A special thank you to our Cabinet, and our main presentations by our GAT Team PDG Lion Ed Stano Jr. (Membership), PCC Lion Mark Whitney (Leadership) and IPDG Lion John McDonald (Service) on "How Your Global Action Team Can Help Your Club Succeed," VCC Lion James Griffith on "Digital Native to Gen Z Digital Influencers", 2VDG Lion Rick Brisee (Hearing Society Chair), on the NYS Hearing Conservation Society and PDG Paula Flisnik (LCIF Coordinator) on Campaign 100: LCIF Empowering Service. The most ambitious fundraising effort in LCIF's history, Campaign 100 will span three years and seek to raise US\$300 million by June 30, 2021. Campaign 100 will empower Lions to serve 200+ million people a year by: Increasing service impact, Fighting diabetes, and Expanding global causes.

Both will be sent to LCI for final approval. Another highlight was approving the LCIF Grant – for Ogdensburg Lions Club for Claxton-Hepburn Diabetes Program.





Greetings to all Lions in our new District W! My name is John Sutton and I am the Diabetes Chair for the district as well as the chair for the Galway club's "Rosie's Walk for Diabetes" – an event which we have been holding for 19 years. For the last two years it has been a "Strides" event which is the moniker that LCI has established for our efforts to raise Diabetes awareness and knowledge.

Over the course of the last five years as chair or co-chair of Rosies, I have been very frustrated by not being able to formulate a strategy to make a real difference in the suffering folks in our community suffer because of both Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes as well as helping people turn their "pre-diabetes" around. I have arrived at some goals which are set forth below and which provide a start for the work of an actual district committee.

I am seeking volunteers to be on the "Diabetes Committee". The committee's work will be primarily done electronically and your only obligation will be to regularly monitor our communications and ideas and report what your club is up do regarding diabetes. I will also call upon committee members to help with refining, implementing and expanding the following proposed district diabetes goals:

1. A regular forum for district wide electronic communication and discussion as to diabetes

awareness, issues and club/district specific programs;

- 2. A review and information gathering as to the availability of medical treatment in District W when considering that the provision of rural medical services is becoming more challenging with the passage of time. Can Lions help to get even better medical care for our district?
- 3. A focus on the possible institution of efforts by local clubs to provide glucose monitoring events and the role of the New York State Department of Health in the regulations which relate to the monitoring.
- 4. A commitment to regularly stress the following individual goals which everyone should have:
 - know your diabetes numbers by getting your blood tested whenever your doctor says its time.
 - Take one of the "pre-diabetes" written tests to see if you are at risk if so, make sure your doctor checks your blood numbers.
 - Get more exercise;
 - Watch your weight;
 - Know what foods are diabetes friendly and which are not.

DIABETES FACT – Type 1 diabetes which was previously and/or also known as juvenile diabetes is when the immune system attacks the diabetes producing cells of the pancreas so that the pancreas is not able to make any or enough insulin. Type 2 diabetes is when your body does not use insulin properly and the pancreas eventually can't make enough insulin to regulate your glucose level. Type 2 diabetes is highly related to your weight, exercise and diet and is the type of diabetes "pre-diabetes" is associated with.

SUGGESTION – Target 5% of your body weight as a weight loss goal – that's just 10 to 15 pounds for those of us between 200 and 300 pounds. Lose that much and you will already be making a big difference in your diabetes risk. When you stabilize at your new weight for a while, you can think about one more 5% diet (with less pounds as a goal!!)

We've been busy the last couple months... In addition to continuing to collect used eyeglasses and hearing aids from drop-off points at businesses in our area and volunteering on Distribution Day at our local Country Pantry each month, we have been very involved in some unique community events.

On Saturday, August 25 our club was one of the sponsors of our local Chamber of Commerce's Arts & Music Festival held on our Village Green and surrounding venues. During this afternoon of activity, creative members from our area display their crafts and musical groups perform for short periods of time at various venues on the Village Green and surrounding vicinity. For our sponsorship, the Lions logo, Club name and website address appeared on shopping bags distributed to all in attendance.

The first week end in August we held our sixth annual Garage

Sale. Each year it seems to be getting larger involving more and more work and volunteer hours. The reward... it was our most successful to date.



During the sale - for three days - seventeen club members were joined by their family members and friends expending close to 400 man-hours selling donated merchandise. A small nucleus of club members have been collecting and temporarily storing the donated merchandise in garages and other indoor facilities around the community since the beginning of May. Fortunately, we once again had the use of the Town of Kirkland Ice Hockey Arena for the month of July. (Without its use, we wouldn't be able to conduct this event!) After assembling borrowed tables (114 in all) from other community organizations, items were sorted by category, displayed for presentation to customers, cleaned and priced in preparation for the sale.

