



Have you heard?

The old Welch-Allyn Cubsight screening equipment is being replaced throughout the state as new equipment can be purchased.

The new PlusOptix S12R screens for 6 conditions instead of the 4 that the old machines detected. So the referral rate has increased with the new equipment. Lions are reporting that the new equipment cuts down on the paperwork since the machine gives an immediate pass or refer reading. We also are hearing that, while it takes some training and experience, once you learn the new way, it screens much, much faster. More children can be served in much less time!



Cubsight Training on the new equipment was held in Alexandria. The Winnfield Lions Club joined the Alexandria Lions Club to learn how to work the PlusOptix S12R. The Pineville Lions Club is being trained as well. Isn't it great to see our Clubs working together?




