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# **Voting Rules for Lake Placid**

Delegates from a club will not be eligible to vote at the MD Convention in Lake Placid if their club is not current on all of its dues and obligations with LCI and MD20. Please make sure that your club pays their dues promptly. I would love to go to the Council Meeting February 17<sup>th</sup> and have them tell me that once again 20W is 100% paid and up to date. It is vitally important that we all are eligible to vote and that each club sends all of its delegates to vote on Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup>.

Remember that you must register for the convention and get your credentials before you can vote. Take advantage of the lower registration price and sign up before March 30<sup>th</sup>. There is a registration form in the MD 20 newsletter that was recently delivered or you can go to the MD20 website and print the form from there.

There will also be new voting methods this year. For a contest with just 1 or 2 choices, it will be a mark for the one you want or a yes/no vote. For a contest with more than 2 choices, you will be asked to mark your preference for each candidate by marking a 1 next to your first choice, a 2 next to your second choice, a 3 next to your third choice, etc... This is new this year but it should eliminate the need for having everyone vote again. This will all be explained in more detail several times before you actually vote in Lake Placid on Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup>.

### In Memoriam

Canton— Mr. Harold W. Wilder, 92, of Partridge Knoll, Canton, died Wednesday, January 25, 2017, at Canton-Potsdam Hospital, while being comforted by his loving family.

Calling hours were held on Friday, January 27th from at Lawrence Funeral Home & Cremation Services, 21 Park Street, Canton. His funeral was held on Saturday, January 28th at 11:00 AM at the Canton United Methodist Church, 41 Court Street, with Rev. Michael H. Terrell officiating. Interment will take place in the spring in the Fairview Cemetery, Canton.

Harold was born June 11, 1924, in Windsor, VT and was a son of the late, Orville E. & Dorothy J. (Smith) Wilder. He graduated Canton High School (1942), later attended Louisiana State University and St. Lawrence University, where he was a member of Phi Sigma Kappa Fraternity. In 1943, he enlisted in the US Army, 99th Infantry Division, and served in World War II, from March 29, 1943 to March 16, 1946. On June 13, 1953, he married Barbara J. Greig in Toronto, CA. Harold retired in 1988 as President of Canton Savings and Loan (North Country Savings Bank), a position he earned in 1967. During that time, he also served as Board Member of the First National Bank, Director and Chairman of the NY State League of Savings Institutions, the Director and Vice Chairman of the Federal Home Loan Bank of NY, and the President of the St. Lawrence County Bankers Association.

He was also thoroughly engaged in his community. A few of his positions included: Board Member of Canton United Methodist Church; President of Canton Lion's Club and District Governor of 20W District Lions International; Commander of John C. Peggs #67 American Legion; Life Member of VFW #1231; Eagle Scout, Scoutmaster, and recipient of the Order of the Arrow and Silver Beaver Award in the Boy Scouts of America; Board of Trustees for St. Lawrence Cty Historical Assoc; President of St. Lawrence Golf and Country Club; Founding Member and President of Saints Hockey Boosters; and Member of St. Lawrence University Alumni Council.

Harold is survived by his beloved wife, Barbara J. of Canton; his loving children, Sue (Jim) Wilder of Stormville, NY, Diane Guluzian of Chelmsford, MA and Brian Wilder of Ellijay, GA; son-in-law, Dr. Daniel Palmateer of Canton; a sister, Mary (Wesley O.) Bryant of Naples, FL and four grandchildren, Greig & Justin Guluzian of Massachusetts, Julia (Chris) Palmateer Wall of Massachusetts, and Andrew Palmateer of Washington, DC. Harold is also survived by his many nieces and nephews, along with their children and grandchildren.

He was predeceased by his daughter, Nancy Wilder Palmateer (July 16, 2015) and by his brother, Fred Wilder (June 21, 2015).

Harold enjoyed golfing, the family camp on Lake Ozonia, St. Lawrence Hockey and most of all precious time spent with family.

