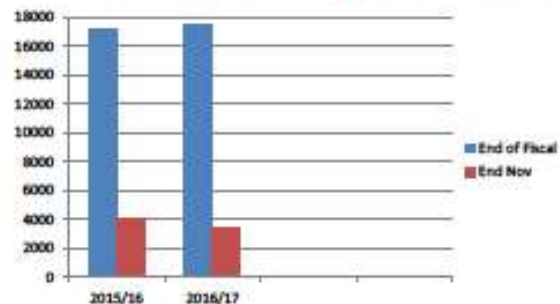
MEASLES....DID YOU KNOW??
