

# Help the Hungry Bake Sale is a record-breaker

More than \$137,000 raised by one-day fundraiser

When Chairman Chris Landrum and her Help the Hungry Bake Sale Committee describe the annual event as a "God thing" – they aren't kidding.

Celebrating its 16th year of raising funds for Farmington's two food pantries - St. Vincent de Paul and Ministerial Alliance — Saturday's event held in the St. Joseph Catholic Church gymnasium took things to a record-breaking, heavenly level. While the final numbers are still and see what happens. This year, being tallied, early estimates on Friday night, I have to admit indicate more than \$137,000 it looked a little grim. the first time the bake sale raised us questioned whether or not we a little over \$100,000 - a major milestone for the fundraiser that took Landrum and the committee members by surprise considering they were unsure how the event would fare with the pandemic still in full swing.

Providing another example of the bake sale being a "God thing," Landrum admitted things weren't looking all that great the night before this year's event.

"All of these years we always do what we can do, and then after that, God just has to take care of things," she said. "We try to get the word out as much as we can and then we have to wait we didn't have as many holiday

ering it was just last year that for short a few baskets. Several of were going to be able to meet last year's total, much less exceed it.

"We've never set a goal on how much we want to raise. We have always said, 'God will provide what he feels is necessary for the food pantries to have. Co-incidentally, I guess, we have always exceeded our total from the year before. We have never had a time when we made less money, although we always tell ourselves that if we do make less money, then that must be what the food pantries need. But I think, deep down, we don't ever want to make less money." Landrum confessed she and












# JUSTIN K. FABER INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Justin K. Faber, from Deckerville, Michigan, USA was elected to serve as international director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 102nd International Convention, held in Milan, Italy, July 5 through July 9, 2019.

He became a Lion in 2001 after joining the Ubly Lions Club. Director Faber was instrumental in changing his club from an all-male club to a diverse club that is the pillar of the district today.

He has held a number of offices within the association including MD GST Chairperson, MD Governmental Liaison Committee Chairperson and Council Chairperson. As the council Chairperson he navigated the political scene in the state of Michigan to revise an age-old law that abruptly disallowed Lions from collecting monies in the streets. This small act allows Lions to raise over one million dollars annually in the state. Director Faber was a presenter at the USA/Canada Leadership Forum as well as the Michigan Forum.

In recognition of his service, Director Faber has received several Presidential Certificates of Appreciation, an International President's Leadership Award and an International President's Award. He also was one of four district governors in CA1 to receive Dr. Yamada's Dignity Award in both halves of the year. Director Faber is also a Melvin Jones Fellow.

Director Faber started his first small business at the age of 19, Fabe's Family Concessions. He also owns and operates two other small businesses, Ameriheat and Thumb Rentals. Director Faber enjoys every aspect of being a small business owner and the challenges that go with it.

Director Faber joined the Michigan Army National Guard and served as a Military Policeman for eight years. After the attacks on the United States on 9/11 he was deployed to the Pentagon. He has been honored with several awards and commendations that include the 210<sup>th</sup> MP Battalion Soldier of the Year.

Director Faber graduated summa cum laude from Central Michigan University (CMU), Mount Pleasant, Michigan. He was awarded a double major in Political Science and Nonprofit and Public Administration. He also has a minor in Leadership. Director Faber also has earned certificates in: Civic Engagement, Public and Social Entrepreneurship, and International Non-Governmental (NGO) Administration. He is currently pursuing a Masters in Public Administration and will graduate December, 2019.

In addition to his Lions activities, Director Faber is also a member of the Thumb Veterans Organization, the Knights of Columbus, the Michigan Association of Fairs and Exhibitions. He is a member of the Sanilac County Veterans Board and has served as a Sanilac County Brownfield Redevelopment Authority as Chairperson. Director Faber previously served on the Sanilac County Board of Commissioners, two terms as Chairperson of the board. Also, he is a board member of the Sanilac County Historical Museum.







- 1. 1. Semi-annual Lions Club International dues billed by July 10, 2021, and must be paid by August 30, 2021.
- 2. 2. Semi-annual District & State Lions Club dues billed by August 15, 2021, and must be paid by September 15, 2021.
- 3. 3. Semi-annual Lions Club International dues billed by January 10, 2022, and must be paid by February 18, 2022.
- 4. Semi-annual District & State Lions Club dues billed February 1, 2022, and must be paid by March 1, 2022.
- 5. Lions Club officer Nominating Committee selected by March 15, 2022.\*
- 6. Local club officer elections Must be held by April 30, 2022.
- 7. Newly elected club officers for 2022-2023 **Must** be entered into My Lion/My LCI before the deadline from Lions Club International, May 15, 2022.

Information must be re-entered in My Lion/MyLCI even if there are no changes.

My Lion/MyLCI will lock all club officers out of the system if you do not complete your officer information for the next year by June 30, 2022. Getting re-authorized is time consuming. So please do it before the deadline.

In the past many of the Lions Clubs in our District 26-M1 found they were locked out of My Lion/My LCI because they did not enter their officers for the next Lion year before the deadline.
