to the outstanding Citizen of Gunnison Valley in recognition of service. The banquet speaker was Beverly Thomas, 2014 District 28 T district governor.

The Humanitarian Award presentation, the original Lions Charter, a history of the Gunnison Valley Lions Club, and a new member induction ceremony commemorated the occasion.

We had a very successful trip to Senegal.

At the Senegal eyeglass clinics we used mostly collections of - and + diopter glasses. The procedures worked well.

Now I am about to set up other sites so that others can start doing clinics with - and + diopter glasses without our aid. For each of these sites we need a starter eyeglass collection to train them and get them started on their own clinics.

This requires a large number of reader glasses and also, negative diopter eyeglasses that we will probably end up buying.

We would like to have several thousand readers for this

purpose, but at present, I have about 500 on hand. If it is possible to provide readers out of existing collections please let me know. Typically, when we go through collections, we find about 20 to 25% are readers, i.e. with identical plus diopter spherical readings in both lenses and zero values for cylinder. I need the readers now, but do not need the regular prescription glasses with more complex prescriptions.

If anyone can provide just the readers that would be best for me. But, if you cannot do this, I can get help to go through the boxes of glasses any of you have and pull out the readers. I will use these for more clinics in Senegal, and some in Peru and possibly Ecuador.

Let me know what you may have available and I will arrange to get whatever is possible.

Rules of Multiple District 28 Convention 2014

1. The Council of Governors shall arrange the order of business of the Multiple District Convention and the same shall be the order of the day at all sessions and will be held May 15-17 in Richfield, Utah at Snow College South located at 800 West 200 South.
2. Except as specified or otherwise provided, Roberts Rules of Order, newly revised, shall be the authority for the Convention. A Parliamentarian for this convention shall be appointed by the Council of Governors and shall not otherwise be a member of any convention committee of reporting committee.
3. The Council of Governors shall appoint a Sergeant-at-arms and such assistant Sergeant-at-Arms as it deems necessary.
4. On all matters presented before the convention, each chartered-club in good standing of Districts U and T shall be entitled to one voting delegate or alternate; who must be present in person, for each ten members of said club or major fraction thereof, as shown, by the records of the District Cabinet Secretaries at the last reporting period prior to the convention. A major fraction may be five or more members. In addition, Past District Governors are entitled to voting delegate status upon proper registration.
5. Each delegate, or in his/her absence an alternate (unless he/she is a District Governor), upon proper verification, shall be certified as a delegate to the convention and shall be entitled to one vote on any matter coming before the convention.
6. The respective Credentials Committees shall prepare a list of certified delegates in triplicate. One copy is to be retained by the Credentials Committee, and one copy shall be provided to the Multiple District Elections Committee.
7. Immediately prior to the first vote taken at any session, a delegate count shall be taken to determine the presence of a Quorum. Thereafter, on any vote, a delegate count shall be taken only if a quorum is challenged.
8. New business will be in order each session at the conclusion of the regular business as decided by a majority vote of the delegates present.
9. All resolutions must be clearly written on one side of the paper only, and delivered to the Chairman of the Resolutions Committee. Resolutions must be in the hands of the said Committee in time to receive due consideration and approval for presentation. One designated member from the Committee will read all resolutions.
10. Committee members reporting before the convention shall notify the Council of Governors in advance as to the time requested for delivery of his/her report. The Council of Governors shall then set the time limit for such report consistent with the limitation of time imposed by the session.
11. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice to a motion or proposition before the assembly, and nor more than three (3) minutes each time. Any person rising to speak from the floor shall state his/her club and whether they are a delegate.
12. This rule may be waived by an affirmative vote of the majority of delegates present.
13. Club members registered for the Convention may participate in the activities of the Convention, including speaking on the floor, but not vote unless certified as a delegate. Non-registered club members and other persons may likewise participate in the activities of the Convention, except for speaking and voting; however, the privilege to address the Convention may be granted these persons by majority vote of the assembled delegates.
14. Nominations for Council Chair will be presented to the Nominations Committee. Thereafter, each candidate shall have not more five (5) minutes for seconding speeches and response by the candidate. Each candidate may use the time as the candidate and sponsoring group may decide.
15. Nominations for the office of Council Chair must be cleared through and by the Nominations Committee as provided in the By-Laws.
16. Persons making nominations and seconding speeches and candidates, with their Partners, are to be seated on the speaker's platform before nominations take place.
17. Voting for the office of Council Chair shall be done at a time and place selected by the Council of Governors consistent with the Constitution and By-Laws.
18. Campaigning in the general area of the balloting booths is prohibited.
19. Nominations for convention city will be presented by the Nominations Committee. Six minutes will then be allowed for nomination and seconding speeches and demonstrations as determined by each sponsoring group.
20. Nominations for convention city must comply with applicable provisions of the Constitution and be cleared through the Nominations Committee.
21. Voting for Council Chair and for convention city or on other Multiple District matters, if any, will be on ballots prepared for such purpose by the Election Committee.
22. The Elections Committee shall provide, maintain and control the ballot box in an area central to the areas assigned to the District Election Committees.
23. Each certified delegate shall obtain a Multiple District ballot from the Election Committee.
24. The Multiple District Committee shall be solely responsible for counting the ballots. Each candidate shall be entitled to one watcher.
25. The results of the balloting are to be announced at the District Governor's Banquet or at such other time and place determined by the Council of Governors. A member of the Elections Committee will announce the winner and the results of each election. No results are to be given until the time is do designated.



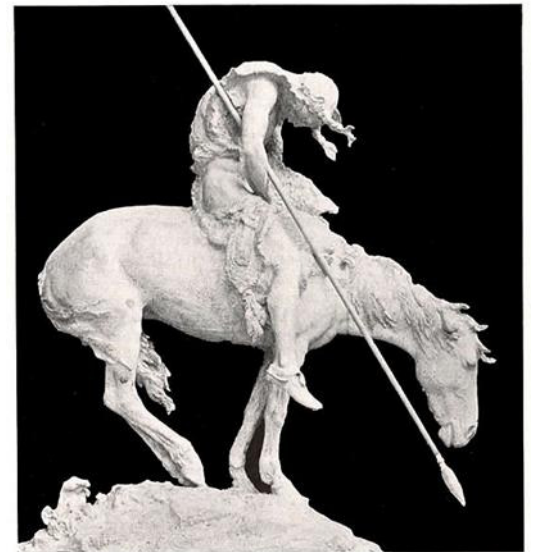
