DAs the 20 W Global Extension Team (GET) District Coordinator, I want to assist the GAT Team with implementing 20W's MISSION 1.5 membership growth plan and achieving goals established by DG Holly for 24-25.

I am grateful for your potential assistance in this vital mission. If you want to work with me to charter new clubs, branch, and Leo Clubs for our district, please contact me at mapohare@gmail.com. This year, I want to collaborate with district leadership to build a team capable of completing the tasks required in successfully chartering new clubs, including

membership recruitment, leadership development, and engagement in meaningful service projects. Also, if you know of opportunities to charter new clubs in communities or within groups of a larger community that are not served or are underserved, please let me know so we can do a community needs assessment to see if we can start a new club in the designated community. Once a community is identified, we will develop a plan and timeline for each potential new club following proven processes for new club development. These include creating a team, conducting site research, conducting needs assessments, identifying sponsoring clubs and Guiding Lions, conducting informational and organizational meetings, and recruiting charter members.

I want to work with the GAT to establish more branch clubs this year. Club branch members are part of an existing parent club but may hold independent meetings and activities. The parent club appoints a branch liaison to serve as the go-between for the parent and the club branch, giving club branches the autonomy they may desire. Starting a club branch requires the following:

- At least five new or existing members
- An existing club willing to engage these members as a branch of their club
- A member of the parent club to serve as a branch liaison
- Notification sent to the district governor

By starting a club branch, you're not just expanding our reach, but also offering flexibility in participation that may attract different types of Lions, like young professionals or working parents with young children. Club branches can also unite people with diverse service interests and form a specialty club branch. These resources can help you get started.

If you are interested in starting a branch club for your Club, please contact me. I will be glad to visit your Club and assist you.








ALBANY & TROY LIONS CLUB Installation Dinner

which in itself is about average for clubs in our district.


However, 13 of them are on the board, and the other
