
District Governor Rick Brisee


If an in-person visit is not feasible at this time, please just let me know and we will try changing the date to early Spring, or we can meet over Zoom.

As of today, it appears that Covid will be with us for some time to come. I know that some clubs are meeting in person under distancing guidelines (my club meets at the local fire house), some are using Zoom and some are not meeting. If you are not meeting, please contact me so we can discuss how you can do something to keep your club together. It is extremely important that your club members keep in contact with each other at this time. Your district leadership team is meeting monthly so that we can get someone local to your area, i.e. zone chair, region chair, etc., to help your club in whatever you need to be successful.

It is very important at this time that we are all focused on retention of our members. It is difficult (but not impossible) to attract new members. So in order to come out of this crisis whole, we need to keep our communication channels open to all our members. The Governor and his team also will be promulgating new social media guidance to help approach new members as well as looking to you for ideas that you may have had success with in your clubs.

NO club will be cancelled for nonpayment of dues until Dec. 31, 2020. Additionally, new club charter fees and entrance fees will also be waived until Dec. 31, 2020. Dues will still be payable by the end of the calendar year, but this will hopefully give members who have been financially impacted by the virus more time to pay their dues.

Remember, the NAMI process works from the bottom up. That means we need to hear from the clubs to know how you need us to help you. Continue to act responsibly to protect yourself and those you are in contact with.

Wearing a mask with your hearing aids



Clever tips to protect your ears and hearing aids while wearing a mask



If you have long hair, pull it back into a bun and loop the elastics around the bun.



Create a "mask extender" out of fabric or ribbon about 4 inches long. Buttons sewn on either side allows for a place to put the elastic other than your ears.



Sew 2 large buttons onto a soft headband, placing the buttons to line up with each ear. Looping the elastic around each button will take the strain off your ears.



Use masks with string or ribbons that tie in the back. There are YouTube videos on creating masks that tie, which puts absolutely no pressure on the ears.

| Communicating when wearing a mask



Speak slowly, clearly and at a normal volume.



Rephrase remarks when not understood.



Take turns when speaking.



Make sure hearing aid users have them on.



Keep background noise in the room to a minimum.



Face each other (at a safe distance).

When removing your mask...

Check to make sure hearing aids are still in place after removing a mask as they may come off with mask removal.



Clinton Lions Club

To finally met in person for the first time since March - with masks and observing the social distancing requirements it was a little different. Since our regular meeting restaurant is still closed due to the effects of the virus, we met at different locations. Our first meeting of the month was held at the picnic pavilion of our local volunteer fire department – we purchased pizza for what could be the last outing of the summer. The second meeting was held in the community room of one of our local senior communities where we enjoyed pre-purchased submarine sandwiches. We utilized these gatherings to discuss the impact of the virus/shutdown on our club finances and began to plan our service to the community not knowing what impact the lingering virus will have on our plans. Next month our first meeting is scheduled to be conducted in the Board Room at our local town's municipal building.

Monthly collection of eyeglasses by members of the club resulted in 272 pairs being retrieved from containers in local businesses, sorted and prepared for delivery to the Central Association for the Blind & Visually Impaired (CABVI) in Utica. On the 28th of the month we delivered 770 pair of eyeglasses to the CABVI. They had been collected over the last several months.

Assistance at our local Food Pantry continued with two distributions, one on September and the other on

September 28th. Club members perform various tasks on a monthly basis depending upon the needs, number of volunteers participating and amount of food the pantry has accumulated to distribute.

The most recent distribution was the largest to date – we distributed food, personal hygiene items and Kids Paks

containing child friendly & healthy food supplements to over 1,000 people (640 vehicles). The distribution continued outside in the parking lot of the church in Clark Mills. NY and because

of the

virus impact it looks like we will continue this type of distribution through the winter months. Two of our members, wearing reflective Lions vests, have undertaken the responsibility for traffic control. Vehicles awaiting food are queued up along the shoulder of the hamlet roads while through traffic passes in both directions utilizing a single lane and walkie-talkies in a road construction-type environment. The upcoming winter season should prove interesting.

