

MEMBERSHIP MEMBERSHIP

Hello Lions and Leos,

This is my first newsletter for a new Lions year. The horizon seems much brighter than it did at this time last year, but in making a new start we need to evaluate what happened to our membership this past year. At the time of this writing, we are minus 114 members. This includes the loss of 53 members from two clubs that closed. The District Governor and the leadership team are here to try to help the clubs with whatever problems you have in your clubs, but we can't help if you don't tell us. Your Zone Chairs are your first level of communication, but you can contact any of the team if you feel the need. The core of Lionism resides at the club level. Please insure that you report your membership and service EVERY month. This helps the leadership team evaluate the health of our district. So, to get a good start and recover, we need to communicate, communicate, and communicate.

This year we are going to work with the clubs to implement the North American Membership Initiative (NAMI). This program began as a pilot program in 9 multiple districts in the US and Canada in the 2019-2020 Lions year. The purpose is to combat the continuing decline in membership, which began in 1980. This program will be an ongoing effort, which will be expanded worldwide under the name Global Membership Approach (GMA). The basic tenet of the approach is to encourage communication between clubs to the leadership of the district. If we in the leadership of the district know what each club needs, we can better try to help you on an individual basis. The mechanism to accomplish this is a process dubbed SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats).

We would like every club to do a SWOT analysis, as we will be doing on a district level. I would like everyone to go on line to get more familiar with NAMI. To do this, go to the LCI website, click the magnifying glass search and type in NAMI, then select the overview. Then, go back to the main page, go to Resources, select Resource Center, select Membership Development, go to page 4 by clicking the arrows on the upper right side and scroll down to Global Membership Approach SWOT. This should give everyone a good idea of our direction to increase our membership. This will be an ongoing effort for many years. We need to reverse this ongoing loss of members and it will not happen overnight.

It is very important at this time that we are all focused on retention of our members. It is should be easier to attract new members as things open up, but we all still need to make an effort to keep the members we have. Go on the LCI website and look for the membership satisfaction survey. Try it in your club to gauge your club's health. Then do something about it. So in order to come out of this crisis whole, we need to keep our communication channels open to all our members. Orientation of new members is the prime way that we help keep them in the club and interested in providing service to their community. The District will be conducting zoom orientation for new and existing members to keep everyone fresh and up to date on all aspects of Lionism. If you are interested, please contact me and I'll make sure you are included.

SALT PRESENTATION

Presenters at the Town of Wright/Schoharie Valley Lions Club on May 17th were Sarah Goodrich, a SALT volunteer board member, and Anne Morton, who is president of the 10-member all-volunteer board of directors. SALT stands for Schoharie Area Long Term.

Ms. Goodrich noted that SALT sprang up as a grass roots organization in 2011 to meet the needs of the Schoharie Valley after Hurricane Irene and massive flooding devastated hundreds of homes throughout the county.

SALT coordinated relief efforts with local agencies in the various communities, and established the makeshift Loaves and Fishes Café at the Schoharie Reformed Church to feed the volunteers. For months, volunteers from around the state, and from out of state, came to Schoharie in droves to help with the clean up and rebuilding efforts.

Ten years later, there are still areas that have not fully recovered. SALT has continued to provide grants to individuals to help repair their homes.

SALT's mission has evolved and now includes economic development to get businesses up and running. Through its Schoharie Main Street project, they have provided grants to

businesses in

the village of Schoharie.

Through its Community Development Fund, SALT provides grants to non-profit organizations for projects designed to improve the quality of life in Schoharie County. Recipients of recent awards were the Central Bridge Civic Association for playground equipment; the village of Schoharie to upgrade the

kiddie pool; the Schoharie Free Library, the Sharon Springs Free Library, the Under the Sun 4-H Club, the Joshua Project, the George Landis Arboretum, the Schoharie Joint Youth Recreation Commission and others.

In 2020, SALT worked with Schoharie County Emergency Management to collect, sanitize, and distribute protective fabric masks to health care workers and first responders.

Ms. Morton, who hails from western New York, said it was because of the very rural nature of the community that people came together to help each other. She believes SALT is unique and may be the only organization of its kind in the state. The group plans on being around for a long time, she added.





Wearing a mask with your hearing aids



Clever tips to protect your ears and hearing aids while wearing a mask



If you have long hair, pull it back into a bun and loop the elastics around the bun.



Create a "mask extender" out of fabric or ribbon about 4 inches long. Buttons sewn on either side allows for a place to put the elastic other than your ears.



Sew 2 large buttons onto a soft headband, placing the buttons to line up with each ear. Looping the elastic around each button will take the strain off your ears.



Use masks with string or ribbons that tie in the back. There are YouTube videos on creating masks that tie, which puts absolutely no pressure on the ears

Communicating when wearing a mask



Speak slowly, clearly and at a normal volume.



Rephrase remarks when not understood.



Take turns when speaking.



Make sure hearing aid users have them on.



Keep background noise in the room to a minimum.



Face each other (at a safe distance).

When removing your mask...

Check to make sure hearing aids are still in place after removing a mask as they may come off with mask removal.

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
