Today I would like to touch more on Dr. Edward Deming. He has so I much to offer any organization. Deming has fourteen points, which is a great starting point for everyone.

1. Create Constancy of purpose for improvement of Service or Products. Deming suggests his idea is not just to make money; it is to stay in business and and provide service through innovation, continuous improvement, maintenance, and do this for many years to come.

2. Adopt the new philosophy. People were to tolerant of workmanship and sullen service. We need to make mistakes and negativism is unacceptable.

3. Cease dependence on mass inspection, To me this means don't wait till the end of the year to make changes. Why wait until Lions go in the wrong direction? Why let them make mistakes? Make improvements in the process assoon as possible.

4. End the practice of awarding business on price alone. This means buying low quality and low price from vendors, will not make the best products. We do service, so we want to do High Impact Service Projects, first locally, then District, Multiple District and then Internationally. Our local Lions Clubs must build quality Clubs otherwise everything can not survive.

5. **Improve constantly and forever the system of production and service**. Improvement is not a one time effort, Like DG Michele likes to say, it is like a living moving document.

6. **Institute Training**. Lions International is great at this one. There is still a lot of old fashioned management styles at club levels, so we need to guide these clubs gently.

7. Institute Leadership. The job of any leader is to lead, coach, and be fair to everyone. Leaders need to mentor everyone who are under their wing.

8. **Drive out fear.** Many Lions are afraid to bring up topics and concerns they have about Lions. We need to understand our Lions Clubs. To be better Lions, they all need to feel secure, to serve better.

9. Break down barriers between staff areas. Sometimes teams do not work together to solve or even see issues. Communication is very important to do this, we need to know each everyone's goals.


10. Eliminate slogans and targets for the workforce. This is for work places more than the Lions.

11. Eliminate numerical quotas. We really don't want people to do service just to do service. Lions need to do quality service that has a positive impact in our world.





Clever tips to protect your ears and hearing aids while wearing a mask



lf you have long hair, puil it back into a bun and loop the elastics around the bun.



Create a"mask extender" out of fabric or ribbon about 4 inches long. Buttons sewn on either side allows for a place to put the elastic other than your ears.



Sew 2 large buttons onto a soft headband, placing the buttons to line up with each ear. Looping the elastic around each button will take the strain off your ears.



Use masks with string or ribbons that tie in the back. There are YouTube videos on creating masks that tie, which puts absolutely no pressure on the ears.

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.