On behalf of the District, we made a \$200 donation toward the purchase of product for inclusion in the Kids Paks. These funds were obtained by the District from the Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation (BMYF) as an incentive for selling our assigned quota of Super Bowl Raffle Tickets last year. In addition, to assist in covering the increased cost of food supplies resulting in the everincreasing number of people served by the pantry, our club made a supplemental contribution of \$500 to the pantry. We will be applying for a matching fund grant to the BMYF for our contribution to multiply our "Lions dollars" donation to the pantry.

Our efforts in keeping the al fresco dining space in the heart of village continues. We fulfill our obligation to the community effort two days a week. Club members take turns cleaning the area and preparing any refuse for pickup by the village sanitation department the following day.

Three members represented the club by attending the Cabinet Meeting in Canton, NY earlier in the month and last week two members joined the Herkimer Lions Club for dinner at their 34th annual Golf outing.

We continue to plan service projects and fundraisers in the "new normal" and have determined mailing an appeal letter to the community is our best approach in attempting to make up for canceled fundraisers. This letter will be mailed sometime before the Christmas Holiday Season and ask residents to consider making personal donations to our efforts in serving the community. Holiday events in the community in which we have participated in past years have already been scaled down, modified or canceled. The club will continue our visibility in the community through participation in these events in a socially responsible manner.

We hope everyone continues to stay safe & healthy and we look forward to seeing everyone in Lake George in November.

Pellow MD-20 Lions: What project or need in your community can you meet with some additional financial support from your Foundation? Discuss your proposed project with your district Trustee! We are here to serve you and help turn your community project from a vision to a reality. We provide matching grants for any approved Lions Club or District project that supports an un-met need in your local community. We can support your club project starting with your application to the NYS&BLF for a matching grant (see our web site: www.nysblf.org). There have been some recent enhancements to our application process to assist you:

A. Only one (1) paper copy has to be mailed (no e-mails) to the Foundation at least 30 days prior to our next scheduled meeting (previously was 45 days). The application must be signed by a Trustee of the Foundation from your District.

B. Meeting dates are posted on our web site, as is the address to mail your grant application (see address below; must include a copy of the complete minutes of the cabinet meeting at which district approval of your application was obtained).

C. If the grant request needs to be submitted due to a deadline date before the cabinet minutes are available, a letter signed by your CS stating that the district cabinet approved the submission of a grant request by your Lions Club or District can be included with the grant submission. If the grant is approved, the matching funds will be released when the complete cabinet minutes are received by the Foundation office.

So should your club go through this process and what will you hope to gain? Here's an example of a community need that was recently met by the Union Springs Lions Club. The village of Union Springs dubbed 2017 The Year of Frontenac Park as community organizations donated funds to renovate an old and unsafe playground. Thank you so much for the generous donation of gift cards from your Lions Club. They will be a tremendous help to our house director as she meets the needs of our RMH families and children.

Regarding your inquiry of other ways to help, I am attaching a recent wish list (please see page 20 of this newsletter), but I also wanted to share the following need that our Director of Volunteers shared with others today:

The House is a bit different right now with limited volunteers and lots of safety measures, cleaning, and disinfecting protocols in place. One of our biggest challenge now is providing meals for our guest families. Our traditional meal program has been on pause, and we are just now beginning to bring back a few regular meal partners to assist. Until we

are able to cover 7 days a week with volunteer meal groups, we are in great need of sponsors to cover the costs of catered dinners from restaurants. If you would like to help with this need, it can be done in one of these three different ways:

- 1. Make a donation to the House towards the meal program, costs vary depending on how many families are here and have ranged from \$100-\$280 a night
- 2. Choose to purchase a gift card from a local restaurant for us to use for a night. We've used restaurants like TJ's Café on Central Avenue (giving back to them as they donate a meal once a week), Tipsy Moose on New Scotland Avenue, Cardona's Deli on Delaware Avenue, Swifty's also on Delaware Avenue and Pepper Jacks on North Allen. We've also found a few of the chain restaurants have meals a bit cheaper and have used Ninety Nine Restaurant and Texas Roadhouse so far.
- 3. We can plan a meal together and you can pay directly to the restaurant once we place the order.

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
