District Committee Reports

26 M-1 Constitution/By-laws

Fellow Lions,

This is what our current Constitution/By-Laws says about the responsibilities of a District Governor. It does not state anywhere, that the

DG have the responsibility of signing checks, along with our District Treas. and District Sect. We normally have a vote at out first Cabinet meeting to put the DG on the checking Acct to sign checks. If you look at the state By-Laws Article I, it states that the incoming Council Chair and Vice Council Chair are automatically authorized to electronically sign state checks as that is how the state office handles it's checks.

I would recommend we also amend our By/laws for our incoming DG so that he/she automatically is granted authority to sign our District checks. I suggest it be added under our By/Laws ARTICLE III Section 1 add (h) When the newly elected District Governor begins their term of office as District Governor for 26 M-1, the District Governor will be granted authority to sign 26 M-1 District checks as necessary.

PDG John Preston District Constitution By/Laws Chair Section 1. DISTRICT GOVERNOR. Under the general supervision of the International Board of Directors, he/she shall represent the association in his/her district. In addition, he/she shall be the chief administrative officer in his/her district and shall have direct supervision over the first and second vice district governor, region chairpersons, the zone chairpersons, the cabinet secretary-treasurer and such other cabinet members as may be provided for in this district constitution and by-laws. His/her specific responsibilities shall be to:

(a) Administer and promote membership growth and new club development.

(b) Administer and promote leadership development at the club and district levels.

(c) Promote the Lions Clubs International Foundation and all service activities of the association.

(d) Preside, when present, over cabinet, convention and other district meetings. During any period he/she is unable to so preside, the presiding officer at any such meeting shall be the first or second vice district governor, but if he/she is not available, the district officer chosen by the attending members shall preside.

(e) Promote harmony among the chartered Lions clubs.

(f) Exercise such supervision and authority over cabinet officers and district committee appointees as is provided in this district constitution.

(g) Ensure that each Lions club in the district be visited by district governor or other district officer once every year to facilitate successful administration of the club, and that the visiting officer submit a visitation report to the International Headquarters for each visit.

* A District may change the qualifications to be more or less than what is stated here ARTICLE III

Duties of District Officers/Cabinet

(h) Submit a current itemized statement of total district receipts and expenditures to his/her district convention or annual meeting of his/her district at a multiple district convention.
(i) Deliver, in a timely manner, at the conclusion of his/her term in office, the general and (ar

(i) Deliver, in a timely manner, at the conclusion of his/her term in office, the general and/or financial accounts, funds and records of the district to his/her successor in office.

G) Report to Lions Clubs International all known violations of the use of the association's name and emblem.

(k) Perform such other functions and acts as shall be required of him/her by the International Board of Directors through the District Governor's Manual and other directives.

How Did We Impact Your Community?

From July 1, 2018 to April 30, 2019, KidSight staff and volunteers have provided screenings for **60,946 children** at **1,020 partner sites** around the state. We have served sites in **108 of the 114 counties** since the start of the 18-19 fiscal year! At these screenings, we identified **4,185 children who needed a full eye exam** – including 1,393 children who were at high risk for vision loss.

60,946

children were screened by KidSight. Each child screened receives a result card with their screening results and tips for healthy vision. This card is given to the school the day of the screening.

4,185

children were referred by KidSight. Each child referred by KidSight receives a packet of information about local "kid-friendly" eye care, a copy of the vision screening results and vision resources.



KidSight Verbal Report- Cabinet Meeting- August 3, 2019

I will not go over our written report in detail, since you can read it on your own. I would just like to point out that these are not our FULL year statistics- these are just July 1 to April 30th. We will give our final report at the October meeting.

I would like to point out and thank the clubs who are fielding screening teams or individuals. This includes District 26M1's own Fort Leonard Wood Lions Club along with the Lions Clubs in Bowling Green, Hermann, Marshall, Columbia Host, Grand City, Jefferson City Host and Prairie Home. We have two Lions organizations in some stage of training: Perryville Lions Club and District 26M2. Of course we would love to have more clubs join Fort Leonard Wood Lions and Perryville Lions Clubs in District 26M1 screening children.

