# A message from **District Governor Barbara Bentley**



It is hard to believe that we are in September already, but here we are!! So many clubs were active over the summer with activities and projects and that was great to see. Here are some other things that took place over the summer:

- At the International Convention in July, a resolution was passed to prohibit a District Governor, First Vice District Governor and Second Vice District Governor from all being members of the same Lions club.
- Also at the International Convention, a proposal to redistribute the number of International Directors among different geographic areas, which would reduce the number of directors from the United States, did not pass. It is unsure if it will be on the ballot again for a vote at the International Convention next year in Hong Kong.
- At the July Council Meeting, after lengthy discussions, the Council approved a candidate can be nominated for MD 20 endorsement at the 2026 MD 20 State Convention in Syracuse. All qualified Past District Governors are eligible to run, according to the directives laid out in the by-laws.
- Clubs should have received their dues invoices from Lions International, Multiple District 20 and also the District. I kindly request that you please pay those on time. If you have any questions about dues, or where they need to be sent, please do not hesitate to reach out to me directly.

We are putting plans in place to reach our goals for the year, the most important of which is to offer support to our clubs and Lions in the District. I am excited for the upcoming Cabinet Meeting in Latham, on Saturday, September 6th, as we will be sharing a lot of service ideas relating to vision, including a guest speaker from NABA (Northeastern Association of the Blind at Albany) who many of our clubs partner with. I strongly encourage you to attend. In addition, PCC Mark Whitney will be doing Portal Training in the afternoon and I know that will be extremely helpful for so many of us. I hope to see you there!!

There, he and others prepare and serve hot soup and sandwiches for 160 – 225 individuals on a daily basis.

August 6 th through the 9th, we "resurrected" a version of our very successful Garage Sale of past years. The original

version was halted by the COVID pandemic, followed by on-going repairs to our venue – the Clinton Arena. The new version, required less effort on the part of a small nucleus of members, netted less financially, but received favorable reviews from participants and


