#### **Voting Rules for Lake Placid**

Delegates from a club will not be eligible to vote at the MD Convention in Lake Placid if their club is not current on all of its dues and obligations with LCI and MD20. Please make sure that your club pays their dues promptly. I would love to go to the Council Meeting February 17<sup>th</sup> and have them tell me that once again 20W is 100% paid and up to date. It is vitally important that we all are eligible to vote and that each club sends all of its delegates to vote on Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup>.

Remember that you must register for the convention and get your credentials before you can vote. Take advantage of the lower registration price and sign up before March 30<sup>th</sup>. There is a registration form in the MD 20 newsletter that was recently delivered or you can go to the MD20 website and print the form from there.

There will also be new voting methods this year. For a contest with just 1 or 2 choices, it will be a mark for the one you want or a yes/no vote. For a contest with more than 2 choices, you will be asked to mark your preference for each candidate by marking a 1 next to your first choice, a 2 next to your second choice, a 3 next to your third choice, etc... This is new this year but it should eliminate the need for having everyone vote again. This will all be explained in more detail several times before you actually vote in Lake Placid on Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup>.

# Districts 20 W, Y1 and Y2 Redistricting Information



Districts 20W, Y1 and Y2

We, the District Governors of W, Y1 and Y2, as the elected representatives of our districts, request that you vote "YES" on the redistricting question that will appear on your ballot in Lake Placid.

The proposed plan was adapted from others that we have seen over the years. We took it to our cabinets, clubs and members for their consideration and discussion. Each District held special conventions to discuss and vote on this plan and then came to the Multiple District council with our overwhelming support for redistricting. The council voted to put this question on the ballot in Lake Placid.

In our plan, District W will be split with two counties merging with District Y1 to become "Y" with 54 clubs and 1373 members. The remainder of W will merge with District Y2 to form the new "W" with 56 clubs and 1547 members.

For our districts to continue to serve our clubs, members and communities, we need to take this action. This was not an easy decision for any of us but is one that is necessary for our respective districts and for the Multiple District as well.

We hope that you will support us with an affirmative vote in Lake Placid. Thank you for helping us to continue to serve our communities.

# THE FOLLOWING IS AN EXPLANATION OF THE PROPOSED REDISTRICTING OF DISTRICTS Y1, Y2 AND W WHICH WILL BE VOTED ON AT THE CONVENTION IN LAKE PLACID

Please take notice that a proposal to redistrict sub-districts Y1. Y2 and W of Multiple District 20 has been approved by the delegates to the respective conventions of those sub-districts and will be presented to the delegates of the Multiple District 20 Convention on Sunday, May 7, 2017 for consideration. The proposal effectively consolidates the three smaller sub-districts into two larger subdistricts that will be known as District W and District Y. newly proposed districts will meet all requirements for good standing as set forth in the by-laws of Lions Clubs International.

The proposed District W will include all clubs situated in the following counties of New York State: Albany, Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Hamilton, Herkimer, Montgomery, Rensselaer, Saint Lawrence, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Warren and Washington. Those clubs located east of Route 26 in Oneida County will also be allocated to the proposed District W.

#### **Lions Camp Badger Message**

Hello everyone! My name is Pat Gillule, and I am the new director at Lions Camp Badger. It is an honor and privilege to be part of something this exciting! I look forward to a great summer and am confident that we will accomplish much, all while having fun in the process!

Camp is no stranger to me, having worked at residential programs for individuals with special needs for twelve summers. I am returning to this setting after taking a break from it to raise my family. During the school year, I am also a high school special education teacher. I can think of nothing more rewarding than spending time with the individuals we serve.

Plans for camp are in full swing, and I am pleased to say that we are almost fully staffed. In addition to some talented returning counselors, we are bringing new people on board with a lot of great skills and abilities. Another special education teacher will be assisting me in our programming efforts. Our aquatics director will be with us full-time, and we added an additional part-time nurse. Collectively, our staff will be able to offer opportunities such as: Safety-based swim instruction, karaoke, professional DJ services, nature hikes, arts & crafts, gymnastics, martial arts, and camp theater. Our nursing staff is exceptional, with two RN's sharing the camp season. They bring to the table years of experience at other special needs camps, including programs for children with chronic illness, multiple special needs, and muscular dystrophy. Our LPN happens to be a crafter, so she'll be sharing those talents with our campers. We also hope to begin a volunteer program, primarily using students from local high schools to partner with campers as friends and role models.

I am in the process of contacting campers and their families for feedback on what they want out of camp. I love knowing what they want to learn--because if we can offer it, we will! One camper surprised me by saying he always wanted to learn how to play field hockey! So plans are underway for a modified, safer version of the sport that we can try out this summer! I also hope to incorporate a Club Night a few times a week. Here, campers can choose their interests from among a few activity choices. They will be encouraged to try new things or enjoy the things they already love. We also plan to bring back some favorite activities, such as a visit from the local fire department and a magician.

As of mid-March, over one third of our campers have already registered. Please encourage any families you know to get their applications in as soon as possible.



#### In Memoriam



MASSENA -- Mr. Peter J. Tennis, 93, of Ober Street, passed away Saturday afternoon, April 1, 2017 at Massena Memorial Hospital.

Pete was born August 30, 1923 in Poughkeepsie, the son of the late Peter and Laura Phillips Tennis.

He graduated from Arlington High School and Pratt Institute in Brooklyn.

On November 1, 1943, he entered the US Army Air Force, proudly serving his country until his honorable discharge on August 24, 1945. On December 18, 1950, he was drafted back into service, serving until his honorable discharge on August 30, 1952.

Pete worked for Reynolds Metals for many years, retiring as a Mechanical Engineer.

He was also a skilled pilot and owned his own plane, where he and his late wife, Marge, traveled around the country many times.

Pete had a great passion for golfing and would be found regularly at the Massena Country Club, where he was a longtime member.

Pete dedicated many years of his time to the Massena community as a volunteer driver of Massena Meals on Wheels, delivering until he was 92. 