KidSight hired a new screener for the M1 District in the spring: Nancy Morse. You can reach her at <u>semo@kid-sight.org</u>. Our previous screener, Pam Haggett, resigned to take care of aging family members.

Our Executive Director, Lion Katherine Patterson-Paronto, attended this year's Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute in Maryville, MO. She reports that she had a great time. She met many interesting and accomplished Lions from the region, learned a lot, and had fun doing it. District M1's own PDG Lion Don Beckham was one of the instructors and Lion Katherine thinks that he did an excellent job.

KidSight continues to develop our programs and infrastructure. We have been working steadily since January to make our program more responsive to the needs of our families with the least resources. This consequently, also makes us more attractive to foundations and other funders. Here is some of our progress:

- We applied for and received two AmeriCorps VISTA positions. These positions are funded by the government through the Corporation for National Service. I m happy to announce that we have filled one of the positions- our new VISTA will start September 2nd. Watch our social media for an announcement.
- We are in discussions with the Kansas City Free Eye Clinic to offer free mobile vision care services to select screening sites. We expect to be piloting one or more sites this fall. This is an exciting opportunity.

As I have discussed in previous meetings, independence has come with more opportunities- but also fewer funds in the immediate past. Since July 1 we have operating with 3 fewer staff members. We are now better positioned to go after funding, but it takes time to develop those resources. The financial support of the Missouri Lions is more important than ever.

I am excited about our future- we are in the best position since 20156 to make this organization sustainable and, more importantly, to have a greater impact than ever before. We wouldn't be here if it hadn't been for the support of Lions like you. Once again- thank you!

A need was brought to our attention moving through June into July and so many of you responded. I would like to thank all of you, more specifically, Lions PDG Murray Dunn, PDG John Preston, 2nd VDG Jerry Reaves, Michael Pruitt, James Hickson and the Cape Girardeau Noon, Ste. Genevieve, Malden, St. James, Cape Girardeau Evening, Park Hills, Houston, Farmington, and Williamsville Lions Clubs for your generosity!

We received \$1,075.00! Our Friend in Service, Lion Kory Thoma was able to produce two pair of special eyeglasses for a 'hair' under \$300!

When I delivered the news to the 1st Cabinet Meeting this past weekend in Caruthersville, PDG Lion Murray mentioned the story of when Helen Keller issued the challenge to become the Knights of the Blind and Deaf, the Lions responded back with 300% of the dollar amount she had requested. Things never change!

Technically (using the amount of \$300 for simplicity) we used right at 28% of the funds raised for this project. I would like to share an idea with you I've been pondering and will deliver in more detail at the November 2 Cabinet Meeting being held in Altenburg.

DISTRICT 26M1 SIGHT/HEARING FUND

District 26M1 is basically the 8th Congressional District. Most of you know that our congressional district is one of the poorest in the nation and has been for a long time. There are many communities, that do not have a Lions Club or if there is one, it may be a small club that has limited resources.

It would make sense to establish a Sight/Hearing Fund that can either

- Take care of a need for someone in community without a Lions Club
- Do matching funds for a club that needs help due to the cost involved

It would be the newly formed Committee's Chair to gain the needed information regarding financials, negotiated cost and present to the following for approval:

- District Governor and Vice District Governors
- District Zone Chairs

This would be a mix of both 'elected' (Governors) and 'appointed' (Zone Chairs) where the appointed ones represent different geographical points in the District, guarding against the appearance of the fund being spent 'on the other side of the District'. Everyone is on the same page.

When I was pondering this, I thought we would probably raise about twice the amount we needed. Instead, we're over 300%!

If it wouldn't be a problem, in the time period before the November 2 Cabinet Meeting, please talk to your Club members and let me know what you'd like to do, let the money sit in the new fund (based on approval) or be refunded unused funds. That amount would come to (approximately, using rounded numbers for this message):

- \$250 donation- refund of \$180
- \$100 donation- refund of \$72
- \$50 donation- refund of \$36
- \$25 donation- refund of \$18

We will honor your choice and I know some of you probably wish the money stay in and help create the proposed fund. It would just be good to have a response per your choice in a recorded fashion for future records. A reply to this email will do fine.
