

I have yet another reminder. If you haven't yet registered for the Emerging Lions Leadership Institute on the Mount Allisson University campus in Sackville, New Brunswick, I urge you to take advantage of this learning opportunity on the weekend of May 24<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

Candidates must be Lions in good standing who have successfully served on a club committee and who have not yet attained the level of club president. Current charter club presidents are also eligible for this institute. They must also be willing to commit to all days of the institute, including group mealtimes, and understand personal time is extremely limited. Attendance at all classroom sessions, which will be conducted in English, and at scheduled meals is mandatory.

Meals and lodging will be provided by Lions Clubs International, and a non-refundable participation fee of \$100.00 CAD will be required (payable after you are accepted) to offset a portion of these costs for all institutes. This fee will be due no less than six weeks prior to the institute start date. Participants are also responsible for their own transportation and related travel expenses to and from the institute site.

Application deadline is April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, so time is of the essence. You have less than two weeks to complete it.

Finally! The new Lion Portal has been a long time coming, but the end is in sight. The target launch window is April 15 – May 13. During this time, all current Lion Account users will receive emails inviting them to access the new Lions Portal.

From now until April 11, MyLion, MyLCI, and Insights will continue to function, but will no longer be available from April 12 onward.

User permissions will not change. Those who can report service, access member data, and other key functions will remain the same. Visitors attempting to access the current tools will be redirected to the new portal. Note that the new Lion Portal will require a unique, unshared email, and phone numbers will no longer be supported as a log in credential.

To help you get started, go to the Lions International website, search for Portal, and find a treasure trove of information, including links to several training videos designed to make the transition a pleasant experience. So, check these out now, have fun with them, and remember to reach out if you need assistance.




