Boys give gift of sight to others

I could just imagine if I went 10 or 20 years without glasses and then finally got to put a pair on, how different the world would be," said the 10-year-old.

Without eyeglasses, he said "It would be difficult to read, do sports and it would be really hard in school."

This is one of the reasons the youngster and his brother Luke, 8, decided to help out the Stellarton and Area Lions Club with a project to collect used eyeglasses to be sent to children in developing countries.

The boys, who attend Scotsburn Elementary, placed collection boxes in 18 schools in Pictou County this spring, receiving 460 pairs of eyeglasses.

"It made me really proud of myself," said Luke

The boys contacted each school asking to place collection boxes there, distributed them in April and then picked them up in early June.

They were eager to collect the boxes and find out how many pairs of glasses were donated. Too excited to wait until they returned to their parents' pharmacy in Stellarton to count all of them, they began totaling some of the boxes while they were driving.

"I remember that day being so excited thinking about how many we would get," said Tyler.

Thinking they might get about 100 pairs when they started distributing the boxes, Tyler said "It was a real shock how many there were."

Their mother Kim said the boys were thrilled to let the Lions know how many sets of glasses had been collected. "They were just vibrating – they couldn't wait to tell them."

Lion Bob Buell said the club collecting used eyeglasses is an ongoing project, gathering them from a variety of sources such as local optometrists. But, he said they don't usually get many children's glasses. When Dave MacLean, who is a club member, told his boys

"The initiative taken by Tyler and Luke filled a huge gap in our club's program," said Buell.

The Lions Club in Canada and internationally works on various projects dealing with blindness, restoring eyesight and improving eye health and eye care around the world. The club started the Recycle For Sight program to help people in need by providing eyeglasses free of charge to people in developing countries.

"The Lions told us it's like a miracle to them (the children who receive the donated glasses) and they're overjoyed," said Tyler.

The boys are considering helping out with the project next year, with some of the schools already requesting to host the boxes again.

They said some of the schools used creative ways to entice students to donate their old glasses. At G.R. Saunders, when students brought in glasses, they received a ballot to win a Gogi's gift certificate. "That really got them a lot," said Tyler.

"The Stellarton and Area Lions Club would like to express our most sincere thank you to these young men for their tremendous accomplishment, as well as their honest concern for those less fortunate. To this end, we are all impressed with their the initiative to do this, and more importantly, following through and making it actually happen," said Buell.

"Please keep up the good work boys, as we know you both have the ability and desire to make good things happen in this world, and because of you, it will surely become a much better place for all."

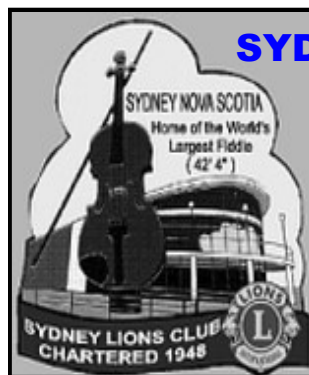

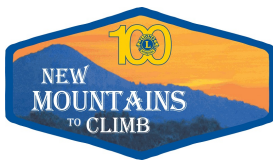

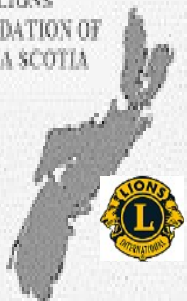
