While disappointing, it is understandable as the safety of their students and staff comes first.


With that in mind, we will be following guidelines in Canton with classroom seating where we can socially distance and wear masks. Lunch will be provided individually; thus, no buffet.

There will be an optional Guiding Lions certification class immediately following the Cabinet meeting.





Wearing a mask with your hearing aids



Clever tips to protect your ears and hearing aids while wearing a mask



1.

If you have long hair, pull it back into a bun and loop the elastics around the bun.




2.

Create a "mask extender" out of fabric or ribbon about 4 inches long. Buttons sewn on either side allows for a place to put the elastic other than your ears.



3.

Sew 2 large buttons onto a soft headband, placing the buttons to line up with each ear. Looping the elastic around each button will take the strain off your ears.



4.

Use masks with string or ribbons that tie in the back. There are YouTube videos on creating masks that tie, which puts absolutely no pressure on the ears.

Communicating when wearing a mask



Speak slowly, clearly and at a normal volume.



Rephrase remarks when not understood.



Take turns when speaking.



Make sure hearing aid users have them on.



Keep background noise in the room to a minimum.



Face each other (at a safe distance).

When removing your mask...

Check to make sure hearing aids are still in place after removing a mask as they may come off with mask removal.



To assist those most severely affected by the current economic downturn, our local country pantry was able to obtain food to accomplish a supplemental food distribution this month. On a rather warm August 3rd, nine club members joined other community members for the pantry's regular monthly food distribution. Over 600 families received produce, frozen meats, canned goods and personal hygiene items in our now customary, drive-through manner in the parking lot. Clients remained in their vehicles wearing masks. It's always rewarding to hear the appreciative comments of the clients as we packed their vehicles with food for them and their families in their time of need.

On August 20th and 21st, eleven club members pre-packed food bags for 125 seniors and the neediest families of some of our school children. These bags were transported from the packing area

Hale donates the services of a charter bus each month for this purpose. Other pre-packed bags were loaded into two pickup trucks for delivery to our local school district for distribution to families of local school children.

Our assistance to the country pantry continued as five club members collected food and financial donations for the pantry at the weekly Farmer's Market on our Village Green. As part of the GIVE BACK NY campaign at all farmers markets throughout the state, we represented the pantry and collected approximately 300 food items (lots of pasta!) and over \$1,000 in contributions. It's very heartwarming to see how people have continued to donate and help their neighbors in their time of need.

Three of our members visited our previously established area locations that contain eyeglass collection containers. This month we collected 137 pair of eyeglasses and further prepared them to be shipped to the recycling center.

The al fresco dining space in the heart of our village continues to be well used by visitors to the community. We continue to be responsible for cleanup duty and preparation for garbage pickup two days a week, sharing this responsibility with other community groups. Many small shops surrounding the village green continue to hear compliments from their patrons regarding the cleanliness of the dining area. Kudos to the Chamber of Commerce and local businesses for creating this dining space and we're more than happy being part of the people in the community keeping it presentable and clean for our diners.

The club continues investigating new/different fundraisers to replace the two major ones lost because of the virus shutdown and startup guidelines. Many of the ideas we've considered, e.g., drive-through chicken barbeques, pancake breakfasts, etc. are being undertaken by other non-profit organizations in and around the area. Knowing everyone is affected in the same way by the virus outbreak, we've elected to continue investigating ideas rather than infringe upon the income of other organizations. We'll continue looking and have confidence when we arrive at the right "replacement fundraiser(s)" we'll be supported by the community so we can continue our service in the community.

August Board

We authorized Lion Preem to spend up to \$100 on supplies to categorize and display our growing pin collection.

Lion Tom reported that the final count was 14,500 eyeglasses collected and shipped to the NJ recycling center during LY2019-20. Lion Jerry added that 13 hearing aids were donated to the Hearing Conservation Society.

Lion Ruth has orders for 192 bottles of sanitizer.

September Board

Lion Tom has approximately 3000 used glasses to count and pack.

Lion Ruth has orders for 269 bottles of sanitizer, with more expected.

Lion Jerry has sold 10 masks, with more expected.

We agreed that Lion Shawn's "Bike Rides for the Blind" project probably won't be feasible until late fall or next spring, depending on the pandemic status, but it should not be forgotten.

CDPHP has apparently agreed to work with us in some yet-to-be-defined way.

Lion Preem got herself a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities. Her plan for a portion of the funds: "I would like to create a new committee of service for children suffering with disabilities. West Hill youth are plagued by the immediate danger of their environment.

At this time there are no community centers open in the entire City of Albany.... except for one.

"Frank Chapman Memorial Institute (Formerly Albany United Methodists Society) is operating safely and providing resources to the community. FCMI is equipped with a garden, gymnasium, playground, computer lab, kitchen, cafe, and conference room.

"I am willing to lead art classes at the FCMI location as a Lion. Prospectively there would be four event dates 9/5, 10/10, 11/1, and 12/5.

Youth suffering from emotional trauma would create art as an expression of healing. I am certified by NYS Office of Family and Children Services (OCFS), Albany Police Department, and Saratoga Sheriff's Office to teach and mentor At-Risk Youth. "These classes would be grant funded by NEH. Each month A&TLC's charitable fund would receive \$200 for facilitating the class.

\$100 would go to the fund, the other \$100 would go towards food and supplies for the youth. This class pays for itself." This is our favorite kind of project: It fills a community need and gets us some PR but requires no funds or effort from us.

August Charitable Board

We received a contribution of \$338 from the family of Lion Paul Andrews, a lifelong member of the Rotterdam Lions who died in 2011. It seems they finally received some unclaimed funds from NYS and since both the Rotterdam and Schenectady Lions Clubs have folded, they decided that we were the logical organization to put these funds to good use.

There were no requests for either eyeglasses or hearing aids.

All the blueberry plants survived the winter successfully. The community has been watering them and selectively enjoying them. Great concern was expressed that we still don't have signage identifying the area as a Lions project.

We had a lengthy discussion of the Community Development Block Grant that was mentioned last month. Subjects included the need for a mission statement, documented internal controls, directors and officers, (D&O) insurance, and the need for an executive director, among other things. The application is due imminently, although we may still be able to apply as long as funds are available.

September Charitable Board

Lion Ruth has one applicant for glasses that she's working with, and one requestor who found another source.

There were no hearing aid applicants.

We submitted an application for the Community Development Grant that we've talked about at the last two meetings.

Lion Greg reported that 30 neighborhood kids weeded the entire blueberry orchard. Also, the adjacent lot is available if we want to double the size of the orchard. We agreed that we must get some signage up before we do any expansion.

In an email vote on Aug 21-24, we approved spending \$195 on a portable magnifier for a legally-blind senior from Albany. She volunteers at her local elementary school and needs it so she can work with her first-grade pupils.

LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers.*

(Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
