The Judge asked, "What is it?"







Canning

Canning Lions Club gearing up for community activities

ith a capacity of 600, the Canning & District Lions
Hall is a valuable community resource. School fundraisers, safe-graduation activities, Girl Guides meetings and family gatherings are just some of the activities that regularly take place at the hall.
"We're not the largest Lions

"We're not the largest Lions club in Nova Scotia, but we have the largest hall," says Bill Lyons, vice-president of Canning & District Lions Club. "The hall is here for anybody in the community who wants to use it."

Lyons wants to see additional recreational activities taking place at the hall and has

put the call out for donations of crib boards, dart boards and washer toss sets.

"We're sensing that because people have been cocooning in their homes for a long time, they're ready to get out and be active again," he says. "We'd like to put together some tournaments to get people reengaged."

He envisions launching the tournaments as monthly events and then gauging the level of interest. He could even see other communities getting in on the action, combining fun and competition by challenging each other at these activities.

"We could have Kingsport challenge Blomidon, or Glenmont challenge Canard," he says. "This will bring out the community spirit."

With a bar, canteen, kitchen and washrooms, the hall has the facilities to host any type of gathering. The building began life as an apple warehouse and became a Lions hall in the 1970s, Lyons says.

"The Lions back then put in a tremendous amount of effort and funds to make it the hall it is today."

Canning & District Lions Club has recently added six new members, bringing its membership total to 26. Lyons would like to see that number exceed 30.

"Our membership is growing again, so there is more optimism now than there has been in the last three or four years," he says. "As our membership expands, we can take on more activities."

The Canning & District Lions Club awards scholarships annually to graduating students from Northeast Kings Education Centre. As all Lions Clubs do, Lyons says, the club does a lot of work below the radar.

"If someone needs gas money to go for medical treatment, we will help," he says. "We help out on a lot of ways that people don't often see."

Saturday night is bingo night at the Lions hall, and the event is always well attended, with 80 or 90 players showing up each week.

"The bingo is what pays our light bill and allows us to exist," Lyons points out. The club holds its regular meetings at the hall on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month. The club also provides space at no cost to the local food bank.

Lyons has been a Lion for 26 years and has no regrets about the time and energy he has devoted to the cause.


