Thank you to everyone who participated in our fall conference on Saturday November 3rd at the Saratoga Springs Holiday Inn Hotel. The event was highlighted by an inspirational keynote address on "Purple Leadership" made by our special guest and Immediate Past International Director Lion Rodney "Rod" Wright. We want to thank PID Rod, his Partner in Service PDG Paula Beach, PID Bob Libin and Lion Michelle Libin for everything they did to motivate us and make our Convention educational, full of fellowship, good cheer and a really great time.

District 20-W GST IPDG John McDonald served as our Convention Chair



and did a marvelous job with the program. Special thanks to IPDG John and all the Lions who dedicated their time to make this convention such a success.

The sessions were full of useful information that will be brought back to our Clubs by the 66 Lions in attendance. You can also review them on our 20-W Facebook page. This year we live streamed the video of our presentations so that you could participate online if you could not attend in person. The first presentation was by Lisa Hodgson, RD, CDN, CDE; American Association of Diabetes Educators, National Board member and Member Affiliates Liaison; Clinical Nutrition Manager at Saratoga Hospital and Judy Carr, MS, RD, CDE, CDN; Diabetes Services Quality Coordinator, Saratoga Hospital on the basics of diabetes as a chronic disease and how to set you on a path to successful management.

The next session was on "Dining with Diabetes". It was presented by Diane Whitten, MS Nutrition Educator, and Cornell Cooperative Extension of Saratoga County. This session sited opportunities where you could learn how to plan delicious meals including desserts, understand food labels, and choose healthy meals when eating out.

The last session was presented by Dr. Nicole Lemanski, Ophthalmologist, specializing in cornea and refractive surgery. Dr. Lemanski covered the effects of Diabetes on vision loss and the importance of a comprehensive dilated eye exam at least once a year. Diabetes is the leading cause of the new-onset blindness in many countries and all people with diabetes – both Type 1 and Type 2 –are at risk.

We want to thank these women for their informative sessions, which were helpful to all in attendance and will be shared with all the Lions in 20-W. We would also like to thank the agencies and the people who provided informational tables at the Convention: American Association of Diabetes Educators, Anthem Foundation, Brandel Murphy Lions Youth Foundation, Camp Abilities Saratoga, Cornell University Cooperative Extension - Saratoga and Albany Counties, Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF), Lions Eye Institute at Albany, NY, Lions Hearing Conservation Society of NYS, Northeastern Association of the Blind at Albany (NABA), Dr. Nicole Lemanski, Saratoga Hospital and Script Talk.

At our convention, four outstanding women were recognized as the New Voices for 20-W at the District Convention. The New Voices Initiative celebrates women's contributions to Lions Clubs International as it welcomes its first female International President. This initiative promotes gender parity by focusing on increasing the number of women in Lions Clubs, as well as closing the gap between men and women in leadership positions. District 20-W presented awards to four women that are active in their Clubs and District. They are dedicated Lions and are shining examples to be the New Voices leads in the areas of Membership, Service, Leadership, and to Market the message in recruiting more women into becoming Lions in District 20-W. Our 20-W Representatives are: Lion Michelle Theisen from the Raquette River Club – Membership, Lion Dione Ramsdill from the Saratoga Springs Lions – Service, Lion Katrina Plummer Town of Greenfield – Leadership and Lion Karen Rager the Glens Falls Lions Club – Marketing.

Our Global Action Team: IPDG John McDonald, PDG Ed Stano, PCC Mark Whitney, and PDG Paula Flisnik was recognized with certificates of appreciation from LCI for their commitment to Service, Membership, Leadership and the Lions Clubs International Foundation. PID Rod Wright also gave out two International Presidential Appreciation Awards to Lion Diane Chanowsky from the Lake Placid Club in recognition for her work including the newly formed Communications and Marketing Team, mentoring future leaders at the Regional Lion Leadership Institute, and much more. She is always there to assist and go the extra mile. The second certificate was most gratefully given to Lion Jerry Gordon from the Albany Troy Lions Club. Lion Jerry has sponsored 29 new Lions and has held every club office except treasurer, chaired numerous committees and was club president four times. Pandori of the Galway Lions went to the Patroon Land Farm in Voorheesville. It was in support of The Lions Club International-Anthem volunteer days. We were also joined by many volunteers from BlueCross-BlueShield.

There were three different groups. Pumpkin sorting, onion sorting, and brussel







spent 1 ½ hours cutting, picking, and loading brussel sprouts. We also helped clean out a large greenhouse. We broke apart garlic cloves in anticipation of them getting planted the following week.

We were directed by two very enthusiastic employees - Brandon Murphy and Joe Fox. The Patroon Land Farm is a community supported agriculture (CSA) program. By selling memberships, the public helps to defray operating costs and



get a share of produce. Volunteers are needed year-round. This information is available on the Regional Food Banks website at regionalfoodbank.net.

The farm provides 100,000 pounds [plus] of vegetables to the food bank every year. With only four (full time) employees, they can always use some extra hands. This would make an excellent service project because clubs can provide a service without any expense. All the needed information for volunteering is on the food bank website.

