

## **EDUCATION AND KNOWLEDGE!!!**

Our Fall Conference on Saturday November 18th will take place at the Saratoga Springs Holiday Inn beginning at noon. Our focus will be on increasing our personal knowledge with respect to pre-Diabetes, Diabetes and Children's Vision by offering some outstanding educational opportunities! This full day of activity will focus on educating our clubs and leaders so that we can do an even better job of serving our respective communities.



Charles Macfarlane, the CEO of the American Association of Diabetes Educators, will travel to Saratoga from Chicago for his presentation. His session will cover the basics of this chronic disease and help set you on a path to successful self-management by understanding the risks, dispelling the myths and capitalizing on the facts of pre-diabetes and diabetes.

It's critical that we screen children's eyes at an early age to detect any vision issues. Dr. Lion Ed Cordes, a past Lions International Director and the LCI Global KidsSight Chairman, will make a presentation that focuses on the Lions SEE (Screen Eyes Early) program and goals.

International Director Patricia Vannett, fresh off of an International Director's meeting in India, will address the Diabetes Epidemic from an International standpoint.

The Fall Convention will follow the Saratoga Springs Lions Club Strides Educational Activity Fair & Walk that morning at the Dance Museum in Saratoga Springs. The Diabetes Educational Activity Fair features a partnership of local medical professionals, fitness coaches, restaurant owners, and food suppliers. The focus will be on pre-Diabetes and Diabetes resources and education. The Diabetes Fact Finding walk is an optional activity which builds on the education theme by grouping walkers with local medical professionals, fitness coaches, and nutritionists who will answer questions and offer suggestions. In addition, the route will feature displays of diabetes related facts.

Please plan to join us in Saratoga Springs on November 18th for the full day. You don't want to miss out on this great educational opportunity!

## CARVI

For years the white cane has been a symbol of independence and ease of travel for children and adults with visual impairments. It helps people with low or no vision navigate the world around efficiently, and alerts other travelers that the carrier is visually impaired. But on October 28, 2017, the white cane became a tool in a fun yet challenging competition – CABVI Cane Quest. The event was held at 10 am in the greater Utica area. This was for blind participants in grades 2-7 to come and compete.

Created by Braille Institute of America, Inc. as part of its expanding National Program offerings, Cane Quest is a national competition that tests the ability of blind and visually impaired youngsters to navigate the world around them independently. The Quest tested participant's independent travel skills by having them follow a secret route through residential and business neighborhoods via auditory instructions.

"The purpose of this event is to shine a light on the importance of building successful white cane navigation skills in children with visual impairments," said Braille Institute Assistant Vice President of National Programs, Nancy Niebrugge. "When these kids are out in the real world they are going to have to be able to navigate from their home, to the bus stop, to work, or to find their way to classes on a college campus. The skills they're building in this competition will ensure that they're prepared to face the sighted world with confidence."

CABVI Cane Quest seeks to motivate students to master their mobility skills, while also educating the sighted public about the abilities of blind youth to travel independently. The participants were awarded special prizes at an awards ceremony at the end of the competition.

"Cane quest is an amazing experience," began Megan Marshall, CABVI Orientation and Mobility Instructor. "To be able to challenge one's own orientation and mobility skills, socialize with others who have vision impairments, and have fun while doing it is a tremendous opportunity! Our theme for this year is a Spooky-Fall Carnival. With our event so close to Halloween, we are encouraging kids and their families to come dressed up in costume and ready for our 12 skill obstacle course! Obstacles include physical, mental, and team work challenges which upon completion you can earn carnival coins that can be used to win exciting prizes! Mobility can be fun, and we are here to help prove that. We look forward to seeing everybody!"

Dark Dining, presented by NBT Bank, will be held on Saturday, November 11 at the Double Tree by Hilton at The Hotel Utica. Now in the 11th year, Dark Dining has brought awareness to the community about visual impairments, experiencing an evening through senses other than sight, and helps support CABVI's mission.

This year's esteemed event will feature the Focus on the Future initiative and highlight an exciting announcement. "Our Focus on the Future Initiative will result in expanded vision care for Central New York, innovative physical and occupational therapies that are geared to the specific needs of people with vision loss, and new employment opportunities in Utica and Syracuse for people who are blind," said Rudy D'Amico, CABVI President and CEO.

"Guests will experience food, drink and conversation, as never before – without sight," explained Joannie Grande of Mac-Clark Restaurants and Dark Dining Event Chair. "Blindfolds or simulators are used that replicate different visual impairments: Glaucoma, Cataracts, Macular Degeneration, Diabetic Retinopathy or Retinitis Pigmentosa."