On Sunday August 5, club members and friends met for the last time at the arena. In a matter of approximately four hours we disassembled and returned the borrowed tables, donated worthwhile unsold items to specific area charitable organizations, transported other unsold odds and ends to our local transfer station for disposal (couldn't have done this without the pickup trucks & SUVs of our members!) and returned the arena to the state in which it was before we "moved in at the beginning of July".

This event continues to increase/publicize our visibility in the community and area. Through the interaction with the public, we discuss the various activities of our club and Lions Clubs International. The club's service activities are outlined on an A-frame sign greeting customers and on brochures we distribute upon entry. Because of this year's efforts, we were fortunate to meet three individuals who expressed interest in our mission and our club. They were invited to our first September meeting and one will be inducted into our club shortly.

Our community has been named the Kraft Hockeyville USA for 2018! In addition to being awarded \$150,000 from Kraft Food Products and the NHL for improvements to the arena, we also hosted an NHL pre-season hockey game between the Buffalo Sabres and the Columbus Blue Jackets on September 25. Therefore, to prepare for this event that was televised



nationally on NBC Sports Network, we had to have the arena cleaned out the day after the sale ended. This allowed NHL facilities and NBC Sports personnel to begin preparation on Monday, August 6.



The Kraft Hockeyville Community Celebration and experience began on Saturday, September 22 with a pancake breakfast to benefit our local Food Pantry and a community party on the Village Green. Some of our members served as waiters and servers at the breakfast and

we donated a "scratch-off" Lottery Ticket for their Chinese Auction. The pantry realized better than \$4,000 with most of the food supplied by Kraft.

That afternoon we participated in the celebration on the green along with other community organizations. Five members distributed popcorn to the approximate 3,000 people in attendance. We also got the opportunity to meet many of the mascots of the various products produced by Kraft Foods.

The next day, the NHL Stanley Cup paid a visit to the Clinton Arena. It was on display for four hours and many visitors to the arena were rewarded by obtaining pictures with this oldest recognizable championship trophy in professional sports. The NBC Sports Broadcast Van also pulled into the Arena parking lot and began to

setup their facilities. All this in little Clinton, NY!

The day of the "big game", the NHL players spent time acclimating themselves to the ice, visiting with school children and skating with youth hockey participants. That night the game began at 7:00 PM, bringing back memories to many fans of the glory days of the Clinton Comets of the old Eastern Hockey League (EHL) forty-some years ago. A fireworks display ended the evening as many smiling fans left the arena. Our club gratefully contributed toward the expense of the fireworks as the Kraft Hockeyville Celebration came to an end. Incidentally, Columbus won the game 4 - 2.

This Saturday, September 29, 2018 we will be participating in the International Rise Against Hunger meal packaging effort our community has undertaken. We will assist in packaging highly nutritious dehydrated meals of rice, soy, vegetables and 23 essential vitamins and minerals. We have contributed \$1,000 toward procurement of these supplies and the community goal is to package 40,000 meals in five hours.

MyLion

What is MyLion?

MyLion is Lion's Clubs International's new digital service platform for all Lions and Leos. MyLion is available in two formats:

- The NyLion app is a mobile phone application that you can download on your smart phone. It was
 gradually released starting in 2017 and is available everywhere outside of the European Union.
- MyLion on the web is the next major MyLion application and is a website that you will be able to access on any device with a web browser. MyLion on the web will be gradually released over the next few quarters.

When will I have access to MyLion on the web?

Over the next few quarters, Lions Clubs International will work with our Global Action Team leaders to gradually release MyLion on the web to ensure there is adequate time for testing and training.

Why are we gradually releasing MyLion on the web?

By gradually releasing MyLion on the web we can:

- Focus on one region at a time and provide advanced notice and support to MyLion users.
- Collect and methodically apply feedback.
- Ensure that every member has adequate time to learn the MyLion system before transitioning service activity reporting from MyLCI to MyLion.

Where should I report my club's service activities right now?

You should continue to report your service activities on MyLCI or your local reporting system until your region received MyLion on the web. We will communicate well in advance when MyLion on the web is available for you to test in your region.

Where can I learn more about the MyLion app and eventually MyLion on the web?

Our website <u>www.mylion.org</u> has tools, training resources, blog posts, and more related to the MyLion app. We will update it with content related to MyLion on the web as we begin to release the platform. <u>www.mylion.org</u> is your main, easy to navigate resource for all things MyLion.

When will the MyLion mobile phone app be released in the European Union?

We are working diligently with our partners in the EU to meet the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). We will release the MyLion mobile phone app to European Union countries when we feel confident that the MyLion mobile phone app meets these requirements.

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one Communication and TV listening.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group sutuation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and **p**itch tone.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using Telephone with hearing aid.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
