Quick Tips for Getting a Great Photo!

- 1. Find a neutral background if possible with the least amount of clutter.
- 2. Use good lighting. Don't backlight your subjects, expecially in group photos.
- 3. Make sure your photo is in focus and not blurry.
- 4. Be a photojournalist! Tell the story Who, What, Why, Where, and How make for captions. Always include a caption with your photo.
- 5. Use as high resolution or RAW setting as possible. It can be compressed for publication.
- 6. When taking groups, make sure your subject(s) are looking at YOU and not others taking photos. If needed, wait until everyone is done and then take you photo.
- 7. Make sure recognitions such as RJUS and Certificates are held correctly.
- 8. Take your photos focused on the subject(s) in natural scenarios.
- 9. Get permissions if using for public marketing or promotions of your club. Permission forms can be found on the LCI website. Search for photo permission form or photo release.
- 10. Finally, feel free to submit your photos with your articles to ME for "The Roar" - karen@deuxflutes.com.

No club meetings are scheduled during the months of July and August. However, two members attended the monthly Chamber of Commerce Networking Breakfast the first week in August. This month it was held in a pavilion at the village swimming pool complex. Pool Board members described their current efforts and plans for their "Fill the Pool Fundraising Project" to fund substantial upgrades needed to keep the pool operating. We also utilized the gathering to inform/remind those present about our upcoming Confidential Document Shredding Event by passing out flyers to those residents in attendance and asked that they distribute them throughout the community.

The second Thursday of the month (August 10th), we held that Shredding Event at our local middle school parking

boxes of paper/documents from vehicles and dumped them into large totes that were mechanically lifted into the mobile shredder for on-sight shredding. A total of 20 totes weighing 150 - 200 pounds each were shredded before the skies opened up. People could view the shredding process as it took place via a remote camera mounted on the side of the truck. The paper was once again shredded when the truck return to its facility. The twice shredded paper was then bundled for recycling by the waste hauling company. There was no charge to the residents for this service, however we did receive \$717 in donations.

Our local Country Pantry Distribution was held this month on August 14th. Ten (10) club members joined other community volunteers loading food into clients' cars as

Once again, the weatherman was good to us as we experienced almost perfect outdoor weather for this time of year.

We continue collecting used eyeglasses from previously established locations throughout our community. This month two (2) members picked up 288 pairs that we sorted and prepared for shipping to the Eyeglass distribution center via the Central Association for the Blind & Visually Impaired (CABVI) in Utica.

On August 23ed two (2) club members presented one of our local businessmen with a Robert J. Uplinger Distinguished Service Award (RJU) at his place of business. Long-time resident of the community, Bob Meelan was honored for his service as Town of Kirkland, NY Supervisor and pending retirement from business. Bob has been the sole

LIONS LOAN-OUT EQUIPMENT

Below is a list of assistive devices available at many of LHCS of NYS's Loan-Out Centers. (Other equipment may be available upon request)

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
