

## Saratoga Springs Lions Club Centennial Activities

## **LEGACY PROJECT LEVEL 3 - COMMUNITY IMPACT**

## Saratoga Springs Lions Vision Center

The Saratoga Springs Lions club, in collaboration with Saratoga Hospital, the Lions Eye Institute at Albany, and Dr. Peter Martin, a retired ophthalmologist from Hoosick Falls, New York, who donated the exam equipment to the health center, established the "Saratoga Springs Lions Vision Center" in the hospitals Community Health Center in March 2016. The new diabetic eye exam program provides access to a vital vision diagnostic tool for patients of all ages in the Saratoga community and the surrounding region, regardless of income.

The Lions Club facilitated the equipment donation, had

the exam equipment installed and calibrated, donated additional funding for other required equipment in the new ophthalmology exam room at the health center, and facilitated the negotiation of the Professional Licensing Agreement between Saratoga Hospital and Albany Medical Center, which is affiliated with the Ophthalmology Residency Program at the Lions Eye Institute. Patients are seen by an ophthalmology resident from the Lions Eye Institute at Albany. Residents rotate into the program and are supervised during exams by a practicing ophthalmologist.

The diabetic screening program is the first step in providing additional vision programs at the health center. The Lions Club is currently working with the Northeast Association for the Blind to bring low-cost vision exams and pre-school vision screening to the center. Ongoing plans are also underway to expand the Vision Center to also include Hearing Services.

## **Camp Abilities Saratoga**

Camp Abilities Saratoga is a service project of the Saratoga Springs Lions Club.

The primary objective of the camp is to empower children and teens that are blind, visually impaired or deaf blind to be physically active by way of a series of sports activities that have been professionally adapted to their abilities. The second objective of the camp is to provide "real life" hands-on experience for undergraduate and graduate students pursuing the field of physical education, as well as active teaching professionals from the field of adaptive sports. This improves their knowledge, experience and confidence in developing and teaching sports, recreational and social activities for children with sensory impairments. The third objective of the program is to demonstrate to parents and families of campers the child's potential ability to function independently while also providing their child with an inclusionary summer camp experience with other children.

Modeled after Camp Abilities Brockport, the Saratoga camp is the only camp in the world run exclusively by Lions. The past three years has seen a steady increase in support from the Lions Clubs of District 20Y2 with approximately 16 clubs providing volunteer and/or financial support. The clubs 2016 camp, its third, was held from the week of August 7-13, 2016, coinciding with LCI's Worldwide Week of Service for Youth from August 8-14, 2016. The 2017 camp is scheduled for August 6-12, 2017.

Saratoga Stars brings together physically and mentally challenged children & teens, youth volunteers and members of The Saratoga Springs Lions Club in an inspirational program that helps physically challenged kids learn to ice skate. The highly successful program will begin its 18th year in January 2017. The program runs from January through March with the children and volunteer skaters taking to the ice 60 minutes one time per week. The program culminates with a choreographed ice show where children and their volunteers skate together. The program uses equipment specially designed for the safety of the skaters by Gliding Stars Inc., Buffalo, New York.

## Lions Eye Institute at Albany, NY

Since 1990 the approximately 5,000 Lions representing 160 Lions clubs from Districts 20-O, 20-Y2 and 20-W have worked together to establish an unmatched regional resource of excellence for people with sight problems. The Lions Eye Institute is committed to aiding and supporting those patients with serious eye problems or acute eye disease. The LEI also supports the research and educational programs of the Albany Medical Center Ophthalmology Residency Program. The program is rated one of the top ten in the country.

Since its inception, the LEI has been supported by volunteers from the Saratoga Springs Lions Club. The founding Secretary in 1990 and a future president, was a member of the Saratoga Springs club. Currently three Saratoga Springs club members serve on the LEI board and the Saratoga Springs Lions are one of only two clubs to have a member serve the LEI as President.

## **LEGACY PROJECT LEVEL 1 - COMMUNITY VISIBILITY**

The club will be donating two park benches to the downtown region of Saratoga Springs. LCI Centennial Plaques will be added to both benches, and centennial plaques will also be added to benches donated years ago to the Eastside and Westside recreational fields.

The club will be hosting a special dinner honoring the Saratoga Springs Police Department. Additionally, a special plaque will be dedicated in a prominent downtown location pledging the clubs ongoing support of the city's police department.

