1 Build a Team of Leaders

Current Leaders: Identify who can carry out and lead the development of the strategy.


Future Leaders: Include all Lions who can serve as future leaders. Lions who have held leadership positions, who can provide insight, support and are interested in the future of the club.

Members: To gain a full perspective of your club's needs. Look for a cross section of members who represent the club or in smaller clubs involve as many members as possible (established members, new members, young Lions, professionals) to both understand their needs and engage their talent.

Build a Vision, Assess Needs and Set Goals

As Lions, we naturally have vision.....This provides a tested process to share your vision, collectively discover new opportunities and develop common goals.

It starts with you and your club. Consider these objectives in the four main areas:



You may want to use SWOT Analysis to identify needs and strategize goals:



STRENGTHS, WEAKNESSES, OPPORTUNITIES, THREATS (S.W.O.T.) The path to club improvement...leverage your strengths, manage your weaknesses, take advantage of opportunities and minimize impact of threats.

For more information on SWOT visit Learn in your MyLion <u>Portal</u> and review the Introduction to SWOT Analysis.

Here are a few sample questions to start the club's conversation.

1. REJUVENATE YOUR CLUB WITH NEW MEMBERS:

- What opportunities exist to expand membership?
- What do we need to do to better recruit members?
- Why are members not joining our club?
- Why do people join our club?

2. REVITALIZE YOUR CLUB WITH NEW SERVICE OPPORTUNTIES:

- Are the club's service projects relevant to current community needs?
- Are members enthusiastic and actively involved in service projects?
- Is club leadership receptive to members' ideas for new service ideas?
- Do our service projects attract new members?

3. EXCEL IN LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND CLUB OPERATIONS:

- Do club officers participate in training for their position?
- Are members encouraged to take leadership positions?
- Do members regularly attend and participate in club functions?
- Do you need to reconsider the format of club meetings?

4. SHARE YOUR CLUB'S ACHIEVEMENTS WITH YOUR COMMUNITY:

- Is the club active on social media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter)?
- Does your club have an e-Clubhouse or website?
- How are you keeping the public informed of your events?
- Do we include welcoming messaging that encourages people to join?

<u>Club Quality Initiative</u>: A strategic planning tool to help clubs identify opportunities for improvement. By understanding the club's current operations and identifying areas that may be improved and taking measured steps to accomplish their goals, each club can be even better!

<u>Membership Chairperson Guide</u>: Outlines the roles and responsibilities of a club membership chairperson and provides practical guidance of recruiting and retaining members.

<u>Membership Satisfaction Guide</u>: Outlines a three-step process to help improve satisfaction among your club members and provides some tips for common barriers to member satisfaction.

<u>Just Ask! New Member Recruiting Guide</u>: Designed to guide your club through the process of recruiting new members and effectively manage club growth.

They **encompass** the essence of Lions and Leos. If the past 100 years have taught us anything, it's that as we serve, we grow and we were never meant to stop. Service is our journey. Let's explore it together.

Marketing Communications Guide: Includes tips for working with various media channels, ideas of how to make your message newsworthy and access to resources offered by Lions International that can be used by local clubs.

<u>Club Health Assessment</u>: helps track membership growth, reporting trends and the overall health of clubs by each district.

<u>Club Health Assessment Strategies</u>: Suggested strategies to improve club membership, reporting, leadership succession and keep the club in good status.

ESTABLISH GOALS

Based on the findings of your assessment. An effective plan will include strategic goals that are specific, measurable, attainable, and realistic. Goals can be short-term and achieved during the year, or long-term and take years to achieve.

Consider planning a goal-setting event, where all club members can contribute to developing priorities and establishing goals. Getting the members involved in the process is the first step in building alignment and generating enthusiasm throughout the club for accomplishing identified goals.

Need more help to establish goals? Take the online <u>Goal Setting Course</u> on the Lions Learning Center to familiarize yourself with the concepts of effective goal setting and action planning.

Make sure your club goals are **SMART**:

SPECIFIC – A specific goal has a much greater chance of being accomplished than a general goal. You will have more focus if your objective is clear.

MEASURABLE – When you measure your progress, you stay on track, meet your target dates and experience the exhilaration of achievement that spurs you on to continued effort required to reach your goal. If you can't measure it, you can't manage it.

