Virtual/Hybrid Evaluation

While it is essential that each individual considers their own circumstances and personal situation/comfort level when deciding whether or not to attend the Forum, the Forum also has an obligation to be fiscally responsible. The Forum is an independent Lion-led organization that doesn't receive any portion of your Lions dues.

Earlier in the year, we evaluated the potential of providing a virtual component of the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum. However, two factors led us away from this option.

We had a deadline in March to finalize the Forum format in order to adequately consider all the logistical intricacies of incorporating virtual features with an in-person event. At that time (prior to the emergence of the Delta variant), the COVID data was going in the right direction and all indications were trending toward continued improvement.

To ensure a high-quality experience for both in-person and virtual participants, we would have needed much more extensive audio/visual as well as high capacity livestreaming capabilities for 10 seminar rooms simultaneously and our large banquet hall. This would have made registration for a virtual option cost prohibitive.

Lions have been enjoying high quality FREE or low cost virtual training since the Spring 2020 (if not before). The Forum can't compete with free and provide the infrastructure necessary for quality hybrid events; there would have been little demand for what we would have needed to charge.

We will always support and encourage Lions to take advantage of virtual and on-demand learning opportunities such as (but not limited to):

- Lions University Provided by the Forum since 2014; you can take all the courses you want for free; however graduation requirements do include attendance at events.
- Lions Learning Center LCI's online learning portal.
- Lions Virtual Ongoing Zoom educational and social activities, and a mobile app that incorporates social sharing and other resources.
- Global Lions Forum Facebook Group with great discussions on topics of interests to Lions.

Seminar Recordings to be Available

Although we will not be able to have remote participation in the Forum, we have arranged a way to bring at least part of the Forum experience into your homes.

Our A/V vendor will have equipment to record audios of the educational seminars, and many of the seminar facilitators have graciously agreed to provide their presentation materials.

These are intended to be available for purchase after the Forum as a single package. However, since this is the first time the Forum has attempted this, we are not taking pre-orders. We want to ensure the

clarity and quality of the recordings before offering for sale.

There is a significant expense to offer even this limited capability, and your response will help inform the Forum as to projected interest and demand for future remote learning options.

The Forum will follow applicable public safety guidelines for the Iowa Events Center. These have not changed since our last newsletter, but we monitor closely as they may be subject to change prior to the Forum. Currently:

• Per the CDC and Polk County (Iowa), face coverings should be worn indoors regardless of vaccination status to help prevent the spread of the virus and protect others. The Forum strongly encourages all attendees to wear face coverings and practice social distancing where practical during Forum events. We also wish to embrace "kindness matters" and respect fellow Lions' personal comfort and precautions of wearing face coverings and social distancing.

A COVID test is not required to attend the Forum or enter the facility.

Wearing a mask with your hearing aids



Clever tips to protect your ears and hearing aids while wearing a mask



If you have long hair, pull it back into a bun and loop the elastics around the bun.



Create a "mask extender" out of fabric or ribbon about 4 inches long. Buttons sewn on either side allows for a place to put the elastic other than your ears.



Sew 2 large buttons onto a soft headband, placing the buttons to line up with each ear. Looping the elastic around each button will take the strain off your ears.



Use masks with string or ribbons that tie in the back. There are YouTube videos on creating masks that tie, which puts absolutely no pressure on the ears.

Communicating when wearing a mask



Speak slowly, clearly and at a normal volume.



Rephrase remarks when not understood.



Take turns when speaking.



Make sure hearing aid users have them on.



Keep background noise in the room to a minimum.



Face each other (at a safe distance).

When removing your mask...

Check to make sure hearing aids are still in place after removing a mask as they may come off with mask removal.

LIONS LOAN-OUT EQUIPMENT

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
