

The Brandel - Murphy Youth Foundation

Our Mission: "To provide assistance to children in need, throughout the state of New York and the country of Bermuda, through partnerships with Lions and other organizations, by supporting programs that will improve the lives of those served."

The Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation achieves its mission of helping children in need by partnering with Lions clubs, zones, and districts throughout Multiple District-20 through our Grant Program. If your project qualifies by helping children in your community, **BMFY** will award up to \$2,000 in matching funds for a standard humanitarian grant and up to \$2,500 in a non-matching emergency grant. Larger projects with a more regional impact may qualify for a major grant of \$10,000 to \$20,000 in matching funds.

Since 2011, 212 grants have helped over 262,000 children with over \$395,000 in grants awarded.


During 2025, BMFY awarded 15 standard grants totaling \$50,000 along with 2 major grants that yielded an additional \$27,500 in humanitarian funds. These grants will help over 6,000 children in need throughout Multiple District 20. The following success story is a testimony to the impact of our grant program during the past year.

The Niagara Falls Junior Basketball Club is more than just a sports program - it is a lifeline for 50 local children which provides a structured, inclusive, skill building environment in a community where opportunities for their youth can be limited while significant risks to their health and welfare are always a concern.

Supported by both a strong community backing and the dedication of the Niagara Falls Community Lions, this grassroots initiative was further strengthened by being awarded a **BMFY** matching grant. This grant effectively doubled the resources available to support the community and expand this program's ability to make a meaningful difference in children's lives for years to come.



The most efficient way to pay your club dues to either LCI or MD20 is to pay online. You DO NOT need a credit or debit card to pay online.

For LCI, your treasurer should go to the Portal to Club Statements and then hit Pay Now. You will be given the opportunity to enter your bank routing number and Admin bank account number. This information will be available for all LCI payments for the year.

For MD20, you need to click on View & Pay Invoice at the bottom of the email. You can then input your bank routing number and Admin bank account number. The funds will be sent to the MD office and you can print the receipt that will be sent to your email immediately.

A Memoir, A Master Class in Lions Leadership

At the age of 101, Past International Director Jack Weber continues to be a valuable leader in our Multiple District. For over 70 years he has always dedicated his life to our Lions motto- "We Serve."

PID Jack's leadership credentials are impressive. He has served in every club officer position, as the District Governor of 20-K2 and the President of the MD20 PDG Association. In 1984, PID Jack was elected as an International Director from MD20 and twice again he has served as an LCI Board Appointee. Yet through it all, PID Jack has always been proud to be a "grass roots" Lion.

During the Covid-19 lock down, PID Jack decided to use his time productively. Collecting all the thoughts and memories about his life, the result of that effort is "**Jack Weber, Here!**" - a 500 page, hard cover memoir, including over 200 pictures of his life and Lions Journey.

PID Jack did not spend over two years writing this book for his own profit. He has instead pledged to dedicate all of the net proceeds from his book sales to benefit the Brandel - Murphy Youth Foundation.
