

Fellow Lions,

It's March and spring is around the corner (we hope)! The second half of our Lions year is in full swing. What are you doing to break the cabin fever we all experience at this time of year?

ARE YOU ATTENDING THE STATE CONVENTION IN NIAGARA FALLS IN MAY? PLEASE LET ME KNOW! Our multiple district 20 State Convention will be held in Niagara Falls May 16th – 18th 2025. Registration is now open and the seminars are set for Saturday, May 17th. We have sessions on Artificial Intelligence, Marketing and the Web, Awards, Partnerships, Member Retention, Service, Guerilla Marketing, Membership, Environment (Bees), Legal, Disaster Response, Branch/Specialty Clubs, Lions Quest, and back by popular demand from last year's sessions, the Shark Tank. Hope to see you all there, it will be fun! Also, I will soon be receiving the delegate forms for all 20W clubs which I will be forwarding on to you. Please remember that all balances must be zero for both LCI and MD20 15 days before the convention if you wish to have delegates vote. So, be sure your dues are paid for both LCI and MDI and also don't buy any supplies, add new members, etc. after April 30 as this would give you a balance due 15 days before the convention starts.

Our next cabinet meeting is scheduled for April 5th up in Ticonderoga at the War Cannon, details coming shortly but want to get it on your calendars. Presidents and secretaries are key attendees but any club member is always welcome.

UN Day will be March 21, 2025. Registration is open so come join us!

The 2025 International Convention is in Orlando, Florida July 13th – 17th 2025. Make your plans to join Lions from around the world! If you have never seen the Parade of Nations, you're in for a treat!

Mission 1.5 (growing membership to 1.5M worldwide by June 2027) Is still the most important Lions endeavor around. We need to demonstrate to new Lions the significant impact Lionism has on our communities. Their fresh energy will help to invigorate the district, bringing greater excitement and vibrancy to our events and our projects. I have inducted at least one new member at many of my visitations. Please keep up the momentum so that we can help get multiple district 20 back to 15,000 members by June of 2027 from the 13000+we currently have.



I have been working on scheduling visitations with all of the clubs. Visitation schedule can be found at the bottom of this article. Those clubs that are in red, please confirm that these dates work with your club.

Donations to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), both by clubs and individual club members, is a significant consideration we should all make. All donations received are used to assist in disasters around the world, including many times in our own district, unfortunately. Won't you please consider making a donation to our foundation? Please be sure to note in the memo line either Empowering Service or Disaster Relief. If you use Disaster Relief, please don't specify a particular disaster as when that disaster is finally cleaned up, any monies specifically noted to that disaster cannot be used anywhere else. There are also LCIF raffle tickets out there for purchase - \$10 each or book of 6 for \$50. See your club secretary, they should have received tickets.

There are New York State and Bermuda Lions Foundation raffle tickets with your secretaries. Tickets are \$100 each but if you or your club purchases 3 you are then eligible to give a Robert J Uplinger Award to someone deserving in your club or community.

Our goal this year is to have all Lions and Leos Clubs reporting service, it's important to let others know what we are doing. Hopefully you are becoming more comfortable with the new Lions Portal but just in case, remember you can reach out to District Administrator, Lion Margo, maw1026@gmail.com, for assistance. Here are the basic steps:

- 3. Click MEMBER LOGIN
- 4. Enter your USER NAME and PASSWORD. (If you don't have an account, click REGISTER to sign up)
- 5. Select Service Dropdown, and My Activities

- 6. Click Create Service Activity. Choose Your Club and click next
- 7. Input Title and select Activity Type (Donation, Fundraiser, Meeting or Service Project) then click next
- 8. Brings up a Service Project Form just fill it out. Click Report Complete to finish then select Save

Region I, Zone A has decided to unite and take as many glasses as we can directly to the center in NJ. It may not be an ideal situation but we wanted to share our steps.

Delivery restriction:

The center is located on the grounds of the Katzenbach School for the Deaf. It is a guarded facility so you must reach out to Lion Al ahead of time to let him know you will be coming. He will probably give you a name and phone number to call before arrival. That person will notify the guards that you are coming.

Eyeglasses sorting and packing:

The eyeglasses can be in boxes or plastic bags. They do not want eyeglass cases, loose lenses, clip-on sunglasses and broken plastic frames (they do want metal frames regardless of condition. These are sold to a recycling center in CA and

they receive funds from them to support their services.)

Once held, eight (8) club members joined other community volunteers handing out food to clients in a modified fashion out of the hallway of a former school building in a much slower method than previous months.

Volunteers guided client's vehicles single file down a dead-end, narrow street, twoor-three at a time to the entrance to the school. There, rear seats and hatchbacks were packed with food. This method worked well and kept volunteers warm in

the cold, windy weather. However, the total time for the distribution process took two-to-three times longer than normal. The <u>545</u> families (<u>1,365</u> people) served were extremely patient and hopefully the weather will be more cooperative next month, allowing us to return to a more

normal distribution routine.

Pocketalker |

Personal amplifier. Ideal for use-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alest you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability.

Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alest Master. You wear it to alest to sounds while awake.