ACTIONABLE – Make sure you have some control over the accomplishment of your goal. If there is nothing you can do, you won't succeed.

REALISTIC – Goals should be challenging but not so much that there is no chance of achieving them.

TIME BOUND – Set a timeframe for the goal specify what should be completed by: next week, in three months, by the end of the year. Putting an end point on your goal gives you a clear target toward which to work. Record the goals that your club will pursue to enhance its value to the community and to club members below (use additional pages as necessary).

3 Build a Plan to Achieve Your Goals

DEVELOP YOUR ACTION PLAN by outlining the steps you will take to achieve your goals. This step outlines how the goal will be achieved (action steps), when each step will be completed, who will be responsible for the step,

4 Build On Your Success

IMPLEMENT THE PLAN, measure success and don't forget to celebrate!

Congratulations on Planning Your Success. Your investment in developing a clearly defined vision will be well worth the effort, as long as this plan is implemented!



To be successful:

- **SHARE** your club's Vision with all club members along with their role in achieving club goals so that they are aware of what the club wants to achieve. It is very important to the health and vibrancy of any club that its members feel connected to the club's success.
- **SUPPORT** the members committed to the plan by ensuring they have the resources they need to succeed. Leaders should check in with members to make sure they feel supported and receive the guidance they need.
- RECOGNIZE milestones so members feel valued and know they are moving in the right direction. Every journey was started with a single step. Reassure members frequently to keep them motivated and engaged. Don't keep your success a secret! Share the success with your community to get like-minded (and prospective members) involved!
- **EVALUATE** the plan. It is also critical to evaluate your plan on a regular basis. As circumstances change, your plan may require revision. The creation of the initial Vision is just the beginning. Keep it alive and relevant by measuring progress and gathering
- CHANGE the plan. Don't be afraid to change the plan as opportunities change to keep the
 plan relevant. Regularly revisit the plan, assess needs and refine action steps. It is also
 critical to evaluate your plan on a regular basis. As circumstances change, Keep your plan
 members involved in decisions so that they can stay involved and committed.

I attended Virtual LCICon 2021. Is this the same thing?

When the global pandemic prevented us from hosting LCICon 2021 in person, we weren't going to let that stop us from hosting our flagship event. We converted our headquarters into a broadcast studio for a truly unique all-virtual experience. Given that we'll be live in Montréal this year, we won't be able to offer full virtual access. However, we're pleased to offer this limited-access virtual option for those who can't make the trip.

Is there a cost? How do I sign up?

There will be a nominal fee for LCICon Virtual Access, which will help cover costs of the video stream and the platform. More details, including registration information, will be released in the upcoming months. If I am a delegate and view the convention through Virtual Access, will I be able to participate in the election?

Virtual Access does not constitute a full registration to the international convention. Per the Lions International Constitution and By-Laws, because LCICon is taking place on location in Montréal, only registered delegates are eligible to vote in the international election.

Nine club members joined other community members unloading the pallets of assorted food, staging them on tarps laid out in the church parking lot, unwrapping the pallets and loading the various items into clients' vehicles as they passed by on either side of the tarp. This month's assortment of food included frozen meats, frozen shrimp, fresh and hard-boiled eggs, cheese, yogurt, whole milk, sour cream, bread, cereal, personal hygiene items, assorted produce and locally donated shelf storable food items. All distributions continue to be procured through the generous donations (both financial and

material) from benevolent community members, religious organizations and businesses.

Over 450 vehicles, representing approximately 865 individuals, were packed with provisions to assist them in the upcoming weeks. Our February distribution is scheduled for the middle of the month meaning food insecure clients will not

have to wait as long for their muchneeded assistance.

MD20 Delinquent Dues Policy (from the MD20 Policy Manual)

This applies only to clubs in excess of \$1000 beyond 120 days past due or owing any amount for more than 90 days after a second billing cycle has passed. This basically means haven't paid in 450 days.