Dark Dining, presented by NBT Bank, allows you to expand your imagination and understanding of what individuals who are blind experience throughout their lives. "Maybe it's yourself, a loved one, a child of a close friend, vision loss can touch us all," began Kathy Beaver, CABVI's Vice President of Rehabilitation. "It is so important to help educate our communities on how vision loss can be managed through new and innovative health and wellness programs we are bringing to the individuals we support."

Nearly 300 guests attended the 2016 Dark Dining event helping to raise more than \$150,000 for vision rehabilitation therapy programs at CABVI.

Advancing Tobacco Free Communities (ATFC) is a network of statewide contractors funded by the New York State Department of Health Tobacco Control Program working to change the community environment and create a healthier New York by supporting New York's tobaccofree norm through community engagement and youth action..

The U.S. Surgeon General considers smoking a pediatric

epidemic. The average age that kids start smoking is 13. The tobacco industry's marketing to youths to become replacement smokers is a major factor in teen smoking. In New York State the tobacco industry spends 1.5 million dollars a day on marketing that uses imagery and brand identification as media strategies to glamorize tobacco products.

The Center for Disease Control believes that marketing is a key influence on teen smoking. Tobacco companies place

most of their advertising in convenience stores where most teens are likely to shop.

While there is no state law regulating tobacco use in outdoor areas, local communities are free to enact their own. Since 2010 tobacco-free initiatives were adopted by the villages, towns and organizations in Delaware, Otsego and Schoharie Counties.

This past year the villages of Schoharie and Middleburgh each adopted tobacco-free policies in their parks, pool and recreation areas. The Central Bridge Civic Association adopted a tobacco-free policy at the Central Bridge Community Park and Morgan Crapser Village Green. The Cobleskill, Middleburgh and Schoharie Little Leagues and the libraries in Cobleskill, Schoharie and Middleburgh also adopted tobacco-free outdoor policies.

Seen by some as an alternative to traditional cigarettes, the use of electronic cigarette, also known as e-vapor, has doubled in the past two years and their dangers as a nicotine delivery system have become a topic of concern. The Food and Drug Administration classifies e-vapor products as tobacco products because they contain nicotine derived from tobacco. In 2016, the FDA banned the sale of e-cigarettes to minors. In July, Governor Cuomo signed legislation that banned the use of e-cigarettes on all public and private school grounds in New York State.

Legislation adding electronic cigarettes to the Clean Indoor Air Act was signed into law by Governor Andrew Cuomo in October 2017. It bans the use of e-cigarettes and vaping everywhere that smoking tobacco products are prohibited indoors.





## Lions Eye Institute at Albany, New York, Inc. Patient Referral Policy

Consultants' Management Services LLC (Physicians), Albany Medical Center and other Lions Eye Institute (LEI) approved medical facilities will accept patient referrals from Lions Clubs.

- Lions may identify qualified individuals who appear to require subspecialty ophthalmologic services, who do not have private and/or governmental health insurance or the financial means to pay for such services, and who in the absence of assistance from the Lions are not likely to receive the needed ophthalmologic care.
- 2. Only the Club President and/or Secretary may make referrals. Referral is limited to these two individuals so that the club leaders will know who has been referred and can evaluate the appropriateness of the referral and monitor the progress of the referral.
- 3. Referrals must be made in writing. All forms must be <u>completely filled out and signed</u>. Patients must sign the HIPAA-compliant consent form allowing the exchange of medical information between the patient, Lions and LEI Physicians.

- 4. Referrals are limited to emergency, diagnostic, therapeutic and/or surgical care. Routine eye care is more appropriately handled by local eye care providers and shall not be referred to the Lions Eye Institute.
- 5. To qualify as a referred patient, the individual, agent, guardian or Lions Club must make reasonable attempts to obtain private, charitable, or governmental health insurance such as Medicare, Medicaid, Fidelis, etc. It is the responsibility of the Lions Club to make sure this has been done. Any financial assistance provided by the Lions Eye Institute shall be limited to a maximum total of \$4,500 per patient. Applicants who may require surgery and/or hospitalization must also apply to Albany Medical Center for financial aid by contacting AMC's Patient Financial Services department at 518-262-1981 or 1-866-262-7476.
- Requests for information concerning a referred patient may be received. For ethical, legal and confidentially (HIPAA) reasons, information will not be released to a third party unless there is a signed release from the patient.

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of the District 20Y2 Lions Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request.)

## **Pocketalker**

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and T.V. listening.

## **Infrared T.V. Listening System**

Wireless, infrared amplification system.

## **Personal FM System**

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

## **Amplified Telephone**

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

## CapTel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability.

## **Amplified Telephone Ringers**

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency and pitch tone.

## Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using telephone with hearing aid.

## **Digital Alarm Clock**

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

## **Alert Master**

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

## **Personal Body Pager**

Pager works with the Alertmaster. The person wears it to alert to sounds while awake.
