Last year, on a worldwide basis, only 65% of Clubs were reporting their activities – let 20-W be the District that has the highest participation rate. Also, if your Club has a newsletter, please email or mail a copy to me. I enjoy reading them and learning about your Club and your service activities.

This year our cabinet meetings will have less report reading and be more of an educational program. Our first cabinet meeting will be in Tupper Lake on Saturday, September 29th.

All Club Presidents and Secretaries are active members of the District Governor's Advisory Committee of the zone where your club is located. The Zone Advisory Committee meets quarterly. Please send your club's plans for membership, programs, service and fundraising projects to your Zone Chairs. Their contact information is listed in every newsletter. The Zone Chair reports are due to Cabinet Secretary Rita Ware by September 17th so that they can be distributed prior to the cabinet meeting.

The 2018-19 District Directory will be distributed at the cabinet meeting. After the business portion of our meeting we will focus on "How Can the GAT Team Help Your Club To Succeed" and PDG James Griffith will speak about Gen Z and how potential young new Lions and will affect our Clubs makeup, our meetings, etc. There will also be a presentation on 20-W's Hearing Conservation Society. We will end our meeting with an open discussion where Lions can share their best practices for recruiting new members and service projects.

We can learn so much from each other and this is a great time for fellowship and sharing the best of what we do - We Serve. These meetings are open to all Lions and I encourage you to attend.

I also would like to report that we had our first council meeting in August in Corning, New York. The Council meeting is an opportunity for all the District Governors in New York, acting as the Board of Directors for the Lions of NY State and Bermuda, to meet and discuss issues affecting all our members and share ideas. We realize many issues are not unique to just our own District. It is an opportunity to brainstorm ideas, work together collaboratively, and come up with solutions that strengthen our District and Multiple District 20.

On Saturday, November 3rd we'll host our Fall Convention at the Holiday Inn in Saratoga Springs. We will be hosting educational sessions at the Convention centering Service and specifically on Diabetes Education and Awareness. More information regarding hotel reservations, etc. will be forthcoming.

As you know my theme this year is "Move Forward, Treasure the Past and Welcome the Future" as we reach "Beyond the Horizon". As Lions Clubs International President (IP) Gudrun Yngvadottir has stated, "We need to channel the current, pursuing a new course is never easy. Achieving the service that lives beyond the horizon will require Lions to reach within their clubs, communities and selves. This means developing new resources, renewed motivation and a clearly defined strategy. Your Club President will be receiving a survey that I am asking you to complete as a Club by the end of October to develop a strategic plan for 20-W that will assist us to move "Beyond the Horizon."

My schedule for September includes the following visitations: September 4th the Norfolk Club and the Potsdam Club, September 6th the Northville Sacandaga Club and September 26th the Newcomb Club. I am excited to be attending the 2018 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum with several Lions from 20-W. We will be sharing what we learn with you in the near future.

As always, my team and I cannot do this alone and neither can any president in your clubs. We truly all make this great humanitarian service organization work together: serving people and serving each other. So, please know, my door is always open to everyone for suggestions and new ways to approach things. Because I want to know what's happening with each club, I plan to be communicating with club presidents and secretaries, region chairs, zone chairs, committee chairs and PDGs regularly via email.
