Term of office is three years. Each sub district has three trustees with one being elected each year.

The trustees then have their committee meetings. All trustees are assigned to a committee to work with, it is their time to create reports for the Foundation meeting.

# LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION (LCIF) Message

Dear Lions,

Earlier this month, a 6.5 magnitude earthquake struck Indonesia. While the quake lasted only 15 seconds, more than 100 buildings collapsed and more than 100 people have perished. Thousands of people were left homeless and rescuers used their bare hands to pull people from the rubble. Hospitals were overflowing and patients were being treated outside in tents. The situation is still dire.

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) responded immediately, issuing a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe grant to assist with both immediate and long-term needs. Local Lions sprang into action, offering food, blankets, medical supplies and clean water to the victims. This time of year is for all of us, Lions to review and CELEBRATE what we have accomplished

during the first six months of our Lion year. The good news is that even though the first half of our Lions year is gone, we still have 6 months to refocus our energy to improve our club membership.

The PRIORITY of the 2016-2017 District GMT Plan is to implement the District Governor's Membership goals and action plan: 1. **To implement one new Club**-!st VDG Lion Donna Ober is making strides with the Town of Colton. **Thank you**, First VDG Lion Donna. 2. The second priority is to **increase our retention rate**. We are requesting that **each club officer and member focus on retention of all current club members**.

I just finished reviewing the membership statistics for the end of December and year to date, we have **dropped 34 members**. The bad news for our retention goal is that in addition to five deceased Lions, ten clubs have dropped twenty-nine members including one entire club-the Town of Lyme with eight members. This community no longer is being **served** by Lions. The good news is that we added twenty-eight new members but are still left with a deficit of a -11 for the year. I have shared several strategies with you to prevent your members from dropping out of your club. **YOU** are the only ones who can implement these strategies. ## **Around District 20-W**

### From Clifton Fine Lions Club



The picture above shows Clifton Fine Lions Chuck Yartz and Jeremy Thompson demonstrating their new vision screener, purchased from Welch-Allyn, for their centennial legacy project. They were able to purchase the screener mostly due to a grant awarded by a local endowment fund but also from donations from every Lion in the club and help from local businesses and other service organizations. It truly was a community effort! The eye screener will be used as a preventative measure for area children, but will also be available to loan to nearby clubs.

# **Melvin Jones Biography**

Melvin Jones was born on January 13, 1879 in Fort Thomas, Arizona, the son of a United States Army captain who commanded a troop of scouts. Later, his father was transferred and the family moved east. As a young man, Melvin Jones made his home in Chicago, Illinois, became associated with an insurance firm and in 1913 formed his own agency.

He soon joined the Business Circle, a businessmen's luncheon group, and was shortly elected secretary. This group was one of many at that time devoted solely to promoting the financial interests of their membership. Because of their limited appeal, they were destined to disappear. Melvin Jones, then a 38-year-old Chicago business leader, had other plans.

"What if these men," Melvin Jones asked, "who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities?" Thus, at his invitation, delegates from men's clubs met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organization and on June 7, 1917, Lions Clubs International was born.

Melvin Jones eventually abandoned his insurance agency to devote himself full time to Lions at International Headquarters in Chicago. It was under his dynamic leadership that Lions clubs earned the prestige necessary to attract civic-minded members.

The association's founder was also recognized as a leader by those outside the association. One of his greatest honors was in 1945 when he represented Lions Clubs International as a consultant in San Francisco, California, at the organization of the United Nations.

Melvin Jones, the man whose personal code – "You can't get very far until you start doing something for somebody else" – became a guiding principle for public-spirited people the world over, died June 1, 1961 at 82 years of age.
