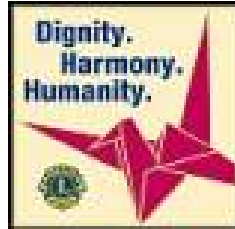

ZONE 9 SPEAK OUT

hosted by the
New Germany & Area Lions Club

During the zone 9 speak-out recently hosted by the New Germany & Area Lions Club, three young speakers entertained a large gathering of Lions from seven different clubs, parents and family members.

The speak-out is one of the significant components of the Lions' Youth Outreach program. Winners from the club speak-outs compete in the zone speak-out. Zone winners compete in the district competition at the Nova Scotia Convention in Baddeck, while the provincial winner competes against three other speakers from the Atlantic Provinces at the multiple district convention in St. John's, NL.

1st place winner was Lori Mosher, a student at New Germany Rural High School sponsored by the New Germany and Area Loons Club, who spoke about "The Trip of a Lifetime." The runner up, Evonne Lingley, a student at Liverpool Regional High School sponsored by the Liverpool Lions Club, spoke about "The Effects of War on Veterans & Families."

Each speaker spoke between four and six minutes and were judged on a number of criteria by a panel of three judges. The speakers were then asked questions by two questioners. Points were awarded for both the speech and the way they answered the questions. A timer was in place and speakers who went under four minutes, or over six minutes, were penalized by the judges.

All speakers are awarded a cash prize, a Certificate of Appreciation and a trophy. Prizes become increasingly larger at the district and multiple district levels. At the zone and district levels all eight clubs in zone 9 share in the expenses for these competitions. That includes transportation and accommodations at the district convention.

The other participant, Sara BeVilleneuve, a student at Bridgewater Jr.-Sr. High sponsored by the Bridgewater & Area Lions Club, spoke about "Being French in an English World."

School staff wishing to obtain information about the 2017 speak-out program should contact their local Lions Club as we are always looking for participants for this very important youth program.

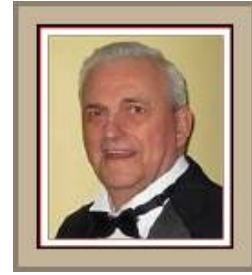
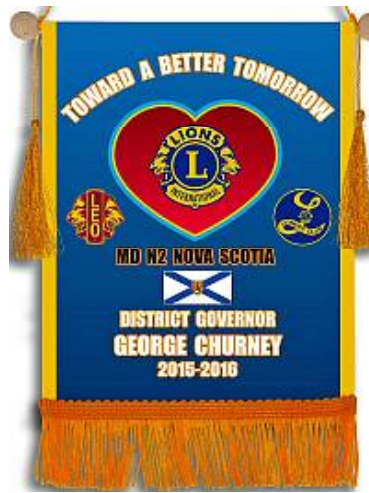

Did you know?? Age-related macular degeneration, glaucoma, cataracts, measles and vitamin A deficiency are major causes of Low Vision, particularly in the developing world???

Nearly 246 million people in the world have low vision, with 63 percent age 50 or older. Low vision services are accessed by a mere 5 to 10 percent of those with the condition, leaving the majority to face obstacles similar to those who are blind.

LCIF Sight First Program

-Sight First program: Funds the efforts of Lions, nongovernmental organizations, government agencies and others to fight the major causes of preventable and reversible blindness, and provide services to persons who are blind or have a visual impairment;

-River Blindness: A parasitic infection affecting **37 million** people that occurs through the bite of a black fly, which is found near swiftly flowing rivers. A worm parasite enters the human body and produces thousands of larval worms which migrate in the skin and eye. When the worms die, they are toxic to the skin and eyes, causing extreme itching and eye lesions; after long-term exposure these lesions may lead to low vision or irreversible blindness

-Trachoma: A bacterial disease affecting **84 million** people, trachoma is spread easily through contact with eye discharge of infected individuals and through transmission by flies attracted to eye discharge. After years of repeated infection, the inside of the eyelid may be scarred so severely that the eyelid turns inward and the lashes rub on the eyeball, scarring the cornea. This results in a slow and painful process toward complete blindness.

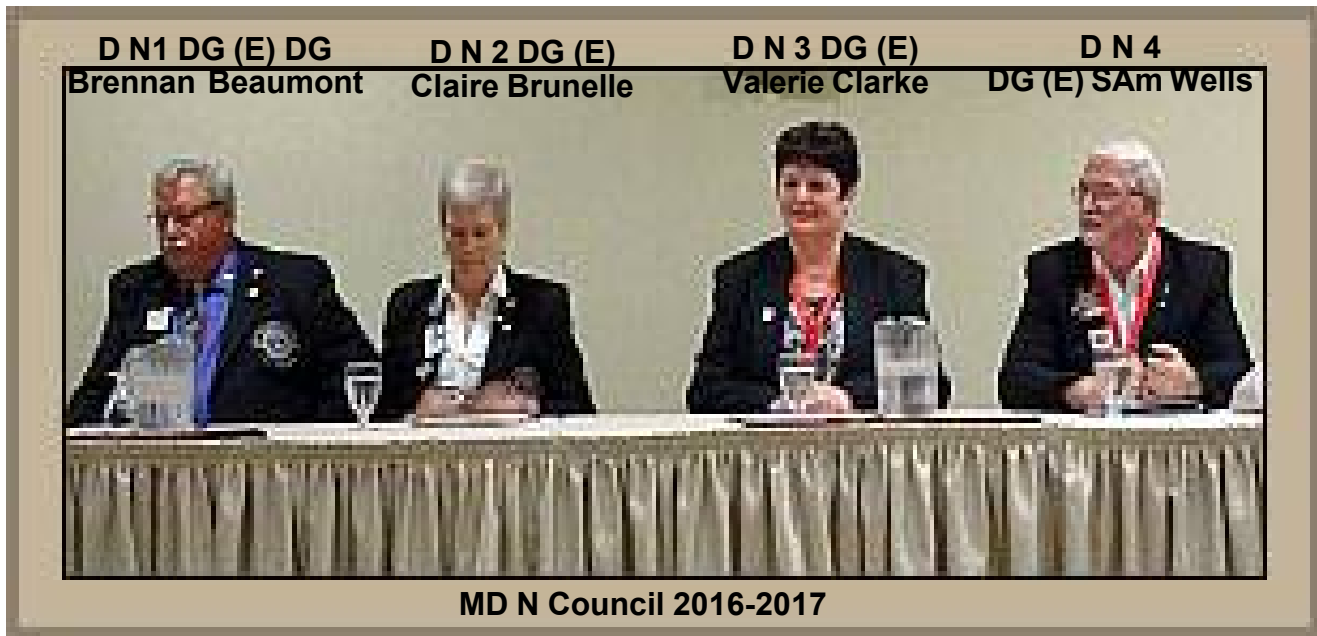