MD20 Delinquent Dues Policy

Any club in arrears to Multiple District 20 for dues in excess of \$1,000 beyond 120 days, or in arrears to Multiple District 20 for dues in any amount for more than 90 days after a second consecutive billing cycle has passed without full payment having been made, shall be subject to the following administrative actions:

- 1) Once the above default date is triggered, the Council Secretary-Treasurer shall send a letter to the delinquent club's president, secretary, treasurer and any PDGs therein informing these club leaders that the arrears situation must be addressed immediately. The letter must advise the leaders of the delinquent club that the failure to address the situation will result in the club being recommended for placement on status quo with the possible loss of the club charter (see Appendix A). A copy of this letter shall be sent to the district governor in whose district the delinquent club is located.
- 2) If the delinquent club's leaders fail to respond to the above referenced letter within 30 days thereof, by way of immediate payment or the execution of a payment plan to address the arrears, then the district governor in whose district the delinquent club is located, or his/her representative, shall make immediate contact with the club leaders to accomplish the following:
 - a) a review of the club roster to determine the accuracy of each member's status and contact information, and the accuracy of the club officer information listed on the PU101;
 - b) a review of the billing procedures utilized by the club for the collection of member dues;
 - c) a review of club accounts to confirm the appropriate segregation of charitable and administrative funds;
 - d) the creation of a plan to address the arrears owed to MD20 from administrative funds, which may include a per capita tax on members for any past dues uncollected and the appropriate billing and collection of same.
- 3) The district governor in whose district the delinquent club is located must submit proof that the steps outlined in paragraph 2 above were accomplished within sixty (60) days of the letter referred to in paragraph 1. Such proof must be in writing and acknowledged by the signature of the district governor, the first vice district governor, the zone chair assigned to the club in question, as well as the club president and the club secretary. Said proof may be in the form of the review and recovery report provided in Appendix B. This sixty (60) day deadline may be extended by the Council Chair for good cause shown.
- 4) If a delinquent club fails to cooperate with the district governor, or his/her representative, in reviewing the club's membership information, billing procedures, and finances as required in paragraph 2 above, and/or fails to enter into a payment plan to satisfy its arrears within sixty (60) days of receipt of the letter referred to in paragraph 1, then the district governor must request that LCI place the delinquent club on status quo in accordance with the policy set forth in Chapter V of the LCI Board Policy Manual. Said status quo request may be in the form provided in Appendix C. This sixty (60) day deadline may be extended by the Council Chair for good cause shown. A district governor may rely on the collection attempts made by his/her predecessor in order to satisfy the preconditions for a status quo request.
- 5) If the district governor in whose district a delinquent club is located fails to submit the proof required by paragraph 3 above prior to the close of the council meeting next occurring after the 60-day deadline (or any extension of same granted by the Council Chair), or fails to request that a delinquent club be placed on status quo in accordance with the policy set forth in Chapter V of the LCI Board Policy Manual after appropriate efforts were made to address the club's delinquency, then the Council Chair may direct the Council Secretary Treasurer to:
 - a) withhold district dues disbursements to that district until such time as the requirements are met, except that under no circumstances may such payments be held beyond June 1 of the Lionistic year in question.
 - b) withhold any MD20 reimbursement to the district governor for expenses related to travel to and from the International Convention.
- 6) The Council Secretary-Treasurer and the MD20 Office are directed to provide the delinquent club and the district governor in whose district the delinquent club is located all necessary documentation and assistance to verify the history of the arrears, including proof of billing, payments and collection attempts. The Council Secretary-Treasurer and the MD20 Office shall work with the delinquent club and the district governor at every stage of this process to agree on appropriate terms for the collection of arrears.
- 7) The Council Secretary-Treasurer shall report to the Council at every council meeting the status of all attempts to collect delinquent dues within the various districts, and the Council shall act on any appropriate requests consistent with these policies and procedures.

Wearing a mask with your hearing aids



Clever tips to protect your ears and hearing aids while wearing a mask



If you have long hair, pull it back into a bun and loop the elastics around the bun.



Create a "mask extender" out of fabric or ribbon about 4 inches long. Buttons sewn on either side allows for a place to put the elastic other than your ears.



Sew 2 large buttons onto a soft headband, placing the buttons to line upwith each ear. Looping the elastic around each button will take the strain off your ears.



Use masks with string or ribbons that tie in the back. There are YouTube videos on creating masks that tie, which puts absolutely no pressure on the ears.

Communicating when wearing a mask



Speak slowly, clearly and at a normal volume.



Rephrase remarks when not understood.



Take turns when speaking.



Make sure hearing aid users have them on.



Keep background noise in the room to a minimum.



Face each other (at a safe distance).

When removing your mask...

Check to make sure hearing aids are still in place after removing a mask as they may come off with mask removal.

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
