




At the NYS & Bermuda Lions Convention we had one of the

We have made preparations to award a five (5) financial awards to graduating seniors the early part of June. They will go to three at our own school district (Clinton Central) and one each at neighboring school districts Westmoreland Central and Waterville Central. This represents the most number of awards we have ever awarded. We're hoping the recipients will remember the Lions and perhaps become one of us in the future!

Three of our members represented the club at the annual Kiwanis Prayer Breakfast in our community. Held at the Martin Luther Nursing Community Room in the Town of Kirkland, it was attended by more than 50 community leaders from such organizations as the Chamber of Commerce, Lutheran Ministries, the Ride for Missing & Exploited Children, Kiwanis International and the Kirkland Country Pantry. Our Lion President, Bill O'Mara briefly summarized our club's history and activities in which we're involved. A recent graduate of SUNY POLY in Marcy, NY was the keynote speaker. He was a refugee who had spent seventeen years of his life in refugee camps. Upon his immigrating to the United States, he embarked upon a career in healthcare due to his experiences in the refugee camps. He obtained a Bachelor's degree in nursing and continued studying to become a Physician's Assistant. His recent degree is in that field and he is currently interviewing for a position in the area. His story was most inspiring!

We continue our monthly assisting at the local Pantry with food distribution, collecting eyeglasses and hearing aids from previously established drop-off points in local businesses, collecting merchandise for our upcoming Garage Sale the first week end in August and have begun to distribute our annual donations to local charities and humanitarian services, such as the Country pantry, American Cancer Society and District 20-Y2 Hearing Conservation Society.

In recognition of the 25th Anniversary of FREEDOM **GUIDE DOGS**, we increased our annual donation to \$400. For those unfamiliar with this organization, it is a 501-c3 business located in nearby Cassville, NY founded and owned by Eric & Sharon Loori. They have dedicated their lives to breeding, raising, Hometown trainingTM and placement of guide dogs to the blind and visually impaired. In recognition of their quarter century of service to the blind & visually impaired community, the Clinton Lions would like to ask all clubs in the District to consider a donation to this unique form of guide dog training and placement!

Their service minimizes the need for emergency room and on-call visits, as well as trips (and copays) to your regular doctor for minor ailments. For groups of 100 or more, it's only \$4/month.

Our next drive is May 22 at the EG Library. We shipped another 2500 glasses to recycling center in NJ, for a total of 10,000 so far this year.





Lions Eye Institute at Albany, New York, Inc. Patient Referral Policy

Consultants' Management Services LLC (Physicians), Albany Medical Center and other Lions Eye Institute (LEI) approved medical facilities will accept patient referrals from Lions Clubs.

- Lions may identify qualified individuals who appear to require subspecialty ophthalmologic services, who do not have private and/or governmental health insurance or the financial means to pay for such services, and who in the absence of assistance from the Lions are not likely to receive the needed ophthalmologic care.
- Only the Club President and/or Secretary may make referrals. Referral is limited to these two individuals so that the club leaders will know who has been referred and can evaluate the appropriateness of the referral and monitor the progress of the referral.
- 3. Referrals must be made in writing. All forms must be <u>completely filled out and signed</u>. Patients must sign the HIPAA-compliant consent form allowing the exchange of medical information between the patient, Lions and LEI Physicians.

- 4. Referrals are limited to emergency, diagnostic, therapeutic and/or surgical care. Routine eye care is more appropriately handled by local eye care providers and shall not be referred to the Lions Eye Institute.
- 5. To qualify as a referred patient, the individual, agent, guardian or Lions Club must make reasonable attempts to obtain private, charitable, or governmental health insurance such as Medicare, Medicaid, Fidelis, etc. It is the responsibility of the Lions Club to make sure this has been done. Any financial assistance provided by the Lions Eye Institute shall be limited to a maximum total of \$4,500 per patient. Applicants who may require surgery and/or hospitalization must also apply to Albany Medical Center for financial aid by contacting AMC's Patient Financial Services department at 518-262-1981 or 1-866-262-7476.
- Requests for information concerning a referred patient may be received. For ethical, legal and confidentially (HIPAA) reasons, information will not be released to a third party unless there is a signed release from the patient.

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of the District 20Y2 Lions Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request.)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and T.V. listening.

Infrared T.V. Listening System

Wireless, infrared amplification system.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

CapTel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency and pitch tone.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using telephone with hearing aid.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alertmaster. The person wears it to alert to sounds while awake.