When completing your club service projects we encourage your club secretary or service chair to share and report this information to LCI on the MyLCI site. While you may feel that your club's eye glass sort, diabetes strides program, or youth related project isn't noteworthy enough to be reported, LCI actually views the information shared as being very important! The information shared allows our District officers to view the activity of our clubs, and when necessary, offer any assistance when the club is seeking guidance on serving their community. We have a lot of great ideas of service projects other District clubs have completed that may be replicated in your own community! Why reinvent the wheel?!

Additionally, these numbers have a tremendous cumulative effect when added together on a National or International level. LCI often enters into agreements, or receives grant funding opportunities, from large corporations or Congress. Having the ability to share our positive impact on the communities we serve across the globe goes a long way toward our finalizing these collaborative or partnership opportunities.

This past weekend our District Fall Convention was held in Saratoga Springs where we heard from a number of presenters on the critical topic of Diabetes. We had presenters & exhibitors that represented Saratoga Hospital and AADE (American Association of Diabetes Educators), Cornell Cooperative Extension of Albany and Saratoga Counties, a private Ophthalmologist and representatives from the Diabetes Awareness Coalition of Saratoga County. The presentations offered valuable information on the causes and effects of Diabetes, along with nutrition and diet tips. Additionally, LCI is about to enter into a National agreement with AADE, whereby Lions clubs and AADE Certified Diabetes Educators will work together to serve their own respective communities through Diabetes Awareness and Education. I encourage you to watch this brief video with myself, Lion Barb Bentley and Heather Kovar of News Channel 6. It's a great example of a Diabetes program that the Saratoga Springs Lions club hosted with area certified diabetes educators that you could replicate in your own community!





Sight Society Glasses Recycling

CHANGE OF DROP OFF LOCATION

The Sight Society of Northeastern New York, Inc. (Lions Eye Bank at Albany) has moved to the 6th floor of 4 Tower Place in Albany. The Sight Society has been partnering with the Center for Disabilities for eyeglass recycling for several years. TWO WOMEN LIONS INITIATE A GLOBAL PROJECT AND MEDIA COVERAGE FOR WHITE CANE DAY

March 24, 2018, United Nations Lions Day, saw the establishment of a service partnership between the Central Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired

(CABVI) and the Beacon of Hope Outreach (BOHO). PDG Paula Flisnik. CABVI's Director of Community Relations, and Lady Celestina Ekezie, NYS Barahona Lions Club member and founder and



CEO of BOHO. They met and quickly realized that their conversation that day would be the first of a continuing relationship. When Lion Lady Celestina described the medical and educational services offered by BOHO. PDG Flisnik suggested that CABVI and Lions could donate items to help the Nigerians meet their goals.

Global Project Initiative

In January 2019, approximately 6000 people in rural communities in Nigeria will receive assistance from a free medical and educational mission. Participants will undergo medical exams, receive prescribed medications, and attend public health awareness presentations. Nearly 700 Lions glasses have been donated, and CABVI donated magnification devices, vision screening materials, nitrile examination gloves, and pencils.

The Girls Initiative

The Girls Initiative is a project developed by Edna Chukwurah, MD, and Nwando Ekezie, medical student and daughter of Lion Lady Celestina Ekezie, to serve 500 to 1000 rural preadolescent and adolescent Nigerian girls in underserved communities. They will offer workshops that focus on overall personal hygiene, menstruation and sanitary health, sexual awareness, and abuse prevention. CABVI is supplying linens for this project, along with the Marcy Telephone Lions Club donating shoes. Generously, MS Mattie Baptiste, Nurse, is supporting with sewing sanitary pads and donated \$100 which will educate five Nigerian young women.

Just think...2 for \$20 donation will teach two girls how to make liquid soap and provide books bags filled with toiletries and school supplies.

The Beacon of Hope Outreach's future plans include building a rehabilitation and wellness center in Owerri, the capital of Nigeria. For information or to donate to the Beacon of Hope Outreach, visit its website, www.BeaconOfHopeOutreach.org

- MyLion on the web is the next major MyLion application and is a website that you will be able to
 access on any device with a web browser. MyLion on the web will be gradually released over the next
 few quarters.

When will I have access to MyLion on the web?

Over the next few quarters, Lions Clubs International will work with our Global Action Team leaders to gradually release MyLion on the web to ensure there is adequate time for testing and training.

Why are we gradually releasing MyLion on the web?

By gradually releasing MyLion on the web we can:

- Focus on one region at a time and provide advanced notice and support to MyLion users.
- Collect and methodically apply feedback.
- Ensure that every member has adequate time to learn the MyLion system before transitioning service activity reporting from MyLCI to MyLion.

Where should I report my club's service activities right now?

You should continue to report your service activities on MyLCI or your local reporting system until your region received MyLion on the web. We will communicate well in advance when MyLion on the web is available for you to test in your region.

Where can I learn more about the MyLion app and eventually MyLion on the web?

Our website <u>www.mvlion.org</u> has tools, training resources, tolog posts, and more related to the MyLion app. We will update it with content related to MyLion on the web as we begin to release the platform. www.mylion.org is your main, easy to navigate resource for all things MyLion.

When will the MyLion mobile phone app be released in the European Union?

We are working diligently with our partners in the EU to meet the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). We will release the MyLion mobile phone app to European Union countries when we feel confident that the MyLion mobile phone app meets these requirements.

LIONS LOAN-OUT EQUIPMENT

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one Communication and TV listening.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group sutuation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using Telephone with hearing aid.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