Coinciding with the LCI Centennial, the club will adorn up to 40 city street poles for the month of June 2017 with banners that recognize the clubs many service projects. The two prominent buildings on the city's major intersection, City Hall and the Adirondack Trust Company, will change their outside

lighting at night to purple & gold.

The club is working with the Saratoga Elks Club, the sponsors of the city's annual Flag Day parade, to recognize the Lions as the lead organization in the parade on Saturday June 10, 2017. As many as 30 - 35 clubs may be represented in the parade.

The clubs "Honor a Vet" program will be held for the second year in conjunction with Memorial Day 2017. The club provides the public with the opportunity to sponsor and honor a veteran with a small donation, which is used to cover the cost of small American Flags. The flags and an attached card that recognizes the honored veteran are then set up for display by Lions volunteers in a prominent city location.

The club refurbished and moved two large Lion statues to the steps of City Hall years ago. We will seek to add Centennial Plaques to the base of the statues. Additionally, the club continues to receive visibility from the donation of scoreboards to the Eastside Rec Field and Weibel Ice Rink respectively.

## LCI CENTENNIAL SERVICE CHALLENGE

## Youth

In addition to the aforementioned Camp Abilities Saratoga and Saratoga Stars programs, the club also focuses on youth through its support of the Saratoga Leos Club. The Leos club annually boasts up to 50 members.

The club offers financial support to youth sports teams and clubs and annually recognizes graduating HS Seniors with scholarships.

### Vision

The club supports an active Sight Program that provides financial vouchers for exams and eye glasses for patients in need through the LCI approved affiliation with Lens Crafters.

The club held an eyeglass sort on November 30, 2016. Thousands of pairs of eyeglasses were sorted and packaged for delivery to the Lions Regional Sorting facility in West Trenton, New Jersey. From NJ the eyeglasses will go to those people in need in foreign countries.

### Hunger

The club made a \$15,250 contribution to the Franklin Community Center as part of their Capital Fund Drive. The donation helped to support the Centers building addition and addition of freezers and refrigerators. These improvements led to the Center becoming eligible to joining the Regional Food Bank, which annually supports pantries efforts in hundreds of local communities.



The club will be sponsoring a community food drive on Saturday January 14, 2017 in collaboration with major supermarkets in the region. The program, titled "Because Hunger Doesn't End With the Holiday's", will benefit six food pantries in the region. Lion's volunteers will accept donated items throughout the day at four different supermarket locations. The 2016 food drive resulted in approximately 2,000 pounds of donated food being donated to the pantries on the same day that it was collected.

### **Environment**

The club will be sponsoring a clean-up of the city's Railway hiking, walking and biking trails on Saturday April 29, 2017. Lion's volunteers will partner for the day with members of the Saratoga Leos club.

## REDISTRICTING PROPOSALS

District 20Y2 Lions Club Members,

On January 28, 2017 at 9:30am in Johnstown, NY at the Holiday Inn Johnstown/Gloversville, we will convene a Special District Convention for the purpose of voting on two (2) potential redistricting plans, voting on Constitution and By-Laws updates and to formally nominate our next DG, 1VDG and 2VDG.

Since redistricting involves other districts and we have no idea what they will decide, we have decided to vote on 2 potential plans so we do not have to repeat this process. The plans are both outlined below along with the maps showing each plan. After this redistricting vote, we would formally present our joint plan to the sitting council and have them vote to put this item on the ballot in Lake Placid. If we get the plan on the ballot then every delegate in the Multiple District will vote to determine if we can send the plan on to LCI for their approval.


The 2 potential plans are as follows:

## **PROPOSAL #1**

District Y2 and District W merge and become one district "W". This district would include all of W and then would extend to include all of Y2 which includes the Albany and Utica areas.

This plan would make 68 clubs with approximately 1823 members.

The map is included for your reference.



## **PROPOSAL #2**

District Y1 (Syracuse – Binghamton) would absorb Jefferson and Lewis counties and become District "Y". The rest of District W would merge with District Y2 and become the new "W". This plan would make 55 clubs in "Y" with approximately 1384 members and 57 clubs in "W" with 1576 members. The map is included for your reference.



We will be asking for a YES or NO vote on each of these plans separately.







## **Pocketalker**

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and T.V. listening.

## Infrared T.V. Listening System

Wireless, infrared amplification system.

## Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

## Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

## CapTel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability.

## **Amplified Telephone Ringers**

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency and pitch tone.

## Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using telephone with hearing aid.

## **Digital Alarm Clock**

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

## Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

## Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alertmaster. The person wears it to alert to sounds while awake.