## From Malone Lions Club

Malone Lions Club Random Acts of Kindness Program (1st EVER)

At 5:00 PM on Wednesday, December 14th, 2016 The Malone Lions Club announced the launch of the 1st ever Malone Lions Club's Random Acts of Kindness Program. For over 60 years the Malone Lions Club has historically given funds to larger "group/organizational type" projects (over \$400,000 since the club's inception, December of 1949).

While all members of the club are expected to work for the Malone Lions Club food stand at the Franklin County Fair, the distribution of funds raised by the Food stand has been, almost exclusively, determined by the Board of Directors.

On Dec. 15, 2016 that changed! Those Lions members in good standing who helped raise money for the club at the fair stand were each given \$50 to use to perform Random Acts of Kindness in our community. NOTE: For over 60 years the Malone Lions food stand at the fair has been the Club's primary source of raising money to support community projects.

President Dave Sauther stated that the purpose of the Random Acts of Kindness Program is "...to give each member a personal say in how some of the money that they have helped raise is donated in our community." This program will create many ambassadors from our club to "do something nice" during this season of giving and sharing. It is our way of thanking the community for supporting our club and our annual food stand at the fair."

The reports are all in. The Random acts of kindness funds (\$1,250 in all) were distributed throughout the North Country (anonymously) to: "a young man battling cancer, a woman in a wheelchair whose house burned down, a woman who had just lost her job, and has two young girls she is raising alone, a high school student living in poverty, an elderly woman whose medication expenses eat most of her pension, the Constable Meals on Wheels program, an elderly couple who both had strokes, she's in a wheelchair, he's on oxygen, a woman living in a trailer with six kids, a family whose infant child is in ICU after being hurt by a family pet, an accident victim, a fire victim, a woman who lost her job just before Christmas, a young single mother with three young sons whose birthdays are all in December, ("She broke down crying when I handed her the money, I am so glad the Lions started this program." Quoted a lion member.), an older woman living by herself, a woman with three children whose ex-husband has not paid child support in six months, help purchase eyeglasses for a man who got diamond dust in his eyes at work, to help a woman in a poor home situation buy clothing for herself, to a family in need, and to a young student battling depression. 16 Lion members participated, plus the club gave \$200 to an accident victim and \$250 to a family burned out of their home.

Rules for Random Acts of kindness (Courtesy of Grand Junction Colorado Lions Club)

1. Provide a list of members.

2. Each member signs the list stating they received their \$50 along with a card. The card splits in half. One half is given to the recipient and the other half is given back to the club secretary/treasurer to keep track that each member used their money appropriately.

3. If the card is not returned showing that the member gave their money away to a person or persons in need they are then billed for that money.

4. Criteria is set up by each individual member in the club as to whom the money should go, such as a mother raising kids alone who looks in need, or the kids back pack program, the food programs or someone he or she knows of who needs the help.


We hope to offer Vision Screening to Colton-Pierrepont Central School Head Start, Pre-K and K grades young students this year.

# Around District 20-W From Town of Schroon Lions Club

The Schroon Lake Lions Club has been offering FREE eye screenings for Pre-K and Kindergarten children in local elementary schools for the past several years. The program is called LION SEE (Screening Eyes Early) and is in partnership with KIDSIGHT USA. So far this year the club has screened 112 students, with approximately 10% needing additional follow-up. Our goal is to reach out to parents, schools and caregivers emphasizing the importance of early identification of potential vision problems and refer those that need further evaluation to an eye care professional. Our state of the art equipment can screen for 6 different risk factors that may lead to amblyopia and hopefully be corrected through early detection. The procedure is simple and non-intrusive. No equipment touches the child. According to educational experts, 80% of learning is visual. So if a child can't see well, they can't learn well. Yet most young children don't get their vision screened until they have problems learning or paying attention in school. By then, it may already be too late. Unless vision problems are detected early, they risk becoming permanent by age 7. 
# Around District 20-W From Town of Schroon Lions Club




