Club

Club Officers



President:

- Responsible to preside over all meeting of the club and regular & special meetings of the board of directors.
- Appoint administrative & activities committees
- Member of the District Governors advisory committee & expected to attend quarterly advisory meeting in your zone and district cabinet meetings.

Immediate Past President:

- Serves as club ambassador
- Makes guest feel welcomed.

Vice President(s):

- Member of the Clubs Board of Directors.
- Substitute for the President in their absence.
- Oversee committees as directed by the President.

Club Officers (cont)



Secretary:

- Keep all Club records including minutes of regular & board of director meetings, committee appointments, officer's list, attendance records, list of members showing their address, phone numbers, emails, etc.
- Collect all monies due the club & turn over to the club treasurer.
- Submit Monthly Membership (MMR's) and Club Activity Reports to Lions Club International on a monthly basis.
- Member of the District Governors advisory committee & expected to attend quarterly advisory meeting in your zone and district cabinet meetings.

Treasurer:

- Custodian of the club funds
- Assist Finance Committee in creating a club budget.
- Provide financial statements as required.

Lion Tamer:

 Responsible for club property (such as flags, banners, gavels, etc.). The Lion Tamer also keeps order and distributes materials at meetings.

Tail Twister:

 Serves to promote harmony, good fellowship and enthusiasm at club meetings through the judicious imposition of "fines" on members.

Membership Chairperson:

- Officers are elected annually
- Club president appoints a nomination committee in March
- The nomination committee selects candidates
- The club votes on in April
- The term begins July 1st

- The Club should assign each new member a mentor to help them through the process of becoming a Lion.
- All clubs are run by a Standard Club Constitution and By-Laws that is published yearly by LCI.

- Conducts various fundraising programs including the Robert J. Uplinger Distinguished Service Award Program annual raffle, contributing member & contributing club programs.



Name and Logo



- The official name of the association is "The International Association of Lions Clubs" or simply "Lions Clubs International."
- The name Lions was chosen on a secret ballot over several others because the lion stood for strength, courage, fidelity and vital action. The Letters LIONS stand for <u>LIBERTY</u>, <u>INTELLIGENCE</u>, <u>OUR <u>NATION'S</u>
 <u>SAFETY</u>
 </u>
- The Lions logo consists of a gold "L" on a blue field surrounded by a gold circle. On either side of the circle is the profile of a Lion's head, one looking back upon a proud past and the other looking optimistically toward the future.



Organizational Structure



- International officers implement policy and serve as inspirational leaders of the world's Lions.

- The International Board of Directors is the governing body of the association.

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF)



- LCIF grants an average of US\$30 million annually. It provides clubs with the means to build schools, health clinics, vocational rehabilitation, training centers and other projects that address community needs.
- LCIF SightFirst reduces and eliminates blindness worldwide. The program targets the leading causes of preventable blindness which affects millions of people each year.
 - Since it's launch in 1990, Lions have raised over US\$415 million for SightFirst, making LCIF the world's largest blindness prevention organization.
