





old twin sisters had lost their lives hours earlier in the storm. To say things were a little confusing is definitely an understatement. With temperatures in the mid to upper nineties, we joined other community volunteers distributing food to those able to make it to the distribution site. The truck from the Food Bank in Syracuse was an hour late due to road closures, downed trees and power lines. Once unloaded, we packed the usual variety of food into their vehicles, although some were unable to take frozen product due to power outages in their places of residence – some not being restored for days. We ended up serving 473 families (approximately 1,350 people).

The club joined with others in the community in support of the next of kin of those who lost their lives. After adjusting our budgeted year end contributions, we donated \$500 to each family - they have lost everything and with no

insurance, are facing final expenses for their loved ones.

We still were able to make a total of \$1,650 in budgeted end of year contributions. These included donations to Freedom Guide Dogs, Central Association for the Blind & Visually Impaired, Clinton Fire Department, Clark Mills Fire Department, Central New York Ronald McDonald House, The Lions Eye Bank at Albany, the Kirkland Art Center and the Kirkland Town Library.

Board Meeting

PDG Michele spoke to us about her vision for a specialty club at St. Catherine’s that would focus on mental health issues, not only among St Cath’s clientele, but also in the greater community. Lion Jerry made a motion that our club sponsor this new club; the motion was seconded and passed unanimously. She also spoke about the hockey tournament St. Cath. has been running for a few years in September at the Frear Park Hockey Rink in Troy. Because of renovations there, this year it will

be at Knickerbacker Ice Arena in Lansingburgh. We've supported this in the past with an info table, and decided to do so again this year. The hockey tournament supports their Lansingburgh Connects program, a shared initiative with the Lansingburgh School District and Rens County Mental Health.

Our bill for the spelling bee is \$5000 minus a credit of \$846 for the contributions of the 47 participating schools (\$18 each) = \$4154. Lion Ruth moved that we pay this off from funds currently in the charitable fund; the motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Lion Jerry made a motion that we participate in the 2026 Scripps National Spelling Bee, and that we raise the requisite \$5000 fee by applying to Brandel-Murphy Lions Youth Foundation for a \$1500 matching grant and to the New York State & Bermuda Lions Foundation for a \$2000 grant. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Lions Maryanne, Jerry and Mike reported on our upcoming 100th anniversary celebration, which will be on Oct 11 at the Gideon Putnam. We have secured the support of two Premiere Visionary Sponsors to offset the cost of the evening. The Adirondack Trust Company has written a check for \$6,000 and the Ophthalmic Plastic Surgery PLLC (Dr. Ted Wladis) has written a check for \$5,000. These generous donations will allow us to subsidize the ticket price at a cost of \$75/person. Both sponsorship groups will be recognized appropriately that evening! As part of the celebration, we'll be producing a commemorative souvenir program for all attendees. Our sponsors will be recognized on the inside front and inside back covers respectfully.

There will be no other ads in the program book. We will have a "Friends of the Lions" page in the program that will recognize other donations made toward the anniversary. The levels of support are Gold \$500+; Silver \$250 - \$499; and Bronze \$100 - \$249. We have already received three Gold level sponsorships from club members.

Pocketalker

Personal amplifier. Ideal for one-to-one communication and TV listening.

Whistle Stop

Phone adapter to prevent feedback from using the telephone with a hearing aid.

Infrared TV Listening System

Wireless infrared amplification system.

Digital Alarm Clock

Wake to an alarm, a flashing light, or a portable pillow shaker.

Personal FM System

Wireless portable amplification system. Transmits up to 300 feet. Helpful for an individual or large group situation.

Alert Master

Uses a pillow shaker and a lamp flashing simultaneously to alert you to a smoke detector sounding, door knocking, telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone

Adjustable volume control with amplified ringer.

Cap-Tel Telephone

Telephone that has both amplification and caption capability. Telephone ringing, and alarm clock activation.

Amplified Telephone Ringers

Provides adjustable ring volume, frequency, and pitch tone.

Personal Body Pager

Pager works with the Alert Master. You wear it to alert to sounds while awake.
