UN Day will be March 21, 2025. Registration is open so come join us!

The 2025 International Convention has moved! It will no longer be held in Mexico City but has moved to Orlando, Florida July 13th – 17th 2025. Make your plans to join Lions from around the world!

Mission 1.5 (growing membership to 1.5M world-wide by June 2027) Is still the most important Lions endeavor around. We need to demonstrate

to new Lions the significant impact Lionism has on our communities. Their fresh energy will help to invigorate the district, bringing greater excitement and vibrancy to our events and our projects. So far, I have inducted at least one new member at each of my September and October visitations. Please keep up the momentum so that we can help get multiple district 20 back to 15,000 members by June of 2027 from 13000+ currently.

- 7. Input Title and select Activity Type (Donation, Fundraiser, Meeting or Service Project) then click next
- 8. Brings up a Service Project Form just fill it out. Click Report Complete to finish then select Save







24.5 Million In Renovations To Come

The Central Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired will hold a ceremonial groundbreaking on Friday, Nov. 15 at 10 a.m., ahead of its \$24.5 million renovation project to enhance its headquarters on Kent Street in Utica.

The new facility will transform CABVI operations so the agency can continue to provide crucial services and employment opportunities for the blind and visually impaired community in Central New York.

CABVI supports its mission, in part, by employing nearly 60 people with visual impairments throughout its manufacturing and business services divisions at its headquarters. This project will allow the agency to expand these divisions and continue to provide quality jobs that allow people with vision loss to maintain a sense of pride and independence.

Sustainability is also at the forefront of this project. The new facility will include more than 350 solar panels, LED lights, a reflective roof and energy-efficient windows and heating. Empire State Development has awarded CABVI a \$1.6 million capital grant to support the project's sustainability elements.

The project is expected to be completed in the spring of 2026.

Pocketalker |

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alest you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
